

Christine is passionate about the mission of Hero To A Child because she "has seen firsthand the difference a Guardian ad Litem can make in a child's life, and sometimes, in the parent's life." The Unsung Heroes Brunch was created to honor those unsung heroes among us who tirelessly advocate for the rising number of abused & neglected children in the dependency system. Hero To A Child's mission is to advocate for and support children, young adults, and families impacted by abuse and neglect in Pinellas and Pasco Counties by collaborating with community partners and the Guardian ad Litem staff and volunteers who support the children we serve. In 2021, they responded to more than 4,806 individual needs requests for children right here in our community. You can learn more about their programs and services at <a href="https://www.HeroToAChild.org">www.HeroToAChild.org</a>. The number of children in care in the Circuit they serve has surged with an over 41% increase over the past 6 years making it the highest in the entire state of Florida for children in the dependency system.

Erin Authier, Executive Director of Hero To A Child, stated, "The role of the GAL is vital in the life of children in the dependency system. A child with a GAL is more likely to find permanency and less likely to re-enter the foster system. We are currently serving more than 70% of children in care here in Circuit 6 but it is our goal to reach 100% one day and we need the help of the community to raise the funds and awareness necessary to do that."

Hero To A child hopes to raise \$50,000 with this fundraising event to help meet the needs of each child in care and to recruit more GAL volunteers to be the voice of the child in court. A GAL is often the only form of consistency for children in the system and often the only voice solely vested in what is best for that individual child. Hero To A Child was founded to ensure that the basic rights and needs of every child in the GAL program are met. Hero To A Child envisions a community where every child and young adult is safe, secure, and thriving. They believe every child deserves to have a permanent family and be well prepared for their future beyond foster care. Hero To A Child works closely with the Guardian ad Litem Program and raises all funds through private individuals, corporations, civic organizations, faith communities, and fundraising events. They do not receive any government assistance.

# Preventing and Treating COVID-19 in Children and Teens

We are well aware that adults can contract COVID-19, but, unfortunately, children and teens are also susceptible. However, there are certain precautions we can take to reduce the chance of becoming ill with COVID-19 or the flu.

Wash your hands often, avoid touching your face, limit exposure to people outside the home, and wear masks.

Hand washing should last for 20 seconds. Try to make it fun with your child by singing his or her favorite song while hand washing.

Encourage your child or teen to practice social distancing. Limit the people they are exposed to whenever possible. If you can leave them at home with a family member while you go to the store, then do so. If they must go out in public, they should wear a cloth mask and use hand sanitizer often.

Clean and disinfect your home, especially toys, doorknobs, tables, light switches, television remote controls, and, of course, bathrooms.

As in flu prevention, eating a healthy, well-balanced meal, getting enough sleep as well as plenty of outdoor exercise in the fresh air and sunshine, can help to build your immune system to fight off the illnesses.

If you suspect your child has been exposed to COVID-19, the symptoms can include fever, cough, nasal congestion or runny nose, sore throat, shortness of breath, fatigue, headache, muscle aches, nausea or vomiting, diarrhea, poor appetite, new loss of taste or smell, or belly pain.

# The Great Florida Outdoors: Liverworts

#### What's in a name?

The English word "wort" means "small plant," expressed in names such as Pennywort and Bladderwort. The term liverwort originated from the fact that the early herbalists thought that one of the liverworts had some resemblance to a liver and was therefore might be useful as a medicine for liver ailments. Liverwort derives from a "liver-like small plant".

Liverworts represent a branch of non-vascular plants, most of which are terrestrial.

#### Liverwort Life Cycle

Liverworts, like most plants, display an alternation of generations between a haploid organism and a diploid organism.

In alternation of generations, a single species displays multiple forms. There is the sporophyte, which is capable of producing haploid spores. These spores cannot fuse together like gametes, and instead they grow into a new organism, the gametophyte. The gametophyte is still haploid, but grows into a multicellular organism. The gametophyte can produce gametes, which are simi-

lar to spores except they will not grow into a new organism directly. Instead, gametes undergo fusion or fertilization, and form a new cell, the zygote.

The zygote, now a diploid organism, grows to be multicellular. It develops special organs capable of meiosis, a type of cell division which reduces the amount of DNA. Through this process, the spores produced are haploid, again. This means that they carry only 1 copy of DNA.

They are released into the environment, and the process can start over. Sporophytes and gameto-phytes typically look and form differently, although this is not always the case. In the case of liverworts, the sporophyte and gametophyte versions are very different. Look at the image below.

In liverworts, the gametophyte is the dominant life cycle. This means that liverworts are typically haploid organisms. In the image above, you will see two gametophytes. Liverworts are also dioicous, meaning they have haploid gametophytes with separate sexes. The male plants produce

an antheridial head, capable of producing sperm. The female archegonial head produces an egg. The sperm are dispersed from the male gametophytes and are carried by wind or water to the egg found on another plant.

When the sperm fertilizes the egg, an embryo is formed. This is the sporophyte, and in liverworts it will not get very big. The liverwort sporophyte develops into the microscopic seta. The seta, or mature sporophyte, is completely dependent on the gametophyte for food and survival, and lives within the archegonium its entire life. The seta is responsible for conducting meiosis, and creating the haploid spores. The spores

will be released into the environment, and will grow into adult gametophytes. The image shows

the development of the first rhizoids on the spore, which will become a rudimentary root system for the grown gametophyte.

However, this is not the only way liverworts can reproduce. Take a look at the image again. You will notice that the gametophytes both have small cups, called gemma cups. These cups contain small clusters of cells known as gemmae. When rain or water spashes into the cup, the gemmae are dispersed from the plant, and are capable of growing into full gametophytes in the right conditions. While liverworts

have the ability to reproduce through the above mentioned process of alternation of generations, this much simpler process of asexual reproduction probably accounts for a large percentage of the plant's reproduction and dispersal.

In broad terms, a liverwort gametophyte will show one of two forms, depending on the genus. In a leafy liverwort the gametophyte consists of leaves on stems. In a thallose liverwort you'll see a flattish, green sheet - possibly wrinkled or lobed. Such a sheet is called a thallus and, in many cases, that's all there is to the gametophtyte.

#### **Evolutionary History of Liverworts**

The atmosphere was composed heavily of carbon dioxide and contained little oxygen. As plants like ancient liverworts began to emerge, they consumed the carbon dioxide and released oxygen. This drastic changing of global chemistry would later lead to climate change and massive extinction events. Unlike liverwort, vascular plants had a distinct advantage in transporting and holding water. However, in the 485 million years since the emergence of land plants, both types have colonized nearly every terrestrial space. Liverworts and other non-vascular plants can be found in deserts, and in cold northern latitudes as well.

Think about the role of liverworts in climate change! Many researchers and citizen scientists have been called upon to study liverworts and help quantify climate change. These plants could become our climate "canary in the coal mine."


Liverworts, once thought to be firmly related to the ferns, have more recently been given their own subdivision. The ferns show an opposing alternation of generations. Unlike liverworts, they show a dominate sporophyte. It is now thought that ferns are more closely related to gymnosperms (conifers) and flowering plants. Liverworts, therefore, represent an ancient and mostly unchanged division of some of the first terrestrial organisms to ever come out of the water. The argument of whether to include the liverworts within the Bryophyte (moss) grouping is an ongoing debate, but recent classifications have kept them in their own division.

# Mother-Where Would We Be Without Her?

Every year on Mother's Day, moms all over the world receive cards, flowers, phone calls, and macaroni jewelry boxes, all of them with the same sentiment. Thanks, mom! But dear old mom's sweet day of gratitude left its creator quite bitter.

The ancient Greeks were among the first to pay tribute to moms. Their spring festival honored Rhea, the mother of all Greek gods; that holiday didn't pan out. In mid-evil Britain, servants were given the fourth Sunday of Lent to go home to spend a day with their moms.

This custom was called Mothering Sunday. But the modern era Mother's Day was created by Anna Marie Jarvis. Anna admired her mother, who attended to the wounded during the Civil War and later became a community activist.

When young Anna was 12, it was believed that she heard her mother pray that one day, there might be a memorial day for mothers, for all the good they do. Young Anna never forgot the prayer, and when her mom died in May of 1905, a plan for Mother's Day was born.

On the second anniversary of her mom's death, Anna held a church memorial dedicated to her mother's good deeds. In May of 1908, Anna held another memorial and handed out white carnations, her mom's favorite flower.

She contacted Philadelphia philanthropist John Wanamaker, who joined a Mother's Day committee in hopes of honoring all mothers all across the nation. In 1910, West Virginia

became the first state to observe the second Sunday in May as Mother's Day. After a fierce letter-writing campaign, Anna got Congress to federally recognize the holiday.

In 1914, President Wilson signed a bill that officially made the second Sunday in May, Mother's Day. The holiday was meant to be spent in church. Afterwards, sons and daughters would write loving letters to their mothers. Carnations were worn that day—pink or red carnations honored living mothers and white carnations honored mothers that passed.

With each year, more and more Mother's Day carnations were sold and by 1920, greeting card companies got into the Mother's Day business.

Anna was enraged by what she considered a lazy excuse for letters that should be handwritten. By 1924, the holiday creator was so appalled with the commercialization of Mother's Day that she petitioned to abolish it.

In 1930, Anna was arrested for disturbing the peace at a Mother's Day carnation sale. Sadly, Anna spent the rest of her life and family inheritance fighting the holiday. She died in 1948, leaving no children to remember her.

Since then, Mother's Day has become one of the most profitable holidays for florists and the phone companies' highest volume day of the year.

This probably wouldn't please Anna, but deep down, she would have to be satisfied that on her Mother's Day, millions of moms around the world receive extra attention and well-deserved hugs. All on Mother's Day.

# Pasco County Tax Collector Mike Fasano & Staff Collect \$11,000 for the Humane Society of Pasco County





# **Water Safety**

The warm and sunny weather is perfect for days on the water. However, it creates possible dangers for those who do not know how to swim. Fatal drowning rates continue to increase each year. Residential locations, such as a child's home, a family or friend's house or a neighbor's residence count for 71 percent of fatal drowning incidents. The Pasco Sheriff's Office wants everyone to review the following water safety tips in order to reduce the chances of injury or death around water.

### **Stay Alert**

Many drowning fatalities can be prevented by adult supervision. Children shouldn't be unattended in or near water. Rather than assume someone else is watching a child in a pool area, designate an adult water watcher. This person shouldn't be distracted in any way and should have a charged phone nearby for emergencies. Although swimming lessons and life preservers are important for water safety, there is no substitute for adult supervision. Additionally, don't to leave objects such as toys near pools, docks, canals or other bodies of water, which can draw a child's attention towards water.

### Water Safety Skills

Learning to swim is crucial for water safety. Between 2015-2017, children younger than 5 years old account for 75 percent of child drownings. Ensuring that children know how to swim and know the rules of pool or water safety are vital for reducing water-related incidents. Establishing clear rules with children, such as don't climb pool fences or stay off of docks while playing can aid in safety as well.

Another way to ensure safety while enjoying water-related activities is knowing CPR and updating these skills regularly. Additionally, keeping rescue equipment and a first aid kit poolside or easily accessible at all times can help prevent serious injury or death. Starting life-saving procedures prior to emergency personnel's arrival can increase someone's chances of living.

### Appropriate Equipment

Proper fences, alarms and pool covers are crucial for water safety. Check to make sure all drain covers are secure before entering a pool or spa. Use at least four-foot high fence with self-closing and self-latching gates around all pools. Never prop open gates that lead to water or leave furniture where a child could use it to climb over the fence. Use covers and install alarms, such as a wave-activated alarm in the pool or an alarm on the door leading from the house to the pool. Ensure all life-saving equipment, such as life rings or reaching poles are in good condition and readily available for use.


