You Can't Hide From God

When I was young, I believed in God. I even believed in Jesus and his redemptive work to save me and forgive me of my sins, but I did not go to church out of fear that God would ask me to do something I did not want to do. I was afraid God might ask me to move to China or Africa and live in poverty or require of me something that would make my life miserable. I was afraid of God and thought that if I kept my distance, he would leave me alone.

What I did not know was that God knew all those things about me. He knew where I was and what I was thinking. Have you ever been afraid that God might ask you to sacrifice all the things you love to prove your willingness to serve him? I have discovered that a lot of people are.

Jesus did not come to make your life hard. He came so that you might "have life and have life more abundantly" (John 10:10). Jesus came so that your relationship with God could be restored. Yes, it is true your sins separated you from God, but that was why Jesus came to receive the judgment for your sins, to give you his righteousness (rightness before God) and restore to you everything you had lost because of sin. God never intended for you to live a miserable life. Jesus took your curse of shame and guilt, sickness, and poverty and he did it for you. God's greatest delight is you.

Adam hid himself from God after he sinned when he heard God walking in the garden. God called out, "Adam, where are you?" (Genesis 3:9). God knew where Adam was and what he had done, but God called Adam from his hiding place, not to shame him, but to give him a promise. That promise was fulfilled with the completed work of Jesus. When Jesus said, "it is finished" the judgment for our sins was complete. When Jesus rose from the dead, death was defeated. When Jesus sent the Holy Spirit to live in us, we were forever changed and brought into God's family. God is our Heavenly Father who is gracious and kind. He is not out to "get" you, He is out to "give" you what you so desperately need and desire.

God knows. The day Jesus was resurrected his disciples were hiding behind locked doors for fear. Those wooden barriers did not keep Jesus from appearing to them. One of them, Thomas, was not with the others that day. Later, when they excitedly explained to Thomas that they had seen Jesus, he refused to believe them and made this statement, "unless I put my fingers into the holes in his hands and put my hand into his wounded side I will not believe."

What she found was those stressful things didn't change but she did. And she was more able to process the stress with more balance and peace because she wasn't also battling her own issues. She found it made a profound difference, including she no longer had depression.

The greatest part about what she experienced was starting to realize that God actually cared about her health too. That the Bible mentions honoring the body as the temple of God and that we are to take care of it and respect it. It actually says that its worship to respect the body as God's temple, for those that are believers.

She also found that this awareness helped her to stay focused to keep the weight off and stay on track with her new found care for her body and her health. This is surely important because once the motivation to lose the weight, wains down when you already accomplished that goal, some find themselves right back where they started because they have a hard time staying motivated to keep it up.

When you get healthy with the mindset about how it's actually worship to God and it honors Him, that can take your purpose in doing so to a whole different level. That is exactly what happened to me over 23 years ago, when I was convicted about how poorly I was taking care of my health and had no regard for the poor excuse of food I was choosing to eat.

Foundation of Caring Helps Improve the Mental Well-Being of People Who Are Visually Impaired and Blind

Recently, at the Lighthouse for the Visually Impaired and Blind (LVIB), a group of clients and instructors, all visually impaired or blind, met for the first session of LVIB's Leisure & Relaxation Program. This event, funded in part by the Florida Medical Clinic Foundation of Caring, was much anticipated as the pandemic continues to isolate and cause distress in a population that is already isolated by vision impairment and are at a higher risk of experiencing depression than people who are sighted.

The event kicked off with arts and crafts. As the participants painted napkin holders, they introduced themselves and relaxed. They talked about how the isolation of the pandemic was worse than losing their vision, how they spend most of their time alone, and how they really appreciate being together. Then, as the paint dried, they moved on to Bingo. The game started slowly, but once the participants got used to the large print bingo cards and the raised numbers and text, things got interesting. The winner confessed that she used to be an avid bingo-player before she lost her vision and playing with the group gave her so much satisfaction. After losing her vision, she thought she'd never play bingo again.

The need for the Leisure & Relaxation Program is considerable and there are no other programs like it. So many people who are visually impaired feel alone and they have access needs that are not usually met in the community. The population served by LVIB need large print, magnification, tactile embellishments, good lighting, and environments that are easy to navi-

gate. Also, many need help learning new skills so they can do things independently and that is what they get when they come to LVIB. The mission of LVIB is to educate, empower, and employ people who are visually impaired and blind. To meet our mission, we provide residents of Pasco, Hernando, and Citrus with no-cost vision rehabilitation and opportunities to maintain and increase independence. 
The Florida Medical Clinic Foundation of Caring (FMCFOC) is playing an important part in the Leisure & Relaxation Program. Access is being made possible through a FMCFOC grant that enabled LVIB to purchase accessible games and pocket-talkers. Since 2005, the Florida Medical Clinic Foundation of Caring has been dedicated to building healthy, safe, and vibrant neighborhoods by strategically re-investing locally through qualified grassroots nonprofit organizations in order to provide hope, opportunities, and solutions to those who need it most. Tax Collector Mike Fasano's Five Offices Delivered Checks to Local Schools in Support of the ABC Program





Tax Collector Mike Fasano's five offices featured Habitat for HumThis summer Tax Collector Mike Fasano's five offices collected funds and distributed checks to five schools identified as high need for their respective ABC (Assist, Believe & Care) Programs. The ABC Program was created to provide financial assistance to students and their families who are experiencing economic hardship, especially when those needs interfere with the student's ability to be academically successful. The cash donated goes into a fund that teachers can use when they see or learn of a need a child may have. In past years, this office has donated thousands of dollars to Pasco schools to support this important program.

"Life in general, the uncertainty that COVID brought to so many families and other factors have put economic pressure on many Pasco residents," comments Tax Collector Mike Fasano. "The strain can be enormous, especially when a parent loses a job, or a single parent is struggling to raise children while doing all they can to make ends meet. Children without food, adequate clothing or other unmet needs often suffer academically. The ABC Program was designed to help students and their families who are experiencing hardship or crisis. The assistance provided helps students get back on track and stay on track."

Managers and staff from all five tax collector locations in Pasco County delivered \$1,000 checks to a school identified as high need in the surrounding community. The five schools that

benefited from the program this year (and the tax office that assisted them) are: Rodney B. Cox Elementary (Dade City Office); West Zephyrhills Elementary (Wesley Chapel Office); Denham Oaks Elementary (Land O' Lakes); Chasco Elementary (New Port Richey) and Sunray Elementary (Gulf Harbors).

Hero To A Child was founded to ensure that the basic rights and needs of every child in the Guardian ad Litem program are met. They advocate for and support children, young adults, and families impacted by abuse and neglect by collaborating with community partners and the Guardian ad Litem staff and volunteers who support the children they serve.

The number of children in dependency care in Pinellas and Pasco counties has surged with an over 41% increase over the past 6 years making it the highest circuit in the entire state of Florida for children in the dependency system. In 2021, Hero To A Child responded to more than 4,000 individual needs requests for children right here in our community. In 2022 the needs requests have increased 60% from this time last year. The SuperHero 5K helps to raise community awareness for these children while raising funds to keep up with their increasing needs.

About The Event

The SuperHero 5K is a family-friendly, superhero-themed, chip-timed race that is perfect for all ages and abilities. Race day is Saturday, October 8, 2022, along the beautiful Safety Harbor, FL waterfront with festivities starting at 8:00am. Dress in your superhero-themed costume and come out to do good for children in foster care. Top age group finishers and the fastest overall awards will be presented.

The SuperHero 5K hopes to raise \$56,000 with this event to support to help meet the needs of each child in care and to recruit more Guardian ad Litem volunteers to be the voice of the child in court. A Guardian ad Litem is often the only form of consistency for children in the system and often the only voice solely vested in what is best for that individual child.

We continued on our way enjoying the old-world gift shops selling local artists' work, while heading to Castelo de S. Jorge (Saint George's Castle). The castle, dating back to the 10th and 11th centuries, was built high on a hill as an advantage during oncoming attacks. Eleven towers are still standing, including the Tower of the Keep, which was the most important and structurally sound tower, built to withstand a heavy attack. Major restorations began on the castle when it was declared a National Monument in 1910 and visitors can enjoy a tour of the castle and grounds.

Sanctuary of Christ the King

Later we hired a driver to venture out of Lisbon to Almada. High above the city is the Sanctuary of Christ the King. The Catholic monument was inspired by the statue of Rio de Janeiro, after the Cardinal Patriarch of Lisbon visited Brazil. The statue of Jesus with his outstretched arms atop a pedestal, faces Lisbon, overlooking the Tagus River, and the Abril Bridge, which resembles the Golden Gate bridge in San Francisco. Visitors can walk along the olive trees that surround the 361-foot monument and view the artwork throughout the park, while appreciating the beautiful view of the city and surrounding water.

wear as possible. I encourage everyone who is able to please stop by one of our offices and leave a donation. Every item will go to a Pasco student in need."



Inspired by Chinese porcelain, artists used blue and white when creating the tiles and the geometric styles and flower motifs are influenced by Arab cultures.

The Great Florida Outdoors: Lower Green Swamp Trail Dedication

On the morning of Saturday, September 17, 2022, I was honored to be part of the Lower Green Swamp Trail Dedication in Memory of Kent Bailey, our Sierra Club leader and environmental activist. Kent was honored for his leadership and achievement in the preservation of the Lower Green Swamp Nature Preserve, formerly known as Cone Ranch, which is now the largest

Hillsborough County environmental preserve. The Lower Green Swamp Nature Preserve is a 12,800-acre tract located at the northeast corner of Hillsborough County.

Back in 2009, Kent Bailey discovered that a group of six people had approached Hillsborough County about buying "Cone Ranch" which was then owned by the Hillsborough County utility department. The proposed purchasers offered to buy the land from the county and were planning to subdivide the property into six homesteads of 2000 acres each to use as private hunting preserves for the new owners. After Kent discovered the secret of the private hunting preserve plan, his outrage prompted him to reach out to others and form a collection of concerned citizens to save Cone Ranch.

Kent knew this was critical to protect because of its natural watershed which sits near the headwaters of the Hillsborough River, the prime source of drinking water for the city of Tampa. One of the morning's speakers during the dedication mentioned that the drinking water for the people of Hillsborough County is filtered here in this nature preserve after billions of gallons fall yearly on this fertile land and a portion eventually ends up in the Hillsborough River.

Enough public outcry was generated by Kent and his band of concerned citizens that the Board of County Commissioners appointed a study group to investigate the best way to handle the situation. The "Cone Ranch Advisory Panel" received input from the public and from the developers who wanted to purchase the property.

Conflicting information was provided to the panel as to whether the property could be transferred to ELAPP (the Environmental Lands Acquisition Protection Program) without

ELAPP paying for the land, although the county already owned it. Kent Bailey and the other citizen activists including current Commissioner Mariella Smith questioned the need for a sale and pointed the group in the direction of preservation.

From there the situation got even more convoluted. There was a statement that it could violate provisions of a bond issue that the utility department had in place and some stories that the land had been pledged as collateral for the bonds. But Kent's research turned up the fact that the county had pledged the accounts receivable from its utility accounts as collateral for the bonds and that the land itself was never part of the bond issue collateral. As one speaker noted, it was "smoke and mirrors and baloney."

In addition, it was stated that an appraisal of the land was required, which could have cost anywhere from \$150,000 to \$1 million, prior to transferring the property to ELAPP. Kent and

others persuaded the County Commissioners that this was totally not necessary.

The final decision was made at a County Commission meeting. Kent had rallied a crowd of concerned citizens who filled the County Commission Chambers, urging the commissioners to approve the transfer of the land so it could be forever preserved. In a 6-1 vote, the county commission approved the transfer to ELAPP, at no cost, in final confirmation of months of tireless work spearheaded by Kent Bailey.

One of the morning's speakers told all of us to look across the road from where we were standing. Directly across from the Preserve was land that looked similar to the Lower Green Swamp Nature Preserve where we stood. The speaker noted that the land across the road had been sold to developers to build 27,000 homes.


The dedication now stands as a testament to the countless hours of work that Kent Bailey and like-minded citizen activists utilized to forever preserve this land for future generations. We owe Kent Bailey and others our gratitude for their foresight and perseverance. It was stated that it was appropriate that the red trail will bear Kent's name since his face used to redden whenever he spoke passionately about stopping that "backroom deal" from happening to this beautiful land.

Take the time to complete a home safety evaluation this Crime Prevention Month. Ensure all the locks to exterior doors and windows of the home are functioning properly and clear from any debris. Don't forget to keep them locked at all times, too. Never leave a spare key near doors. Secure any outdoor items, such as grills, patio furniture or other valuable items, in a shed or a garage, to reduce the opportunity for theft or property damage. Check that fences and gate latches work well and are closed at all times. Keep your home and yard clean and tidy. Illuminate dark areas, and trim overgrown trees or shrubs that can create hiding spots for intruders.

Don't forget your 9 p.m. Routine each night to help eliminate opportunities for potential criminals! The 9 p.m. Routine is a daily habit of removing valuables from your car (don't forget truck beds, too), and locking car and home doors each night before heading to bed. When doors are locked and valuables are out of sight, criminals are more likely to move on. Take a moment to do a quick visual check of your surrounding area when conducting your 9 p.m. Routine. If you see something suspicious in your neighborhood, report it to law enforcement immediately.

PSO encourages citizens always to lock car doors, fully close car windows and safely secure keys when parking. Never leave keys inside a car, and be intentional when storing keys. Many cars with push-to-start don't require a criminal to find the key if it is hidden inside the car. If you leave a garage door opener in your car, ensuring your car doors are locked also keeps your home safe. Criminals can use your car's garage door opener to gain access to your home too. Don't forget to lock any connecting doors to your garage for extra security.

Stay alert and pay attention no matter how you commute to help keep our roadways safe. Drivers, bicyclists and pedestrians must follow the rules of the road and obey safety signals for everyone to stay safe. Prioritize your ability to see and be seen, and use the proper safety equipment to avoid injuries. Cross streets where drivers can readily see you, and remember not in between parked cars where disability is reduced. Drivers should use extra caution is residential areas, and never let distractions, such as phones, steer your attention away from the road.

Just like protecting your home, digital safety is important for your family too! PSO recommends parents and guardians talk with children about safe and appropriate behavior online. Predators can easily lie about their identity and motive for speaking with children online. As digital technology and the internet evolves, criminals are presented with new methods to commit cybercrime and scams. Recognizing a scam is the first step in preventing yourself from becoming a victim. If you receive a phone call you think may be a scam, hang up and call the number listed online for that business instead. Scammers will stress pressure to act immediately, and request specific payment methods. Reputable businesses won't request payment in the form of gift cards.

By taking a few simple steps and being cautious, you can prevent yourself from becoming a victim in a variety of crimes. Sharing these tips with your family and friends can keep Pasco County a safe place for all. This Crime Prevention Month, take time to evaluate your safety practices and help keep our communities safe.


