





The Great Florida Outdoors: God, Nature, and Writing

John Muir wrote about the spiritual and transcendent connection we find in nature:

Everything is flowing, going somewhere, animals and so-called lifeless rocks as well as water. Thus the snow flows fast or slow in grand beauty-making glaciers and avalanches; the air in majestic floods carrying minerals, plant leaves, seeds, spores, with streams of music and fragrance; water streams carrying rock... While the stars go streaming through space pulsed on and on forever like blood globules in Nature's warm heart. When we try to pick out anything by itself, we find it hitched to everything else in the universe.

My First Summer in the Sierra, 1911, page 110.

Muir wrote that when contemplating the mountains and the streams of the High Sierras he was "reminded that everything is flowing – going somewhere." As human beings we have the gift (or the curse) of a self-conscious mind. We understand our individual nature and often struggle with the direction of our lives and deciding which path we should take in life. The wisdom of these mountains and streams is that we are a part of a much larger natural world, constantly flowing and evolving.

Allowing yourself to be swept up in this flowing of natural energy is a religious experience. The crumbling mountains spires sheer off into alpine lakes, the lakes end in roaring streams, these rivers and streams carry sediment into the valleys, into the soil, up into the vegetation, and finally into the animals of the valley such as deer. Each organism plays its role and unconsciously feeds into a larger symphony of life.

It's a beautiful thing to believe in fate, a higher power or destiny for each one of us. It can be difficult to grasp but maybe there is some wisdom to allow your soul to become part of the pulsating blood flow of the Earth, of all creation. We marvel at the stars, perhaps because we look inward as we look out into the heavens—we are made of stardust. Muir writes, "Stars go streaming through space pulsed on like blood globules in Nature's warm heart."

Throughout history, theologians have taught that God wrote "two books"—the Bible and the book of nature. What they mean is that God has chosen to reveal himself through both the Bible and the natural world.

Have you ever thought of writing and writing about nature as a way to serve God? The holy ancients wrote down God's word according to his commandments and inspiration so that countless people after them could get to know God through the Bible.

A closer look into the Bible (Torah) reveals that God wrote: He wrote the Ten Commandments on stone tablets (Ex 34:1, Deut 10:2). God also commanded His chosen people to write His words on the doorposts of their own houses (Deut 6:6, 9), on large stones after entering the land

He wanted Israel to remember His words so that they would guide them in their faith journey. God even told Israel how they should write:

"And you shall write very plainly on the stones all the words of this law." (Deut 27:8)

God wanted His people to write down the commandments "very plainly", i.e., in a clear and simple manner, so that everyone could understand them.

In Psalm 19, David writes that "The heavens declare the glory of God, and the expanse proclaims the work of his hands. Day after day they pour out speech; night after night they communicate knowledge" (vs. 1) The 18th century Christian poet, William Blake, wrote about learning "To see a world in a grain of sand/and a heaven in a wildflower." In many ways, he's echoing David's call to give attention to the heavens and all that they declare about God.

Nature is both an enormous source of inspiration and a teacher that outlines God's character and how he has structured the world. This is why Job 12:7-9 says, "Ask the beasts, and they will teach you; the birds of the heavens, and they will tell you; or the bushes of the earth, and they will teach you; and the fish of the sea will declare to you. Who among all these does not know that the hand of the LORD has done this?"

These examples show that God places great emphasis on writing and nature because through writing and being in nature more people can learn and believe and be encouraged in their faith. And writing about any subject—including nature, arts, science and myriads of other topics can allow us to understand, enjoy, and experience God's wonderful creations.

I will finish with Rabbi Nachman of Bratslav's Prayer for Nature:

Grant me the ability to be alone; may it be my custom to go outdoors each day among the trees and grass—among all growing things and there may I be alone, and enter into prayer, to talk with the One to whom I belong. May I express there everything in my heart, and may all the foliage of the field—all grasses, trees, and plants—awake at my coming, to send the powers of their life into the words of my prayer so that my prayer and speech are made whole through the life and spirit of all growing things, which are made as one by their transcendent Source. May I then pour out the words of my heart before your Presence like water, O Lord, and lift up my hands to You in worship, on my behalf, and that of my children!

Where can you find God and Nature and be inspired to write?

Healing Begins with Jesus and Help from the Counselors at Boundless Hope

The name Boundless Hope came from Romans 15:13: "May the God of hope fill you will all joy and peace in believing, so that by the power of the Holy Spirit you may abound in hope."

"I think what makes us special is we are clinically trained and are steeped in the Word. We have a diverse staff in so many ways - single, married, young children, no children, grandchildren. Ethnically diverse. We worship among a variety of denominations, obviously very united in salvation theology," said Jolene.

The team has grown tremendously over the last few years. The goal has always been to diversify the dedicated team of professionals to serve the community with excellence. They truly work together as a team, spending a great deal of time each week in supervision, collaboration, and learning from one another.

Boundless Hope counselors treat patients as young as preschool all through to geriatric. Individuals, couples, family, and group counseling is available.

The counselors will use a variety of therapies to help their patients through the healing process. One such therapy is EMDR. EMDR stands for:

- Eye Movement- moving your eyes while you focus on an upsetting thought or memory. This engages both sides of your brain.
- Desensitization-Memories can continue to stimulate strong emotional responses and counseling seeks to reduce a person's emotional responsiveness to them.

• Reprocessing-"God made our brains with the ability to process positive and negative emotional experiences in a way that leads to our growth, not destruction. Under certain circumstances, this natural processing is interrupted, malfunctions, or our systems are overwhelmed." EMDR helps a person to reprocess past memories and redirect future behavior.

"One of the classic grounding or preparatory skills in EMDR is the container. The client, in an imaginary exercise, builds a container that holds any and all disturbances that have occurred in their life. Bi-lateral stimulation along with the facilitation of this exercise allows the client's brain to help the client feel the relief that comes from containing their distressing feelings, uncomfortable physical sensations, and unwanted thoughts," said Jolene.

Hi! I'm Harley, writer of the Kidz Korner newspaper column. American Heritage Girls, an organization I'm a member of, is made up of troops similar to Girl Scouts, but Christianbased. Being ten years old, I'm an Explorer, which includes ages 9-12. Our troop meets every Monday and each age level works on various skills to earn badges at the semi-annual Court of Awards to put on our uniforms.

Besides the Monday night meetings, our troop has many special events, such as camping and cookouts. Also, a multi-troop camp is held every summer in June in Leesburg, Florida, for a whole week of adventure and bliss! At camp, each girl earned four badges they chose, and everyone, ages 6 to 18, earned the Identity badge. My favorite badges earned



this year in AHG are Graphic Design and Textile Arts. All the Explorers earned Graphic Design with our leaders, studying elements of design and sketching in our notebooks.

I love the way the badge looks on the Explorers' dark blue vests. The sewn badge depicts a color wheel with a cursor on a light blue background. I earned Textile Arts with a few other girls of various ages at Camp Deep Waters, with a one-hour class every day for six days. We learned to quilt, dyed fabric and did a lot of researching in huge books and listening to the teacher.

One of my favorite parts of the class was collecting plants to use for dye. Another Explorer and I were sent out to find flowers and grass. We collected some grass, but it was dying, so it didn't create a vibrant green. We also found some small yellow flowers, which weren't enough to create an entire dye, and a lot of purplish-pink petals that were used for my piece of white fabric. We had to put petals into a huge glass jar halfway full of water, drop our color in, shake it, and let it settle. Mine created a tie-dye pattern of dark purple with some lighter splotches!

At Camp Deep Waters, there was also a gym where my friends and I would hang out, talk, and make up stories during free time. Sometimes I would buy an ice cream sandwich and a soda from the Snack Shack and sit down. So much happened in that one week. I hope to go next year, and the year after that, and every year!

AHG's theme this entire year was Shine, and during devotions on Mondays, we learned about how to shine the light of Jesus and be a light to others. In December, all the girls earned a patch to put on their vests to help us remember the theme and the year. The verse was Matthew 5: 14-16, which reads, "You are the light of the world. A town built on a hill cannot be hidden. Neither do people light a lamp and put it under a bowl. Instead, they put it on its stand, and it gives light to everyone in the house. In the same way, let your light shine before others, so that they may see your good deeds and glorify your Father in heaven."



When I mention heart health, what do you picture? Is it a hollow muscular organ that pumps the blood by rhythmic contraction and dilation? Or a red heart emoji? Or do you think of the feelings of love, compassion, appreciation, and connection?

 - The emotional "feeling" brain develops before the rational "thinking" brain
- \bullet The "heart brain" is composed of about 40,000 neurons which means the heart has its own nervous system
 - The heart sends more signals to the brain than vise-versa
 - \bullet The heart is a key modulator of pain

Reflexology works through the nervous system as there are over 7000 nerve endings in each foot. During a reflexology session, both the heart and brain reflexes are worked, which may help to balance these organs and their connection. As the body relaxes during the session, pain can be reduced, and emotions can be in balance.



Moringa encourages the removal of toxins through its support of liver and kidney function. When used environmentally, even the moringa seeds do an amazing job of removing contaminants from water.

Research shows that taking moringa powder every day, even 50 mg/kg of body weight, successfully reduces oxidative stress in the body—that's the equivalent of approximately 1.5 teaspoons for someone weighing 150 pounds on the other end of the spectrum.

Animal studies using Moringa oleifera extract revealed delayed tumor growth and increased life span at a dosage of 500 mg/kg of body weight. In a study using Moringa oleifera, Murraya koeingii and Curcuma longa (Ratio 6:3:1), obese patients on the herbal formula showed a 17% reduction in serum glucose, 16.43% reduction in triglycerides and 12.6% improvement in LDL/HDL ratios. Whatever amount you decide is right for you, the best results are achieved by using moringa regularly.

Plans for 2023?

I was reading in Proverbs 19:21 AMP. "Many plans are in a man's mind, but it is the Lord's purpose for Him that will stand (will be carried out)." I know how a new year at times brings on new outlooks and fresh

beginnings. So often we take on this idea that we will put the previous year behind us and start a new chapter in our lives.

Typically, this is how it goes—one gets all these new ideas about how to succeed where failure has happened in the past. Some may write down new resolutions and be filled with passion to begin, but then along comes February and desires have waned and so the cycle begins, until the next year. Has anyone done that? I know in times past I have been guilty as charged.

In Proverbs 19:2-3 AMP, it says, "Desire without knowledge is not good, and to be overhasty is to sin and miss the mark. The foolishness of man subverts his way (ruins his affairs); then his heart is resentful and frets against the Lord."

All these verses present a theme that we can have many ideas (plans) that come to our minds. We may even attempt to pursue those plans or resolutions. Unfortunately, however, without gathering the necessary knowledge we need to obtain about that pursuit, and impatiently rushing in to fulfil it, we risk failure and anger!

What has always surprised me about verse 3 is who gets blamed for the foolishness of this man subverting his own plan? The Lord!! Clearly the foolish man ruined his own plans by not taking time to get informed about his endeavors, counting the cost and being advised from the Lord.

I love what Proverbs 24:3 AMP says, "Through wisdom a house, a life, a home is built and by understanding it is established on a good foundation!" The Living Bible's translation says it this way: "Any enterprise is built by wise planning, becomes strong though common sense, and profits wonderfully by keeping abreast of the facts."

You may ask yourself, "What is it I keep doing that keeps me in a rut and thus failing, whether it be with resolutions, new endeavors, or relationships or lifestyle changes?" Maybe the problem is not taking time to plan properly, maybe the need is to acknowledge the Lord first.

Proverbs 3:6 AMP says, "In all your ways know, recognize, and acknowledge the Lord and He will direct and make straight and plain your paths." In addition, Proverbs 16:3 AMP says, "Roll your works upon the Lord (commit and trust them wholly to Him, and He will cause your thoughts to become agreeable to His will) and so shall your plans be established and succeed."

An anchor was a popular image in the ancient Mediterranean world. Because that economy depended on shipping, the anchor came to symbolize safety and steadiness. The writer of Hebrews used the word to remind believers that God has given a hope that holds firm in any storm. Hope is a healthy attitude. Anticipating good brings comfort to the mind and heart. In contrast, a state of hopelessness is a terrible condition in which to find oneself. It's overwhelming and depressing to think that what you're facing cannot be changed or resolved. For the person who has lost all hope, life looks like a long, dark tunnel going nowhere.

"Hope deferred makes the heart sick." (Proverbs 13:12) Emotional, physical, and even mental illness haunt a person who feels trapped in a bleak situation. But as long as there is a God, no situation is hopeless. In Him, we have the promise of the second half of that proverb: "Desire fulfilled is a tree of life."

Believers have a hope that anchors their soul. Our relationship with Jesus Christ brings us close to the throne of heaven, where we can cast all of our burdens before an omnipotent God. Jesus said to the Pharisees, "If you only love those who love you, why should you get credit for that?"



Be Cautious When Connecting Online

Safer Internet Day, held annually in February, raises awareness of online safety and dangers. Though the internet offers many benefits, it also creates opportunities for criminals to reach unsuspecting victims in new ways, using tricks which make crimes difficult to recognize. Education can help prevent internet scams and crimes. Pasco Sheriff's Office is sharing tips to help you stay safe when connecting online.

Protecting your personal information is one of the most effective ways to avoid online scams. Start by creating strong and unique passwords. Enable multi-factor authentication, if available, for extra protection. Encrypting your home Wi-Fi networks and adding a guest network adds extra security to hide your information from potential hackers. Conduct purchases from web addresses starting with "HTTPS" to ensure they're secure. Shut down your computer when not in use, to ensure no one can gain unauthorized access to it.

Be cautious of what you share when connecting online. Set all social media accounts to private, disable location sharing and limit what you share. Delete any old accounts you no longer use. Turn off geolocation to protect your location. Delay posting about travel plans until after returning home. Report fake accounts and inappropriate posts directly on the platform. When using public Wi-Fi, be cautious about logging into accounts with sensitive information, such as online banking sites.

Complete all available updates for your computers, operating systems and browsers. Use antivirus programs to detect malicious software and prevent damage to files or devices. Never open emails or attachments from someone you don't know or aren't expecting, and be especially cautious of forwarded attachments. Do not click on online advertisements, as these can be scams to gather your personal information. Recognize signs of email scams, such as a generic greeting, a notice that your account is on hold due to a billing problem or an invitation to click a link to update information. Legitimate companies will not email or text a link requesting payment information or demand specific payment forms, such as gift cards.

Parents and guardians can also help protect children from online dangers. Have open conversations frequently about responsible and respectful online behavior. Discuss how things posted online never truly disappear, as posts can be screen-shotted and manipulated. Encourage appropriate screen names, strong passwords and reporting inappropriate behavior online.

As the internet continues to create new opportunities, digital crimes will also continue to grow. Practicing internet safety can minimize risks while connecting online. If you believe you are a victim of a scam or fraud, contact law enforcement immediately. Reporting malicious online activity can help keep loved ones a little bit safer when online. This Safer Internet Day, follow these safety practices to stay safe when connecting online.

General Enrollment Period For Medicare Part B

If you did not apply for Medicare Part B (medical insurance) within three months before or after turning age 65, you have another chance each year during the General Enrollment Period. The period runs from January 1 to March 31 every year.

If you don't enroll in Part B when you're first eligible for it, you may have to pay a late enrollment penalty for as long as you have Part B coverage. Your monthly premium will increase 10% for each 12-month period that you were eligible for Part B but did not sign up for it. Your coverage starts the first day of the month after you sign up.
