On June 12th from the James S. Brady Briefing Room, President Obama addressed the Orlando night club shooting as one of the worst tragedies in American history and a reminder of how easy it is for anyone to get their hands on a weapon to shoot people in a school, church, or a movie theater and now a night club. Is this the kind of country we want? I remember not long ago when everyone was saying, "Obama... he's going to take away our guns!" Eight years later, Americans are packing more guns than any country in the world.

You have to wonder if Obama ever thought that mass shooting briefings were going to be a major part of his job, as this makes his 16th mass shooting address briefing. The saddest part is that every time this happens, it feels like America has already decided that this is exactly what kind of country we want.

Every time it plays out the same way. We're shocked, we mourn, we pick out and profile homophobics, radical Islam, Muslims, and racists, and then we move on as if everything is normal. But it's not normal at all doing the same thing over and over again and not doing anything to change it. This is what psychiatrists call insanity.

I remember when I was a kid and I never learned to tie my shoelaces, and when I ran around without tying my shoelaces, I would fall down, crying out, "Mommy, Mommy! I fell down and hurt myself!" She would pick me up and say that I tripped because I would not tie my shoelaces, and over and over again I would fall down, and over and over again my mom would say, "You need to learn to tie your shoelaces."

But what I wanted to say is, "Why are you bringing up my shoelaces into this conversation, blaming my shoelaces for something that the sidewalk did to my knees? You keep saying that there is a connection with untied shoelaces and me falling! And I don't know why you're violating my right to keep my shoelaces untied!"

Coping and Preparedness Tips

This is a difficult time for everyone affected, and it's important for people to connect with and support each other. The Red Cross offers the following tips to help people stay strong:

- uncertainty and anxiety since no one knows what could potentially happen next. Remember that it's okay to feel nervous.
- Stay informed but limit media exposure of the events, especially for children. Children are especially vulnerable to stress reactions related to media.
- Parents should let children talk about their fears and then reassure them about their safety. Talk with them in ways that they can easily understand. Let them guide the conversation; share details only when they ask about them.
- mon to have any number of temporary stress reactions such as anger, frustration and anxiety.
- Spend more time with family and friends and offer your support. Hug one another



The City of Tampa notified Supervisor for candidacy may circulate petitions. See of Elections Craig Latimer of the accepted resignation of Council Member Lisa Montelione, which will create a vacancy in Tampa City Council District 7.

The Supervisor of Elections has developed a timeframe to fill this vacancy that will allow the Special Municipal Election to be conducted concurrently with the regularly scheduled General Election on November 8. This means the race will be included on the General Election ballot for voters residing in City of Tampa District 7.
