The beloved apostle was not born on the Emerald Isle, but that's about all we know for sure. St. Patrick was born around the end of the 4th century in England, a part of the Britain -Roman Empire.





March 2021 marked the 20th Anniversary of the Dunndeal Gazette Publications! This paper has gifted the Tampa Bay area with Christian education and placed God's Word in print media for 20 years! It all started with the two very different people, Kay and Mark Dunn.

Kay and Mark lived separate lives and went through their own personal struggles before God put them together. On March 27, 1999,

they officially got married. However, that is not where the paper started. Kay attempted to continue her life as a businesswoman while Mark was out and about trying to find another job after working in the manufacturing and transportation industry for years.

The paper was officially started by Mark in 2001 around the time of 9/11. Everyone was full of fear and sorrow during that time. People needed to hear something uplifting, enlightening, and positive in the news, and it was extremely difficult for people to even keep their faith. This is what inspired the Gazette.

As a born-again Christian, Kay wanted to help Mark build the paper from the ground up. Being the businesswoman that she is, she used her skills to help gain some loyal followers and clients while Mark used his creative side to pitch story ideas and come up with the graphics and direct his team of young men and women who represented Dunndeal Publications during its rapid growth.

At its start, the Gazette was only distributed in one zone, Westchase. Today, it is distributed to six different zones and multiple business locations for pickup. Many people wanted to show their support for Christian education, positivity, and God's Word. The paper was a way to spread joy to those who were going through hardships. Of course, gaining this achievement was far from easy.

The paper went through many setbacks starting from the 2008 recession, which put many people out of jobs. Much like what we are currently going through, it was hard for people to pay for advertising which made things difficult for the Dunn duo. However, the paper was created for one purpose and that was to help spread the word of God and Jesus, because everyone needs to feel like they have a reason to be enlightened by something.

In 2014, Kay was diagnosed with Melanoma Cancer, another obstacle that Kay personally had to fight through. Battling cancer only made her faith stronger than ever. Mark became her caregiver with Jesus as the Great Physician. Ten months later, the bad cancer cells were dead.

This is the 20th year that the Dunndeal Gazettes have blessed the heart of Tampa with heart-felt stories that educate others on the Christian faith. It is one of the longest-running local print media papers in the city with 20 years in print and 15 years online. Even with all the adversity placed against them, Kay and Mark never stopped believing in Jesus, and all the obstacles just made them work harder than before to spread the word.

How is Your Vision?

I just returned from the eye clinic, and after having my eyes evaluated, I discovered that my eyeglasses were not working as well as they should and some corrections were needed. We all know how important it is to keep our eyes healthy. We get yearly check-ups and have our eyes tested to determine whether or not we need to make some adjustments because our vison is important. But what about our spiritual vision?

The Bible has a lot to say about our eyes and vision. Jesus said, "The eye is a light for the body. If your eyes are good, your whole body will be full of light. But if your eyes are evil, your whole body will be full of darkness. And if the only light you have is really darkness, then you have the worst darkness." (Mt. 6:22-23 NCV)

The sight or vision that Jesus speaks of in this verse is not really about our physical eyes or eyesight. Comparing a diseased or blind eye to a healthy eye equates to seeing things from a perspective of good or evil. Spiritual sight has to do with how you see things and people and God. The Bible equates light to revelation ("...whatsoever makes manifest is light" Eph. 5:13) and darkness to that which is wicked, empty, fruitless, and filled with death, destruction and misery as the earth is described in Genesis 1:2. Who determines what is light and what is darkness? God does.

The sin of the first man, Adam, was, of course, his disobedience to God, which was eating of the forbidden fruit, but what was that fruit? It was the knowledge of good and evil. In other words, Adam was deciding for himself what was good and what was evil instead of believing what God said was good or evil. One of the great sins of Israel was calling "…evil good, and good evil… darkness for light, and light for darkness…" (Isaiah 5:20).

Instead of agreeing with God and living according to his design, man wants to make up his own rules and live independently of God. This prideful assault against God puts man in a position of being superior: "I know better than God."

Spiritual darkness is not just the absence of light (the revelation of God), but it is having a false revelation (believing that darkness is really light). "...Satan himself is transformed into an angel of light. Therefore, it is no great thing if his ministers also be transformed as the ministers of righteousness; whose end shall be according to their works." (2 Corinthians 11:14-15)

When we receive the revelation that Jesus is our Savior and we humble ourselves before him and ask him to forgive us and be the Lord over our lives, something remarkable happens. The apostle Paul says it like this, "...giving thanks to the Father who has qualified us to be partakers of the inheritance of the saints in the light. He has delivered us from the power of darkness and conveyed us into the kingdom of the Son of His love." (Colossians 1:12-13 NKJV)

When we come to Jesus, we suddenly see things differently. We are not blinded by darkness, but we have the opportunity to "walk in the light as he is in the light." (1 John 1:7) The word of God gives us light (revelation) of the will and way of God. "Your word is a lamp to my feet and a light to my path." (Psalms 119:105) and "The entrance of your words gives light; it gives understanding to the simple." (Ps. 119:130)

If I allow the word of God to be the final authority in my life instead of my own opinions,

then I will be walking in the light of God's will. The wonderful thing about God's will is that it is always good. God loves us and has uniquely designed a destiny for each one of us to fulfill. "... God is light, and in him is no darkness at all." (1 John 1:5)

If I will trust God above my own reasonings, conclusions, opinions, and preferences because I know he loves me and has gifted me and positioned me to accomplish his will, then I will not have my eyesight compromised. I may experience setbacks and troubles, but I won't blame God for darkness he has nothing to do with. I know he weeps with me when I am hurt or disappointed, but if I put my trust in him, he will empower me to overcome every obstacle as I keep my eyes upon him.

So, my question for all of us is this: "How is your vision?" Are you seeing things clearly or has your sight become a little blurry? Let us make whatever corrections are necessary so that we are seeing things God's way.

Pasco Tax Collector Essay Contest



Pasco County Tax Collector Mike Fasano announces that his office is accepting entries in a month-long essay contest. The competition begins February 8, 2021 and ends March 12, 2021 at 5:00pm. The essay contest is for Pasco County's high school students (Grades 9-12). Students of Pasco's public/charter, private, parochial, nonpublic, and home schools are all welcome to participate.

In 500 words or less students will answer the question: "When unexpected events occur such as COVID-19 or a devastating storm,

people are often negatively impacted. Some may lose their jobs, their homes, or experience other setbacks in their lives. Keeping in mind that funds expended by government (local, state or federal) must come from somewhere, what do you think government should do to assist people to get through these challenges?"

Entries will be judged by a panel of directors from the Pasco County Tax Collector's Office. Entries will be reviewed on how well the student communicates his/ her response to the question as well as overall essay structure, appearance and readability.

Introducing K9 Maddie!

The Pasco Sheriff's Office currently has 31 K9 teams trained in a variety of specialties, which are paramount in keeping Pasco safe. When selecting new K9s, trainers look for at a variety of traits, such as intelligence, obedience, and a personality that compliments the handler. As the unit continues to grow, PSO has introduced new K9 specialties to expand our capabilities and assist the citizens of our community in different ways.

The latest iteration of this is live find detection, and PSO added its first K9 of this specialty in May 2020. As a live find detection dog, K9 Maddie is able to locate people that are still alive and buried in debris or rubble. This two year old Labrador Retriever's courage, keen sense of smell, and hearing made her an excellent candidate for the team. Her capabilities are instrumental when assisting in the aftermath of natural and man-made disasters. Similar to other canines, K9 Maddie is trained to track through woods, swamps, neighborhoods and buildings, during varied weather conditions. K9 Maddie also gets the unique opportunity to train on PSO's two in-house rubble pile training facilities, making quality training that much easier.

Her handler, Dep. Robert Lewis started at the Pasco Sheriff's Office in 2015 and joined the Ca-nine Unit in 2020. Dep. Lewis has been around dogs all his life and knew he and K9 Maddie would make a great team! They have developed a strong bond through training together.

"At work, she is easy-going and just wants to get out and run," stated Dep. Lewis. "Whether it's training on the rubble pile, agility equipment or running around on a break, working with her is the best thing I could ask for."

K9 Maddie passed her Fundamental Skills Assessment (FSA) test in under three months. This test is a state certification for FEMA and assess a K9's ability to maneuver through difficult ob-stacles, follow the handler's directions and locate live humans. Dep. Lewis and K9 Maddie are currently waiting to be accepted to a Federal Task Force to complete K9 Maddie's Certification Evaluation (CE). This will allow Dep. Lewis and K9 Maddie to be deployed out of state and possibly even out of the country.

Along with live find detection, PSO's canines are specialized in tracking, evidence recovery, building/area searches, criminal apprehension, narcotics detection, explosives detection and hu-man remains detection. The Pasco Sheriff's Office also added two therapy dogs last year, who assist our Behavioral Health Intervention Team (BHIT).

Like all of PSO's K9s, the funds for K9 Maddie were donated by citizens of Pasco County.

Ed and Angie Moore wished to honor of their daughter Madison "Maddie" Moore, who passed away in 2017. Madison wished to pursue a career in forensics and the Moores are thrilled that K9 Maddie will continue Madison's memory for years to come. Dep. Lewis and K9 Maddie will work hard to honor Madison's memory and keep Pasco safe.







The Power of Books

What is your first memory of books? During the summer as a child, the bookmobile stopped each week a couple blocks away from my house. I remember the smell of the book's interior, as if it was palpable and I could slice a piece of it. Books gave me a chance to live others lives, to go on wild and wonderful adventures in my mind and explore the uncharted universe.

The fact that book reading levels have increased is because reading is essential. Books are complex, informative, and entertaining. They improve our imagination, give us stronger analytical thinking skills, and enhance our ability to hold conversations with other humans. It has been scientifically proven to boost intelligence, lower stress, and create better personal relationships by strengthening bonds between parents and children.

In the last few years I have spent a great amount of time looking at, rescuing, and figuring out what to do with almost 200,000 books. Meanwhile, I found myself wondering about the modern state of books as a commodity and resource.

I was asked a few years ago, as a writer and a book lover, to go to a college library in Clearwater, Florida to check out the book collection and figure out what to do with all the books. The library was about to be torn down, along with all the other buildings on the campus, to make way for a new medical school. An estimated 80,000 books were still on the shelves.

I arranged for most of the books to be donated to programs that send books to Africa

and donated the others to the Friends of the Library and other charitable groups. I gathered about 50 boxes of children's books and distributed them to various elementary schools.

I found out the Old Tampa Book Company on Tampa Street was going out of business and I made arrangements to rescue the 55,000books still inside the crumbling structure.

I decided to make a charitable donation to Metropolitan Ministries, moved all of the books out, and I now hire pre-med students to help run the Amazon bookstore and give them the profits to support their goals of medical school.

A 2016 survey from Pew Research describes the reading landscape as primarily physical, not electronic as e-book supporters and techies may believe. They also found that college graduates are four times as likely to read e-books and that e-book consumption is slowly increasing on tablets and smartphones while remaining stable on dedicated e-readers. But most importantly, this study found that since 2012 the number of Americans who have read a book in the last year hasn't drastically changed.

I hope that this essay encouraged you to pick up and read a good book. You can always listen to a good book on audio while driving, exercising, or relaxing.

Dr. Robert A. Norman is a board-certified dermatologist who has been in practice for over 30 years. As he mastered Milchu, he became a high priest of Druidism, a Pagan sect that ruled religious influence over Ireland. In viewing his enslavement as God's test of his faith during his six years of captivity, he became deeply devoted to Christianity through constant prayer. In a vision, he saw the children of Pagan Ireland reaching out their hands to him he grew increasingly determined to free the Irish from Druidism by converting them to Christianity.



The idea of escaping enslavement came to St. Patrick in a dream. A voice he believed to be God told him it was time to leave Ireland and that he would find passage on a ship where he could sail back home to England. Eager to see the dream materialize, St. Patrick convinced some sailors to let him board their ship to France. Lost for 28 days and covering about 200 miles of territory in the process, Maewyn

at last was reunited with his



Now a free man, Maewyn never lost sight of his vision and could not forget the Ireland children reaching out to him. In another dream, an angel told him he must return to Ireland

and help the people as a missionary. Maewyn then went to Auxerre, France, where he studied and entered the priesthood under the guidance of the missionary St. Germain.

As time passed, Pope St. Celestine I consecrated Maewyn as St. Patrick, Bishop of the Irish, so Maewyn adopted the name St. Patrick as an ordained priest and headed back to Ireland through Pope St. Celestine. Spreading "The Good News," the Christian Gospel, to the pagans, where he was known as a prisoner, he wanted to convert a pagan Celtic culture from sun worship to Christianity. For those who worship the sun will get misfortune and will be punished for doing so. But for those who



worship Christ, the true Son will be awarded.

Upon his arrival, Patrick was initially met with hostile resistance. The king and his warriors raced their chariots up to confront Patrick, and so begin a piece of magic worthy of Maewyn/St.Patrick. The Druid challenged St. Patrick, who called on God, flinging the Druid into the air to come smashing down on to the rocks. Then afterward, the King and warriors fled.

Patrick then appeared through a bolted door into the great hall of Tara. The Druid offers him a poison drink, but the drink was frozen, and he poured the drink out. Patrick was then challenged to a dual of miracles. The Druid made it snow, and Patrick made it go away, saying that the Druid can only do evil but not good.

The Druid put his coat around his young follower and Patrick put his coat around him and went inside a twig hut and set it afire. The boy survived, but the Druid's coat burned up. The king declared it's better to believe and instantly converted.

Afterwards, St. Patrick quickly managed to spread Christian teachings far and wide, preaching, writing, performing countless baptisms, and convincing Pagan Druids that they were worshiping idols under a belief system that kept them enslaved.

By accepting Christianity, he told them, they would be elevated to "the people of the Lord and the sons of God." In his auobiography, "The Confession", he wrote about converting the Irish to Christianity. While building schools and monasteries along the north and west coast, he was determined to convert Ireland to Christianity.

One famous myth is how St. Patrick drove all the snakes from Ireland. The story symbolizes a metaphor of Patrick cleansing the Island of Paganism. Though there's just one problem. Ireland never had any snakes to begin with. The Emerald Isle is surrounded by water that was too frigid for snakes to migrate there, either from Britain or anywhere else.

According to another famous story, Patrick used the three leaves of the huge shamrock to explain the Holy Trinity of the Father, Son, and Spirit, so the Irish started wearing shamrocks on their clothing to signify their Irish Christian pride. That tradition later grew. Wearing green clothing is a popular St. Patrick's Day custom today.



Although shamrocks don't really exist, we know them as several three leaf plants such as wood sorrel, white clover, and yellow clover. This tradition of wearing green has become a popular Irish custom. This legend is possible, but Patrick never wrote about it.

For the next 40 years, he would travel far and wide to spread the Christian faith among the Celtic Pagan population, working miracles until his retirement to his first church.

The story of his death is an ultimate tale. Patrick requested to be taken to his beloved Armagh. Along the route, an angel appeared as in a burning bush, and a second angel requested that he return to Saul to receive his last request. As Patrick lay dying at the age of 121, the angel that visited him as a slave told him to have two untamed oxen carry his body on a cart, and where they stopped, he would be buried. Two towns claim his place of burial, but no one knows for sure but the two oxen.

You probably didn't know that St. Patrick's blue is still found in symbols of the state and is the color of the ribbon worn on the robes of the Knights of St. Patrick. However, the formal use of blue was first seen when Ireland was turned into a kingdom in 1542 under the reign of King Henry VIII.

Before that, Ireland was widely seen as being under the control of the Pope, who was happy to hand power to a Catholic monarch who agreed to uphold Catholic rule.

This came to an end when Henry, who was the Lord of Ireland at the time, split from Catholicism and set up his own Church of England, bringing Ireland with him and declaring it a separate kingdom.



The formal creation of a new kingdom meant Ireland was granted its own coat of arms, a golden harp placed on a blue background.

England already used a dark blue, so a lighter blue was used for the Order of St Patrick. Thanks to a mixture of truth and myth passed down through the centuries, he became the superhero in the Christian church of Irish pride.

After St. Patrick died on March 17th, he was largely forgotten until mythology and legends grew. A century later, he was honored the patron saint of Ireland and the mythology surrounding his life has become ingrained in the Irish culture.

People in Ireland, since around the ninth or tenth century, have been observing the Roman Catholic feast day of St. Patrick.

So why does the holiday fall on March 17th? Supposedly, it's the day St. Patrick died. Since then, Irish Christians have marked the day as holy. Irish Catholics would close shops to honor the feast of St. Patrick, a time for celebrations.



Since St. Patrick's Day falls within Lent, which comes before Easter, the Catholics give up their vices as penitence. The feast of St. Patrick was the one-day reprieve when Irish men could down a pint or two of ale. Generally it would involve public parades and festivals wearing green attire and shamrocks as well as attending church services. The Lenten

restrictions on eating and drinking alcohol are lifted for the day, which has encouraged anvd propagated the holiday's tradition of alcohol consumption.

But you probably didn't know that the first St. Patrick Day parade actually started in America. The parade tradition really took off after the Potato Famine hit Ireland in the 1840's, sending hundreds and thousands of Irish immigrants pouring into New York, Boston, and other American cities.

The first recorded St. Patrick Day Parade was in New York, 1762, when a group of Irish soldiers marched a few blocks to a tavern in lower Manhattan. Today, it's the largest and longest, with 200,000 participants and 3,000,000 spectators each year. So this March 17th, you may find yourself wearing green and toasting to some St. Patrick history we bet vou didn't know!

Under God's Control By David Wilkerson

In these last days, the Lord's eye is not fixed on world powers but on the church of Jesus Christ. God is not focused on the economy, on the rise of world religions, on the roaring of the heathen. According to Isaiah, the nations are to God "as a drop of a bucket" (Isaiah 40:15). They are all under His sovereign rule and reign.

God knows all about terrorist threats, wars and rumors of wars. His Word warns that the heathen will rage, secular powers will try to outlaw Christianity, and fast-growing, anti-Christ movements will boast they'll rule the world and destroy Jesus' followers. The Bible says this about it all:

"The kings of the earth set themselves, and the rulers take counsel together, against the Lord, and against his anointed, saying, Let us break their bands asunder, and cast away their cords from us" (Psalm 2:2–3). In short, "Let's cast away all moral hindrances, all moral landmarks of the past."

Here is God's reaction to these earthly powers and demon-influenced men: "He that sitteth

in the heavens shall laugh: the Lord shall have them in derision" (2:4). No matter how desperate things look, everything remains under God's full control.

I'm thankful for this word from the Psalms. More and more, we hear reports of secularism wiping out the evangelical church in Europe; of Islam being the fastest growing religion in the world; of homosexuals hijacking entire denominations; of Christ's church growing so weak it no longer has any impact on society. Yet God's Word declares, "On Christ the Rock God will build His church." "The gates of hell shall not prevail against it" (Matthew 16:18). Nothing from the bowels of hell can hope to destroy Christ's church. His eye is always on His people, and through everything He warns Satan and his hordes, "Do not touch the apple of My eye."

"Behold, they shall surely gather together, but not by me: whosoever shall gather together against thee shall fall for thy sake" (Isaiah 54:15). Do you see what God is saying here? "The devil is going to come at you. Enemies out of hell will gather together against you. But Satan will not succeed."
