Giving Easter a Second Look



Have you ever gone for a walk way off the beaten path into some winding woods? Have you ever done it with a genuine ornithologist (i.e., bird watcher)? That experience would probably make most of us feel our eyesight would be something comparable to Stevie Wonder's during a solar eclipse.

Because while our gaze would likely mainly be focused fearfully on the earth below (to avoid a repeat of the near face plant of a half mile back), our bird watcher friend would be joyously peering around 180 degrees with the piercing gaze of an American bald eagle.

Imagine as he enthusiastically points to a 90' Grevillea Robusta tree (silver oak, stay with me now) and says, "Wow! Did you see that? A striated pardalote! Beautiful specimen! Look! Quick! Look!"

And as you risk your life and lift your eyes off the path to peer at the focus of his excitement, frustration floods in quickly, because all you see is leaves and branches. Lots of leaves. Lots of branches.

For many, the wonder of the resurrection is like that. The marvel of the matter is missed because the look is just a glancing one. No intent to peer in. No careful observation. And that's exactly how it started for one of Jesus' closest disciples.

"Now on the first day of the week, Mary Magdalene went to the tomb early, while it was still dark, and saw that the stone had been taken away from the tomb. Then she ran and came to Simon Peter and to the other disciple, whom Jesus loved, and said to them, "They have taken away the Lord out of the tomb, and we do not know where they have laid Him.

Peter therefore went out, and the other disciple, and were going to the tomb. So they both ran together, and the other disciple outran Peter and came to the tomb first. And he, stooping down and looking in, saw the linen cloths lying there; yet he did not go in. Then Simon Peter came, following him, and went into the tomb, and he saw the linen cloths lying there, and the handkerchief that had been around His head, not lying with the linen cloths but folded together in a place by itself. Then the other disciple, who came to the tomb first, went in also, and he saw and believed." -John 20:1-8

Three Kinds of "Looks" Into the Empty Tomb

John was younger and faster then Peter. He let us know he could outrun Peter in a foot race. But

though he got to the tomb first, John didn't actually enter. He only bent down and "looked" (Greek, blepo) in. This word implies a glance. A quick look. By giving the empty tomb only a blepo look, John missed a lot. By not being more observant, he thought no further then what the women had said. Somebody's taken him!

The Easter Examination

But when Peter arrived (panting like happens when you're not in your 20's anymore!) he did not stop at the opening, but went right in. When he did, he gave the area a kind of look that required a different word to be used (Greek, theoreo). His look is the look of careful observation and scrutiny, the look of the ornithologist to the trees in search of birds. The look of the biologist through a microscope to see his tissue samples. The look of the astronomer through his telescope to peer at the moons of Venus.

Here's what Peter saw that John didn't. The garments were lying just as if he were still in them. His head cloth was rolled up in a manner that was like unto how it would have been on him, and separated from his body. Huh?! Who robs graves and leaves the clothes! And if, for some weird reason, they did, who would take the time to lay them out much as they were when wrapped about the deceased?

Giving Easter a Second Look

As John was outside waiting for Peter, something hit him. "Wait. Did I see ...?" So he went in with Peter. This time, his look was far more intense, and a third Greek word for "see" is usedhorao. It means "to take heed, to perceive." When he did this, he believed!



People always ask me what finally made my life turn around with my food issues, when I started having victory. Actually, it started after I was binging at a pizza place and the server recognized who I was as the health expert in this paper, over 21 years ago!

I was so frustrated because I had food addictions and emotional eating issues that I didn't know how to stop. God started to remind me in prayer about the scripture that refers to our body as the temple of God. I felt convicted that I was struggling so much with food. Even though I was the #1 trainer in the company out of 2,000 trainers, I still couldn't get myself to stop eating in an unhealthy way.

Although I had heard that scripture many times, this time was different, it hit me at the core of my spirit and I realized that food had become an idol in my life and that I needed help!

I started looking at the scriptures that talk about how when Jesus was crucified, He paid a price for us and that we don't own our bodies anymore (of course this applies only to believers and those that believe in what the Bible teaches about this). It says when He was crucified and rose from the dead that it gave the ability for our bodies to be the temple of God.

This was huge for me to really see this at a different level and with my food issues, I realized that I was not taking care of the temple He had given me. I saw in the Bible that I didn't have a right to abuse it or do whatever I wanted with it but I needed to ask God for help on this through prayer and studying the Bible. Little by little, I started to overcome the dysfunctional relationship I had with food and I no longer binged and I overcame compulsive eating and my sugar addiction.

After 30 years of struggling with food and sugar, I realized it was time to make a change. So, how about you? How have you been honoring the body that God gave you? Have you been a good "manager or steward" over it? With this month being the celebration of Resurrection Day (AKA Easter), perhaps use this time to reflect on this and ask God to give you an understanding of what this means in your life and how He wants you to implement it.

Taking care of our health is not only for us and our family but it's also honoring to God. He said to glorify God in our bodies, that it is worship to Him. Eating foods that are addictive and unhealthy and are linked to disease is not glorifying God in our bodies. It's not about a certain size or weight, it's about a heart attitude of honoring your body as God's temple and making sure you don't have any idolatry in your life with food. If you need some help taking care of the body God gave you, I have four personal training studios for women and that is what we do.

Have a wonderful time celebrating Resurrection weekend! It's also the anniversary day of 27 years of when my husband and I went to church and responded to God and dedicated our lives to Christ. Preventing and Treating COVID-19 in Children and Teens

We are well aware that adults can contract COVID-19, but, unfortunately, children and teens are also susceptible. However, there are certain precautions we can take to reduce the chance of becoming ill with COVID-19 or the flu.

Wash your hands often, avoid touching your face, limit exposure to people outside the home, and wear masks.

Hand washing should last for 20 seconds. Try to make it fun with your child by singing his or her favorite song while hand washing.

Encourage your child or teen to practice social distancing. Limit the people they are exposed to whenever possible. If you can leave them at home with a family member while you go to the store, then do so. If they must go out in public, they should wear a cloth mask and use hand sanitizer often.

Clean and disinfect your home, especially toys, doorknobs, tables, light switches, television remote controls, and, of course, bathrooms.

As in flu prevention, eating a healthy, well-balanced meal, getting enough sleep as well as plenty of outdoor exercise in the fresh air and sunshine, can help to build your immune system to fight off the illnesses.

If you suspect your child has been exposed to COVID-19, the symptoms can include fever, cough, nasal congestion or runny nose, sore throat, shortness of breath, fatigue, headache, muscle aches, nausea or vomiting, diarrhea, poor appetite, new loss of taste or smell, or belly pain.

Fleas and Ticks

What is the difference between fleas and ticks? There is actually a big difference. A flea is a wingless insect that can jump really far. Ticks are arachnids, closely related to spiders. Fleas can live for more than 100 days, while ticks can live from a few weeks to up to 3 years. Ticks can transmit dangerous diseases like Lyme disease and Rocky Mountain spotted fever. Ticks live on bushes and grass. When your pet walks by and brushes up against the grass or shrub the tick climbs up on the host. Once on the new host the tick will eventually find a place to attach and feed. Fleas are very common, in fact there are over 2,000 different species of fleas. Fleas can cause extreme discomfort in your pet and can cause a severe allergic reaction to flea bites. There are many products that help control fleas and ticks. We recommend 2 products. The first product is Bravecto. For dogs, it is an oral dosage that lasts about 3 months and for cats it is a topical application that lasts about 3 months. The second product is for dogs only, that is Simparica Trio. Simparica Trio is a monthly treatment and takes care of fleas, ticks, heartworms and intestinal parasites. In Florida your pet needs year round protection from fleas and ticks. These products are only available from licensed veterinarians.

The Great Florida Outdoors: Why Do Vines Curl?

If you walk out in nature, it may not take much time for you to observe vines that curl and wrap around tree trunks and branches. Why? And in what direction?

Vines use the other plants or trees as support for rootlets or tendrils that grow from the vines. I hypothesized that the winding or curling action may provide a more stable foundation in many cases instead of a single linear upward movement.

I researched some theories online and in reference articles. Certain plants and vines spiral clockwise as they grow (right direction) and some spiral counterclockwise (left direction). Is it determined by which hemisphere you are in and influenced by the Coriolis Effect? It could be tested by finding spirals in both northern and southern hemispheres and comparing their directions. However, many vines spiral in both directions. Given that the Earth does not arbitrarily change its rotational direction, this behavior must be explained by some other explanation.

Among the theories are that the spiral will try different directions to maximize its contact and support and/or the spiral is influenced by the night-day cycles.

I found a theory called a "genetic spiral" that suggests the direction of helicity in various helical-patterns in living plants and animals usually solely depends upon genetic make-up.

Next I found a fascinating article that described how samples of fire moss that travelled on-board the space shuttle Columbia did something odd: they spiral. Scientists say it's a clue to the fundamental inner workings of plant cells. "Moss from space shuttle Columbia (STS-87) shows spiral growth patterns that emerged in low-gravity." Biologist Fred Sack carefully lifted a petri dish from the tray. Inside were precious samples of moss just back from a two-week voyage aboard space shuttle Columbia. He glanced at the growing clumps, blinked, then looked closer. It was not what I expected to see," recalls Sack. His moss was growing in a spiral.

On Earth, moss spores that take root send out hundreds of tiny filaments known as protone-mata. These filaments normally grow in an unruly fashion and make a messy-looking tangle. But the moss onboard Columbia behaved differently. "As if choreographed, the protonemata swirled together in the same direction. They formed a distinctive clockwise spiral like no moss on Earth."

Much more needs to be learned about the mechanism of spiraling. Gravity apparently has nothing to do with plant's chirality (or "handedness") or spiraling. Darwin proposed that it was "autonomously induced," which came to be known as the internal oscillator theory. In the 1960's the gravitropic overshoot theory explained mathematically how circumnutation could spontaneously occur as a result of forces related to gravity and growth. As noted, recent experiments on the space shuttle have demonstrated that gravity is not necessary for circumnutation.

Climbing plants exhibit a predominance of right-handed helical growth, but it cannot be explained by a hypothesis attempting to link plant growth behavior and global location. An alternative hypothesis for the findings is that the widespread phenomenon of anticlockwise twining arises as a function of microtubule orientation operating at a subcellular level. Actin filaments as well as microtubules are all chiral polymers, meaning they form spiral structures with defined orientation.

One article included, "The mechanical or physiological basis for dextral versus sinistral orientation of circumnutation among apically twining plants has not been determined." I found an article in Science that stated "tendril coiling occurs via asymmetric contraction of an internal fiber ribbon of specialized cells. Under tension, both extracted fiber ribbons and old tendrils exhibit twistless overwinding rather than unwinding, with an initially soft response followed by strong strain-stiffening at large extensions." Wow.


Here I have described many scientific hypotheses that may account for plant curling. But to leave out a major consideration—plant intelligence—would be wrong. I have seen countless examples of plants connecting to other plants in seemingly random patterns, their twining wrapping around each other, some even from a distance away. As noted in one article, "We now have dozens of research papers, hundreds of articles, and hours of video prepared and published by plant biologists and neurobiologists discussing the many facets of plant intelligence. Through rigorous research and experimentation, the following behavioral characteristics have now been established and can be attributed to plants: communication, learning, problem solving, and memory & memory recall."

Plants have the ability to communicate with one another and the ability to share information and resources between organisms. The communication occurs through underground Mycorrhizal networks, or cobweb-like networks of mycelial growth that grows around the root structures of trees and plants. These Mycorrhizal networks have affectionately been dubbed the "Wood Wide Web," that can be used for anything from nutrient transportation to signaling a potential threat. By creating an internet-like communication network, it may even allow an entire forest to communicate. Given that plants are stationary and cannot flee from predators, communication has been a very important adaptation to combat their mobility limitations. Curling and twining may be a form of communication yet to be discovered.

How can you observe these mysteries of nature?

Easter And What It Has To Do With A Bunny



Easter, a celebration of Jesus Christ's resurrection from the dead, is the holiest day of the Christian calendar. According to the gospels of the New Testament, Jesus Christ and his apostles entered Jerusalem to observe Passover, the Jewish holy season that celebrates the Hebrews' release from slavery.

After the Passover supper, Jesus was arrested, and on what is now called Good Friday, he was crucified. Two days later, he rose from the dead. Those of Jewish origin were the first to celebrate the resurrection, likely as a new facet of the Passover festival. In fact, the Easter celebration was called "PASCHA." It's derived from the word

"PESACH" (the Jewish translation for Passover).

Originally, Easter was celebrated two days after Passover, so it fell on any day of the week, but Easter Wednesday just didn't feel right. In 325 AD, Roman Emperor Constantine and the Council of Nicaea ruled that Easter must fall only on a Sunday, the day when Christ rose from the dead. Easter Sunday would be the first Sunday following the full moon after the spring equinox; it could occur anywhere between March 22nd and April 25th.

Around the same time, Christians began one of the first recorded rituals of the modern Easter celebration—the lighting of the Paschal candle. Its flame is a reminder of Christ's resurrection—light out of darkness. As Christianity spread throughout Europe, different pagan customs blended into the holidays. In fact, the actual word "Easter" may have come from "Eostre," the Goddess of spring and fertility, which brings us to the Easter egg.

Eggs have been a mythological symbol of birth for thousands of years. Christians adopted the egg as an Easter custom sometime around the 13th century. The yolk inside a shell represented Christ emerging from the tomb. Eggs were painted red, representing the blood Christ shed from the cross.

The colorful Easter egg soon hatched its own traditions. A popular one was egg rolling. In 1876, Congress prohibited kids from playing on the Capitol grounds, so President Rutherford B. Hayes opened the White House lawn to the little rollers. Thereafter, the White House Easter Egg Roll became a tradition. So when did that Easter Bunny hop onto the scene? The fertile rabbit has long been a symbol of new life in European pagan celebrations.

Beginning around the 16th century, parents told children that if they behaved, on the eve of Easter, the Osterhase (the name given in Germany to the Easter Bunny) would come and lay colorful eggs, so the children built nests in their homes to entice the rabbit to visit.

Thus began the custom of the Easter egg hunt and the Easter basket. To help fill out those baskets, 19th century European chocolatiers began making egg-shaped chocolates, and the sweet trend spread throughout the world. Today, billions of dollars are spent each year on Easter candy. Easter is a joyful day when Christians celebrate Jesus Christ's resurrection. It witnesses the immense power of God Himself and the belief that God exists. Only He who created life can resurrect it after death.

1st Corinthians 15:55 "He can remove the sting that is death and the victory that is the **grave.**" In Jesus resurrecting from the grave, God reminds us of His absolute sovereignty over life and death. Jesus is the testimony to the resurrection of human beings, which is the principle on which the Christian faith is based.

Unlike all other religions, Christianity alone possesses a founder who transcends death and who promises that His followers will do the same. All the other religions were founded by men and prophets whose end was the grave. As Christians, we take comfort in the fact that our God became a man who died for our sins and was resurrected on the third day from a grave that could not hold him. Today, He lives and sits at the right hand of God.

For 2000 years, new customs have been added, some spiritual and some fun. But Easter is also the time for families to gather and to welcome spring, when new life emerges after the dead of winter. Drive Different, Drive Without Any Distractions

You wouldn't try to play your favorite sport while distracted by texting, eating or styling your hair at the same time, so why attempt to complete the same tasks while driving? Being in a hurry is not a good excuse to drive distracted. Before getting behind the wheel, allotting extra travel time can resolve many driving distractions. Without additional travel time, distractions often overcome our discipline causing us to drive distracted.

Some of the most common distractions while driving are visual distractions. Common visual distractions while behind the wheel include texting, using a GPS, looking at a passenger, adjusting the radio or temperature in the car, applying make-up, styling hair and daydreaming. Most visual distractions can be resolved prior to putting the car in drive. For example, program and review your GPS before starting your car. Make phone calls or send texts before driving, then place your phone in a safe place such as a bag or arm console, and consider using your phone's driving mode, if it's available. Add a few extra minutes to your routine to do your make-up or perfect your hair while at home. Talk with your passengers before starting your trip and let them know you're focusing on the road and not on them. Looking away from the road requires additional time for you to refocus on the task at hand. Even checking your phone at a red light can cause your focus to change, and make it more difficult to regain focus back on the road when the light changes. Maintaining the required visual focus on the road provides more time to react to whatever is happening on the road ahead, if needed.

Manual distractions occur when we take our hands off the wheel and do something else while driving. Common manual activities are texting, GPS programming, adjusting vehicle controls like the radio or thermostat, engaging with passengers, eating/drinking, grooming activities such as brushing hair or applying make-up, and tobacco use, like smoking or vaping. Passengers can be a big help with these distractions as well. Have passengers resolve little tasks while you are operating the vehicle, like checking the GPS. Your passengers will likely appreciate your dedication to driving and be happy to oblige. If you're traveling alone, take a few extra moments before leaving or pull over if you need to resolve something. Keeping your hands on the wheel and away from manual distractions, allows you to react to changing road conditions.

Cognitive distractions are not physical interferences you can see or touch, but mental interruptions of your mind wandering off while driving. Stress, anxiety, daydreaming and fatigue are common causes cognitive distractions while driving. These types of distractions can be challenging to avoid but manageable by taking breaks when needed. Time constraints often pressure us to feel the need to get somewhere fast. Cognitive distractions can be tricky, especially if you are stuck in traffic and your mind starts to wander or you become drowsy. Pulling over for a few moments to rest, clear your mind and stretch will help you return to the road recharged and ready to drive safely.

These seemingly small distractions behind the wheel often result in preventable incidents. When you commit to driving, remember the responsibility you have. Not only are you in control of operating your vehicle, but your decisions may impact others on the road. Help everyone arrive at their destinations safely and focus on the road while driving.


