



Cristiane Araujo Costa was born and raised in a Christian family in Brazil. She accepted Jesus as a young child and began missions work as an adolescent, serving in the children's ministry and evangelism. She learned to play the guitar and began performing during church worship services. At just 14 years of age, she was chosen to be a worship leader.

"The more I got involved in these ministries, the more I loved them, and the more I loved Jesus," said Cris.

Her heart to serve continued to grow. When she was 17, God spoke to her and told her He wanted her to be a missionary.

She is currently attending a training program at the School of Ministry Development at Youth with a Mission (YWAM) Orlando. The organization has bases in more than 100 countries around the world. The in-depth leadership training equips young people with the tools they need to share the gospel across



the world. When she and her classmates complete their training, they will be sent to Tunisia or Haiti to minister in orphanages and villages, or to somewhere local in partnership with churches in the area.

Judy Dedmon, a long-time Land O' Lakes resident, met Cris in 2013 when Idlewild Baptist Church sent a team to provide medical care, dental care, and humanitarian assistance, as well as to preach the Gospel to some of the 50,000, mostly unreached, villages along the Amazon River.

Cris served as the translator and led the worship team. Each time the members of Idlewild returned for missions' trips, they requested Cris to serve alongside them.

"It's been a blessing to share many trips with her, and we consider each other friends and sisters in

Christ. God had a reason for taking two women from different worlds and bringing us together," said Judy.

The life of a missionary is so rewarding, but it can also be financially challenging. There have been difficult times, including a long recovery from COVID, not knowing how she would pay



for her healthcare, monthly gas to continue to visit families, water, or the time when the air conditioning went out at a Presbyterian church in the heat of an Amazon summer, and praying for the \$240 to fix it. Learning to Play Builds Educational Foundation

Early childhood education is a vital part of a child's learning foundation. Preschool is the perfect environment for developing social, emotional, cognitive, and motor skills. The early years of learning are the most critical because they develop the whole child and allow them to create experiences that form a strong structure on which all other learning is built. Preschool may just look like play time, but it is one of the greatest gifts you can give your child.

Technology is a great learning tool when used correctly, but too often TV, tablets, and phones are being used as a babysitter or distraction. The virtual world is keeping children from interacting with the environment that they are living in. Some childcare centers have students sitting at desks or on computers for long periods of their day. Some parents might be looking for preschools that are focused on pushing children toward academic excellence instead of play-based experiences. Teachers see the changes in our society because children cannot sit still to listen to a short story or to complete simple tasks. Parents and childcare professionals should be looking for ways to engage children in learning with hands on experiences where they can grow in all areas.

Preschool should provide opportunities for children to grow while having fun in a safe, loving, and engaging environment. Children that are not given the foundation of problem solving, movement, and play experiences often struggle later in their academic careers. They might struggle with anxiety, be less attentive, be unable to socialize with peers or have sensory delays. When children play in the housekeeping center at preschool, they are grasping ways to communicate verbally and non-verbally. They are learning to interact with others, role play and use their imagination. Building with blocks isn't just play, the children are visualizing and planning their creations, manipulating different weights and sizes, and building mathematical and science skills. They also develop a sense of pride when they see their vision become a reality that they can share with teachers and peers. Preschool provides language development with show and tell and story dramatizations. Children learn to articulate words and emotions, become

more confident speaking to others, and to take turns and listen politely. There is so much more to preschool than just mastering the ABC's and 123's.

Sometimes attending preschool at an early age is difficult for families financially. There are many great ways that parents or caregivers can enrich play experiences at home. Reading to children is one of the best ways to develop pre-reading strategies. Visit the library and choose a children's book to share. Talk about the pictures and create discussions throughout the story to build comprehension and retention skills. Cooking with your child will open a connection to trying new foods, improve skills for following directions and developing motor skills with measuring, stirring, and pouring. Making a mess is an integral part of being a child. Playdough and painting strengthen hands for writing. Arts and crafts improve cutting skills, fine motor control, and engage senses through different textures. Games can teach a variety of academic skills, as well as how to be patient and wait their turn. Wins are great to celebrate, but children also need to know it is okay to lose. We learn to play through interaction; children need to see appropriate behavior when they win and when they lose. Parents can also model good social interaction through play. When building with blocks, accidently knock down the tower, apologize, and work together to rebuild. Play should include conversations about right and wrong, ways to communicate with others, and how to share.

There are many ways to learn the skills needed to be successful in school and in life. Research shows that play gives children the experiences they need to develop in all areas of learning and provides a strong foundation that they can continue to build upon. The experiences children learn through play and hands-on activities are ones that they will be able to recall and utilize during educational activities for years to come. It is important to remember that all children develop at different rates, at different times, and in different ways. We, as parents, have the responsibility of providing an environment that will lead to success.

Can You Use A Better Night's Sleep?

We often talk about sleeping like a baby, but why do babies sleep so deeply? Here are a few facts about sleep:

- Melatonin is produced in the brain by a small gland called the pineal gland
- Melatonin production slows down as we age
- Reduced melatonin production causes restless sleep patterns





The Great Florida Outdoors: Scott Springs Park and Karst Formation

During the recent filming for a new part of our film *Reading the Florida Landscape* (based on my book of the same name), we took a boat trip on the Ocklawaha River to explore Rodman Dam with Captain Erika and Margaret Spontak. Both women are actively involved with the dam being re-opened and the water restored to its pristine and wonderful boundless flow.

In the words of Carl Buchheister, former president of the Audubon

Society, the ill-fated Cross Florida Barge Canal project would have been "One of the greatest boondoggles ever perpetrated." The 1935 plan proposed by the federal government called for the creation of Florida's version of the Panama Canal. A series of dredging and infrastructure projects would bisect the state, creating a continuous, navigable waterway from the Atlantic Coast to the Gulf of Mexico.

But before the Cross Florida Barge Canal project was abandoned, profound damage was already done.

I stood on the controversial Rodman/Kirkpatrick Dam, completed in 1968 as part of the Cross Florida Barge Canal. Though that project was never completed according to plan, this dam still stands today. The impounded waters had the effect of flooding about 7,500 acres of forested wetlands, over 20 spring heads and 16 miles of the Ocklahawa River.

From the websites:

"The 7,200-foot-long earthen dam has a four-gate spillway designed to discharge up to 36,000 cubic feet per second of water from the Rodman Reservoir, which is located on the upstream side of the dam and spillway. The approximately 9,500-acre reservoir has a drainage basin of almost 2,800 square miles, and its headwaters start in the Green Swamp and Lake Apopka.

For more than 14,000 years, Florida's natives and newcomers set out on the St. Johns, Ocklawaha, and Silver Rivers in search of connection with nature, their fellow man, and a network of waterways that linked the state's wild roots to its growing communities. 50 years ago, all of that changed.

Few can recall The Great Florida Riverway in its free-flowing glory.



Before the Rodman/Kirkpatrick Dam was completed in 1968, the Ocklawaha River, the heart of The Great Florida Riverway, nurtured an expansive cypress forest, crystal-blue springs, vibrant fish migrations, and thriving wildlife. These wonders live on in photos and stories but remain just beyond the reach of our collective memory.



The Ocklawaha's current state does not need to be its fate. Now is the time to breach the dam and reconnect the Ocklawaha to Silver Springs and the St. Johns River, restoring a 217-mile network representing some of Florida's most critical water resources and wildlife habitats. Together, we can restore the ecological and economic health of the river and its communities from Lake Apopka to the Atlantic Ocean.

The indelible footprint of human development in Florida can be read in the macro and the minutia. We must fight to battle these ongoing threats that continue to plague Florida's amazing yet imperiled freshwater ecosystems.

If the dam is reopened, it may be that the headwaters of the Silver River will be home to the biggest group of manatees in the USA, and the marine life will once again be able to migrate back and forth on the dynamic rivers. How do you see and learn about what is happening in nature?





Human Medications and Your Pet

Should you give your pet human over the counter medications when they are sick or hurt? The general answer is NO.

Some human over the counter medications such as Tylenol (acetaminophen) and Advil (ibuprophen) are EXTREMELY TOXIC to dogs and cats and should never be given.

Other human OTC medications such as aspirin, famotidine, benadryl or immodium are sometimes used in our pets but only on the direct orders of a veterinarian. Dosages are weight based and breed specific.

Dogs and cats are NOT small humans and they process medications very differently from us. There is also a concern with drug interaction. Medications that your pet is already taking may be contra-indicated with human medications. An example of this is the concurrent use of aspirin with Rimadyl (carprofen) or Metacam (meloxicam) for arthritis pain or using an NSAID while your pet is on steroid can cause stomach ulcers and perforations.

To be safe, NEVER ADMINISTER A MEDICATION INTENDED FOR HUMANS TO YOUR PET, unless directed specifically to do so by your veterinarian. If you suspect that your pet has accidentally eaten your medication, contact a veterinarian immediately.

The source of hope comes from "the God of hope." The word translated "hope" here does not mean, Gee, I sure hope so," but instead it is a joyful expectation of what has been promised arriving. The Bible teaches us that hope is something you are expecting but have not yet seen (Romans 8:24).

God has given us "exceedingly great and precious promises" (2 Peter 1:4) and that by these promises we would be partakers of God's divine nature. Free help navigating Medicare health and drug plan options for 2022

The Florida Department of Elder Affairs' SHINE (Serv- the kind of care they need. This could directly affect their need ing Health Insurance Needs of Elders) Program is available to provide free, unbiased help for Florida Medicare beneficiaries as they carefully evaluate their health care options during the Medicare Open Enrollment Period (OEP). Volunteers with the Florida Department of Elder Affairs' SHINE program wants Medicare beneficiaries to know that they are available to help with Medicare and health plan questions during the COVID-19 pandemic. Despite complications caused by the Coronavirus Health Emergency, SHINE continues to find creative, socially distant solutions to provide local, in-depth, and objective insurance counseling and assistance to Medicare-eligible individuals, their families, and caregivers.

During OEP, which runs October 15 through December 7, Medicare beneficiaries can make changes to their Medicare Prescription Drug or Medicare Advantage plans. SHINE encourages beneficiaries to review their benefits each year for a variety of reasons. Individuals often experience subtle changes in their SHINE counseling sites and enrollment events, visit www.aginghealth over the course of the year, and these changes may alter


for more or less health insurance, the types of prescription drugs they require or their access to particular doctors or pharmacies. Health changes can also increase costs, which can be particularly critical for Medicare beneficiaries on fixed incomes.

SHINE volunteer counselors through the Area Agency on Aging of Pasco-Pinellas, Inc, provide free, unbiased one-on-one insurance counseling and information on Medicare options and prescription drug assistance for elders, their families, and caregivers. SHINE also educates beneficiaries to protect, detect, and report potential errors, fraud, and abuse with their Medicare coverage. Beneficiaries are encouraged to act quickly to assure a smooth transition into the 2022 benefit year. To receive help from SHINE to review and enroll in a plan, individuals may visit designated SHINE counseling sites, attend enrollment events in their local communities, or contact trained SHINE volunteer counselors at 727-217-8111 or 1-800-963-5337. 

October Garden Tips

What to Plant

October is a transition period between Fall and Winter planting. We still have healthy starter plants for the garden. You can sow Winter crop seeds now too so they can be transplanted into their growing medium in November.

For vegetables, plant Beets, Broccoli, Cabbage, Cauliflower, Chinese Cabbage, Collards, Kale, Lettuce, Peppers, Strawberry, Carrots, Mustard Greens, Spinach, Onions, Radish, Turnips, Rutabaga. Herbs: Basil, Coriander/Cilantro, Fennel, Mexican Tarragon, Mint(s), Oregano, Rosemary, Thyme.

What Needs Done

Edibles/Veggies: Established crops can use a side-dressing of fertilizer labeled for vegetables that you can find at Shell's right now. Keep up with weeding and get some mulch down if you haven't already to prepare for cooler temperatures coming up. Winter Garden seed sowing can happen this month, and you can plant Fall crop starter plant too! Make sure you check out the Blog at ShellsFeed.com and you'll find lots of gardening articles to help you out. Make sure your pre-order your Vidalia Onions starter plant bundles by the end of this month - they arrive in November for planting!

October is the last month to fertilize your Citrus trees and other fruit trees before the Winter time. You don't want your fruit trees in active growth as the days become shorter and there is a possibility of freeze. October is a great time to plant new trees and shrubs as well, there's just enough heat and light for the roots to get established quickly now. Adjust your watering down as the days get cooler, plants won't need as much!
