Preventing and Treating COVID-19 in Children and Teens

We are well aware that adults can contract COVID-19, but, unfortunately, children and teens are also susceptible. However, there are certain precautions we can take to reduce the chance of becoming ill with COVID-19 or the flu.



Giving Human Trafficking Victims Hope Through Bridging Freedom

While completing her master's degree, Laura Hamilton joined a U.S. Department of Justice funded task force for Tampa Bay on human trafficking. It was then that God placed on her heart to start Bridging Freedom for victims of human trafficking to give young girls recovered from child-sex trafficking a place to live and to help them along the path to healing.

There are currently two homes on over 100 acres in an undisclosed location. The two homes can provide shelter for 12 girls, ages 13-17. In an effort to provide a home for more girls, Bridging Freedom is partnering with Rotary Clubs and other donors to build a third house.

The girls may be runaways, fleeing from a dysfunctional home and end up as victims. The experienced staff will help the girls to understand what situations define human trafficking. Some are not even aware that they are a victim of it. Girls may remain in this safe haven for a year or more where they focus on healing from the physical, mental, and emotional trauma, and are filled with hope for a better life.

"It's a beautiful thing when you see that hope come to them, " said Laura.

With a high staff to child ratio, they are able to meet the needs of the girls. It can take 3 to 4 months just to stabilize a victim of human trafficking to begin their long road of recovery. The professional team includes therapists, nurse, educator, case manager, and residential caretakers that help her to begin to process all that she has been through.

In addition to health care, girls receive educational training, therapeutic interventions, such as equine, music, art, gardening therapies, survivor mentorship, life skills including balancing a budget and taking care of a car, career development, and transitional mentorship for the time when the girls are ready to leave the facility and start on their own.

The organization's tagline is "restoring stolen childhoods" and the staff accomplish this through counseling and helping the girls to feel special and loved with birthday parties, Christmas celebrations, and many recreational outings.

In addition to helping the victims, Bridging Freedom works with the community, focusing on awareness and prevention. The organization participates in events throughout the year, including Light Up the Night, where funds are raised for agencies that fight human trafficking, and support survivors.



If you would like to support Bridging Freedom, gift card donations are needed to enable the girls to go on various adventures, fun outings and shopping. Grocery store cards are welcome too. Health and nutrition are an important part of the recovery process on the road to living independent, healthy lives. The girls are taught nutrition and how to prepare wellbalanced meals. 



Missing People

One of Pasco Sheriff's Office's most common calls for service is to find missing people. From runaway individuals, to those experiencing a medical condition or thoughts of self harm, our goal is the same; bring those who are missing home safe.

Pasco Sheriff's Office recently updated our policies for posting missing people on our social media and news website. We now post runaway individuals to our social media accounts and the Pasco Sheriff's Office News website at https://news.pascosheriff.com. Our online presence and social media audience often help us find those who are missing and generates tips quickly.

PSO has forefront resources available to assist with bringing missing individuals home safely. Pasco Sheriff's Office Aviation unit assists with missing person search and recovery missions, deploying drones and helicopters that can cover a wider range and travel at a faster pace from the air. Our K9s are vital to these searches, often working faster than deputies searching alone and bringing home those that are missing. PSO also has the Missing and Abducted Child Team (MAC), who responds to calls in Pasco County where children are critically missing due to health issues, age or other reasons, as well as child abductions.

Wandering is the most life-threatening behavior that leads to missing people. SafetyNet was developed to help public safety agencies bring loved ones with cognitive conditions home when they go missing. Once an individual is reported missing, SafetyNet is notified and activates their device. Once activated, the device emits a continuous radio frequency signal for rescue teams to track. If you suspect someone may attempt running away, encourage them to work through their problems through other means. Pasco Sheriff's Office has compiled community-based resources on our website to help serve our citizens. Resources are available for various challenges citizens may encounter, including mental health concerns, houselessness, suicidal thoughts and more. This resource list was developed to give those seeking assistance a place to start when they may not know how. To see these resources, visit $\underline{PascoSheriff.com/MentalHealth.html}$

Rapid reporting increases the chance of a safe return. You do not need to wait 24 hours for someone to be considered missing. Gathering information such as the individual's last known location, date and time seen can help law enforcement begin their search. Preparing a physical description of the individual, including their approximate height, weight, date of birth, hair and eye color, a description of the clothes they were last seen wearing and any distinct physical markings they may have helps as well. We try to use recent photos, which are often provided by family or a guardian.

To be clear, there is not an increase in runaway or missing persons cases in our community. We strive to find missing people quickly and safely. We publicly provide information the help the community identify someone to bring them home safe. Our goal remains the same: bring these individuals home, safe and sound. With the community's help, and in line with our motto of "We Fight as One," we're able to do just that.

The Great Florida Outdoors: The Green Swamp West Tract

The 560,000-acre Green Swamp spans four counties and gives rise to four major river systems and provides much of central Florida's drinking water supply. A large part of the preserve is upland hardwoods, pine flatwoods, open prairie land, and low ridges bounded by prominent sandy ridgelines. Cypress and floodplain swamps are an important part of this vast mosaic of natural communities.

The Green Swamp Wilderness Preserve is managed by the Southwest Florida Water Management District and covers 110,000 acres of east Pasco and west Sumpter County. The Green Swamp West Tract is a 37,350 acre portion of the Preserve located entirely in Pasco County. The Withlacoochee River, whose headwaters originate in the Green Swamp, flows for 36 miles through the Preserve on its 110 mile journey to the Gulf of Mexico and is protected as an Outstanding Florida Water within the Green Swamp Wilderness Preserve.

Three other rivers originate from this area—the Ocklawaha River, the Hillsborough River, and the Peace River. In addition to the West Tract, there are four other management units: Colt Creek State Park — 5,067 acres; East Tract — 51,149 acres; Hampton Tract — 11,052 acres, and Little Withlacoochee Tract — 4,446 acres.

The Green Swamp region is a plateau above surrounding areas and is an important physiographic feature of Florida. Rainwater helps create its four major rivers and also percolates down through the soil to replenish the Floridian aquifer system, the primary source of drinking water for most Floridians. Because of its elevation above outlying areas, the underground aquifer rises very close to the land surface and the region functions as the pressure head for the aquifer. The protection of the Green Swamp is vital to protecting the quality and quantity of Florida's water supply. In 1974, the state of Florida designated 322,000 acres of the Green Swamp region as an Area of Critical State Concern.

More than 65 miles of roads and multi-use trails fan out from the entrance. Approximately 31 miles of the Florida National Scenic Trail run through Green Swamp East and West tracts.

To cover the expansive territory, Ed and I took our electric bikes (ebikes). We were both fairly new to ebikes but we knew they should work great in the diverse terrain and allow us to explore more of what the area offered. We biked for a couple miles and parked to explore nature. Over the course of the day we found several species of lichens (one of our new passions) including Speckled Blister Lichen trypethelium tropicum. We also found cinnamon fern, royal fern, resurrection fern, giant swordfern, Virginia chainfern, upright sedge, mermaidweed, wax myrtles, southern bayberry, bog white violet, orange milkwort, water oak trees, black gum trees, black cherry, frostweed, and inkberry. A few times we found the dirt trails to be covered by water from the previous day's rains, but we managed to maneuver our way past any impediments and enjoy an invigorating trip with several nature-filled stops before reaching our cars.

We found a very unique cypress tree with trees growing out from its extended trunk and limbs. In many locations we spotted longleaf pines stretched skyward, their tops swaying in the wind. Many other species, including Florida black bear, raccoon, and deer live on the property, along with numerous bird, butterfly, and dragonfly species.

If you have the time and energy, a 1.5-mile connector trail leads to Withlacoochee River Park. A small boat ramp is located on River Road and there are numerous camping options to extend your visit including equestrian and primitive sites. Seasonal hunting for white-tailed deer, wild turkey, and wild hogs takes place in the area so check on these dates.



Valentine's Day: One of America's Most Popular Days



There's no doubt that Valentine's Day is one of America's most popular days. More than 62% of Americans celebrate by sending greeting cards, flowers, candy, jewelry, or by enjoying a romantic dinner. But the origin of Valentine's Day is surprising.

For example, the roots behind Valentine's Day go all the way back to an ancient Roman fraternity fest held in mid-February called Lupercalia. Later, the Christian church chose mid-February for Saint Valentine's Day in order to Christianize the celebration, but who was St. Valentine?

Not much was known about the holiday's namesake. First of all, there was more than one such Christian priest. One thought it was unjust and defied the Emperor and continued to marry young lovers in secret. Emperor Claudius II banned marriage for young Roman men, thinking single men made better soldiers.

Eventually, the Emperor caught on to the priest's actions, and he was arrested and sentenced to death. Pope Gelasius declared February 14th as the date honoring Valentine's Day near the end of the 5th century. It wasn't until the 1300's that the holiday became associated with love and romance.

Back then, people believed that February 14th also was the beginning of the birds' mating season. The first written Valentine greeting appeared in the 15th century, and by the 17th century people in Great Britain had begun a tradition of exchanging Valentine cards or letters.

Valentine's Day soon caught on in the U.S. as well. The first mass-produced holiday cards emerged in 1840, and Valentine's Day soon exploded into a major consumer holiday. Today, an estimated 1 billion Valentine cards are sent each year, more than any other holiday except for Christmas. More than 35 million heart-shaped boxes of chocolate are sold, and 220 million roses produced for the holiday in a year.

Altogether, Americans spend around \$20 billion on Valentine's Day, an average of \$130 dollars per person per year. While the most popular gifts were candy and flowers, nearly 20% of Americans splurge on jewelry, shelling out \$4 billion annually. Those who prefer the ultimate romantic gesture are definitely not alone. A recent survey reveals at least six million couples are likely to get engaged on February 14th.

Under God's Control By David Wilkerson



In these last days, the Lord's eye is not fixed on world powers but on the church of Jesus Christ. God is not focused on the economy, on the rise of world religions, on the roaring of the heathen. According to Isaiah, the nations are to God "as a drop of a bucket" (Isaiah 40:15). They are all under His sovereign rule and reign.

God knows all about terrorist threats, wars and rumors of wars. His Word warns that the heathen will rage, secular powers will try to outlaw Christianity, and fast-growing, anti-Christ movements will boast they'll rule the world and destroy Jesus' followers. The Bible says this about it all:

"The kings of the earth set themselves, and the rulers take counsel together, against the Lord, and against his anointed, saying, Let us break their bands asunder, and cast away their cords from us" (Psalm 2:2–3). In short, "Let's cast away all moral hindrances, all moral landmarks of the past."

Here is God's reaction to these earthly powers and demon-influenced men: "He that sitteth in the heav-

ens shall laugh: the Lord shall have them in derision." (2:4) No matter how desperate things look, everything remains under God's full control.

I'm thankful for this word from the Psalms. More and more, we hear reports of secularism wiping out the evangelical church in Europe; of Islam being the fastest growing religion in the world; of homosexuals hijacking entire denominations; of Christ's church growing so weak it no longer has any impact on society. Yet God's Word declares, "On Christ the Rock God will build His church." "The gates of hell shall not prevail against it" (Matthew 16:18). Nothing from the bowels of hell can hope to destroy Christ's church. His eye is always on His people, and through everything He warns Satan and his hordes, "Do not touch the apple of My eye."

"Behold, they shall surely gather together, but not by me: whosoever shall gather together against thee shall fall for thy sake." (Isaiah 54:15) Do you see what God is saying here? "The devil is going to come at you. Enemies out of hell will gather together against you. But Satan will not succeed."
