Every March 17th, millions of people all over the world put on their best green attire to celebrate in honor of St. Patrick's Day. But who was St. Patrick? To start with, St. Patrick wasn't even Irish, and his real name given at birth was Maewyn Succat, throughout his childhood up until the time he was ordained as a priest. The beloved apostle was not born on the Emerald Isle, but that's about all we know for sure. St. Patrick was born around the end of the 4th century in England, a part of the Britain -Roman Empire.

His story, "The Leaves of the Clover", states that he was born in Bannavem Taberniae 386 AD, but you won't find that city anywhere on a Britain map today. Even though experts disagree about where he was born, it may have been in England, Scotland, or Wales.

But what is clear in the Declaration, which was allegedly written by Patrick himself, is that it is believed that he was born in Roman-Britain into a wealthy Roman-British family. His father, Calphurnius, was a deacon from a Roman family of high social standing. His mother, Conchessa, was a close relative of the great patron St. Martin of Tours. St. Patrick's grandfather, Pontius, was also a member of the clergy.



Giving Human Trafficking Victims Hope Through Bridging Freedom

While completing her master's degree, Laura Hamilton joined a U.S. Department of Justice funded task force for Tampa Bay on human trafficking. It was then that God placed on her heart to start Bridging Freedom for victims of human trafficking to give young girls recovered from child-sex trafficking a place to live and to help them along the path to healing.

There are currently two homes on over 100 acres in an undisclosed location. The two homes can provide shelter for 12 girls, ages 13-17. In an effort to provide a home for more girls, Bridging Freedom is partnering with Rotary Clubs and other donors to build a third house.

The girls may be runaways, fleeing from a dysfunctional home and end up as victims. The experienced staff will help the girls to understand what situations define human trafficking. Some are not even aware that they are a victim of it. Girls may remain in this safe haven for a year or more where they focus on healing from the physical, mental, and emotional trauma, and are filled with hope for a better life.

"It's a beautiful thing when you see that hope come to them, " said Laura.

With a high staff to child ratio, they are able to meet the needs of the girls. It can take 3 to 4 months just to stabilize a victim of human trafficking to begin their long road of recovery. The professional team includes therapists, nurse, educator, case manager, and residential caretakers that help her to begin to process all that she has been through.

In addition to health care, girls receive educational training, therapeutic interventions, such as equine, music, art, gardening therapies, survivor mentorship, life skills including balancing a budget and taking care of a car, career development, and transitional mentorship for the time when the girls are ready to leave the facility and start on their own.

The organization's tagline is "restoring stolen childhoods" and the staff accomplish this through counseling and helping the girls to feel special and loved with birthday parties, Christmas celebrations, and many recreational outings.

In addition to helping the victims, Bridging Freedom works with the community, focusing on awareness and prevention. The organization participates in events throughout the year, including Light Up the Night, where funds are raised for agencies that fight human trafficking, and support survivors.



If you would like to support Bridging Freedom, gift card donations are needed to enable the girls to go on various adventures, fun outings and shopping. Grocery store cards are welcome too. Health and nutrition are an important part of the recovery process on the road to living independent, healthy lives. The girls are taught nutrition and how to prepare well-balanced meals. January is National Human Trafficking Prevention Month. Knowing the signs of human trafficking can help get victims out of these situations and into help sooner. Pasco Sheriff's Office partners with the Pasco County Commission on Human Trafficking to prevent and respond to human trafficking cases. Everyone can play a vital role by recognizing common warning signs and reporting potential human trafficking activity.

The Florida Coalition Against Human Trafficking states that human trafficking involves the commercial exchange and exploitation of humans, including forced sexual acts, involuntary labor, servitude and debt bondage. A consistent aspect of human trafficking, regardless of form, is vulnerable victims. Victims also commonly have trafficking forced upon them. Sadly, victims may also stay in these situations out of fear or because they are under the control of someone else or don't have the resources needed to leave. Though victims can be men, women and children from any race, socioeconomic group or nationality, children are more likely to be trafficked by someone they know, rather than a stranger. Additionally, most traffickers groom for exploitation over time instead of kidnapping them.

It's important to understand and recognize common indicators of trafficking. Physical signs of trafficking can include evidence of violence or untreated wounds, exhaustion and malnour-ishment, addictions or even branding. Social and interpersonal signs can include being accompanied by a controlling individual, isolation from friends or family, little to no possessions, being severely underpaid or paid nothing at all for their work and not being in control of their money or personal documents, such as their driver's license. There can also be mental and emotional signs, such as low self-esteem, anxiety, depression, fearful behavior and not identifying as a victim of trafficking. Behavioral signs include individuals being submissive and nervous, avoiding eye contact with others, being afraid of law enforcement personnel and not being permitted to speak for themselves.

Rapid reporting of potential trafficking activity can help end human trafficking. The National Human Trafficking Hotline is a national, toll-free hotline, available 24 hours a day, 7 days a week and in over 200 languages. It's accessible by calling 1-888-373-7888. The Hotline is a safe space to report tips, seek services and ask for help. Discrete text message or online chat communication with the National Human Traffic Hotline is available by texting "BEFREE" (233733) or by visiting www.humantraffickinghotline.org online. Call the hotline to report tips, locate services, get help and learn about options available. All information provided is confidential and reporters can remain anonymous. To best protect victims and yourself never get directly involved in suspected trafficking activity; report it immediately instead.

Together, we can increase identification of warning signs to help reduce human trafficking and get services to survivors quicker. If you suspect human trafficking, report it to the National Human Trafficking Hotline or local law enforcement immediately.



Does Your Foot Supinate?

Supination is when your weight rolls onto the outer edge of the foot.

If you're wondering how to know if your foot supinates, look at the pair of shoes that you wear the most or the shoes that you walk in. Is there excessive wear on the outer edge of the shoe? Or step onto a surface with wet feet so you can see your footprint. If you have no arch or only a small part of your arch showing, then your feet are supinating.

When you supinate, excessive stress is placed on the ankle and may cause it to roll outward. In addition to pain in the foot, supination can cause pain in the knees, hips, back, and even structural issues. People who supinate too much are at greater risk of developing certain conditions and symptoms, including:

- Ankle pain, ankle sprains
- Plantar fasciitis
- Calluses or bunions on the outer edge of the foot
- Hammertoes or clawed toes
- Iliotibial band pain syndrome
- Pain in the ball of the foot
- Shin splints
- Swelling of the ankle or foot

• Weakness in the foot or ankle that gets worse when running, walking, or standing for long periods If supination is an issue for you, a gait analysis might be beneficial. Lightweight, flexible running shoes with a wide boxy toe can also offer support. Exercises that strengthen the inner calf muscles are also recommended. Physical therapy can help with this. And of course, add reflexology to the list of things to do to help overcome supination. Reflexology can help stretch the muscles, and address issues related to foot pain. Let me know if you have concerns about supination and we can discuss other tips and ideas for proper gait.

Here is a calf exercise that can help:

- Place hands on the wall
- Move one leg back, a few feet behind the other leg
- Keep both feet firmly on the ground
- Keeping the back leg straight, press that heel down, bend forward at the front knee
- There should be a stretch in the calf muscle and ankle of the back leg
- Hold for 30 seconds
- Repeat 3 times with each leg

Corsos for Heroes - Helping Veterans and First Responders Heal from Trauma



Harry, a former professional fighter, suffers from a traumatic brain injury brought on by years of fighting. He experienced firsthand how the dogs helped him cope with some of the challenges he goes through by keeping him calm and focused on the dogs.

"They are so comforting," said Harry.

A family member had been in the service for 20 years. After 10 years in retirement, he began experiencing Post Traumatic Stress Disorder ("PTSD"). God placed it on his heart for Harry to give him one of the puppies from the litter. Only a few months later, he got a call from the family member's wife saying he was doing so much better. It was amazing how quickly he began to heal from the trauma thanks to the Corso.

"These dogs save lives. They need you. They follow you all around and that is why they make great service dogs," said Harry.

You may see Harry, together with teammates Doreen and RL, in a 30-foot refurbished school bus they use to transport the dogs to events. The eye-catching bus is wrapped on one side with the six branches of the military and the other side is first responders.

The crew of Corsos for Heroes participates in events throughout the year. The most recent one was held on February 18, 2023 in Sanford Florida. Corsos for Heroes gave a presentation of the dogs to bring awareness to their ministry and donated their 30th dog to an individual. The event was sponsored by Seminole Harley, Veteran Enforcers Motorcycle Association (VEMA USA) and food was provided by Bikers Against Trafficking.

Once a puppy has been donated, Harry takes his ministry a step further by looking for non-profits in the owner's area to get the dog certified as a service dog. One such organization is in Brooksville, named K9 Partners for Patriots. Their services are free and Harry has trained seven dogs for the new owners.

At this time, Harry is the sole supporter and needs funding for the ministry. 


paign is to build up the medical fund which will help enhance the health, welfare, and environment of sheltered animals.

The Great Florida Outdoors: Nature and Writing, Part 1

"Nature never deceives us; it is always we who deceive ourselves." Jean Jacques Rousseau

Let us examine writing from a biological view. We are linked at times to external reality, often only by thin emotional umbilical cords weaved by uncertain societal standards of right and wrong. Perhaps the "rules of society" were taught at home, or at school by well-meaning teachers. But the laws of nature are true in and of themselves.

The writer presents a story from a

different perspective than anyone ever before. At that point the writer is most fully human. No one can duplicate this unique perception of life. The writer needs to reach a certain maturity to inform his or her writing.

A perspective of life is examined not by duplicating what has been done and said before but by looking for something new or examining the "every day" with original detail. The ability of the writer to describe a scene or event in a different and revealing way is the key to the "Aha!" experience of the reader, which is what the reader hopes for while turning every page.

The reader finds a revelation in the writing, perhaps the feeling that has been experienced before, but the new description makes it come even more alive. The writer allows the reader to enter a world with a whole new set of insights and feelings and awakened senses. The reader may have been in that very same circumstance as the writer but the writer somehow peels back the layers to reveal rich truths and insights. With his newfound gifts, the next time the reader encounters a similar experience, he or she may now be able to filter it through increasingly observant eyes.

Picture yourself as a writer sitting beside a beautiful, serene lake in the mountains with clouds shifting overhead on a wonderful day. You are the only one viewing the scene, and you have no chance of being interrupted. Most of all, your mind is clear. Thoughts enter from many sources,

rainbow reflections that flow smoothly into your head. The thoughts are like streams that nourish the enchanting water in front of you.

The lake requires a constant flow of water or the underbelly becomes still. Imagine this. Opportunistic plants arise to seize the nutrients of the decaying system in the lake as it turns into a swampy infested shadow.

Now look back at the lake with its crystal-clear water, free of destructive chemicals and impurities. You can hear



the flow of water rushing in from the small tributaries that fall from the mountains, tumbling into ever moving currents on the wind rippled lake. The constantly moving body of water draws you into a sense of peacefulness that is unmatched by any illusion of society.

You feel the water rush through you, purify your mind, and cleanse your soul. Thoughts enter again slowly, a jubilant celebration, luxurious cool rushes of pure human feelings and desires. The mysteries of nature, the bliss of full understanding of the moment captures your imagination. You are sitting peacefully, not thinking about anything else, just being in the moment.

You are always inextricably linked to the laws of nature, although, at these moments, they confront you more directly. You see nature face-to-face.

The reader's mind must be fertilized by the writer and the feedback helps the writer keep going. The hungry mind of the reader must be fertilized by the writer.

The novel, the short story, the essay, and the poem all learn from the lake. New and creative sources must flow into these seas of the soul and the high waters of the imagination.

Celebrating in Honor of St. Patrick's Day

Surprisingly, St. Patrick himself was not raised with a strong emphasis on religion. Education was not particularly stressed during his childhood, either. Even though the boy showed little or no interest in religion, soon all of that would change. Later

in life, this would become a source of embarrassment for St. Patrick, who in the early 440's would write in his book "The Confessio," "I blush and fear exceedingly to reveal my lack of education."

When Britian withdrew its allegience from Rome because of the fall of the west, a group of Irish pirate raiders began to raid Britain. Maewyn at the age of 16 was captured by Irish pirates who brought him to Ireland, where he was sold into slavery in Dalriada. His job there was to tend sheep.

As he mastered Milchu, he became a high priest of Druidism, a Pagan sect that ruled religious influence over Ireland. In viewing his enslavement as God's test of his faith during his six years of captivity, he became deeply devoted to Christianity through constant prayer. In a vision, he saw the children of Pagan Ireland reaching out their hands to him he grew increasingly determined to free the Irish from Druidism by converting them to Christianity.

The idea of escaping enslavement came to St. Patrick in a dream. A voice he believed to be God told him it was time to leave Ireland and that he would find passage on a ship where he could sail back home to England. Eager to see the dream materialize, St. Patrick convinced some sailors to let him board their ship to France. Lost for 28 days and covering about 200 miles of territory in the process, Maewyn at last was reunited with his family.



Now a free man, Maewyn never lost sight of his vision and could not forget the Ireland children reaching out to him. In another dream, an angel told him he must return to Ireland and help the people as a missionary. Maewyn then went to

Auxerre, France, where he studied and entered the priesthood under the guidance of the missionary St. Germain.

As time passed, Pope St. Celestine I consecrated Maewyn as St. Patrick, Bishop of the Irish, so Maewyn adopted the name St. Patrick as an ordained priest and headed back to Ireland through Pope St. Celestine. Spreading "The Good News," the Christian Gospel, to the pagans, where he was known as a prisoner, he wanted to convert a pagan Celtic culture from sun worship to Christianity. For those who worship the sun will get misfortune and will be punished for doing so. But for those who worship Christ, the true Son will be awarded.

Upon his arrival, Patrick was initially met with hostile resistance. The king and his warriors raced their chariots up to confront Patrick, and so begin a piece of magic worthy of Maewyn/St.Patrick. The Druid challenged St. Patrick, who called on God, flinging the Druid into the air to come smashing down on to the rocks. Then afterward, the King and warriors fled.

Patrick then appeared through a bolted door into the great hall of Tara. The Druid



offers him a poison drink, but the drink was frozen, and he poured the drink out. Patrick was then challenged to a dual of miracles. The Druid made it snow, and Patrick made it go away, saying that the Druid can only do evil but not good.

The Druid put his coat around his young follower and Patrick put his coat around him and went inside a twig hut and set it afire. The boy survived, but the Druid's coat burned up. The king declared it's better to believe and instantly converted.

Afterwards, St. Patrick quickly managed to spread Christian teachings far and wide, preaching, writing, performing countless baptisms, and convincing Pagan Druids that they were worshiping idols under a belief system that kept them enslaved.

By accepting Christianity, he told them, they would be elevated to "the people of the Lord and the sons of God." In his auobiography, "The Confession", he wrote about converting the Irish to Christianity. While building schools and monasteries along the north and west coast, he was determined to convert Ireland to Christianity.

One famous myth is how St. Patrick drove all the snakes from Ireland. The story symbolizes a metaphor of Patrick cleansing the Island of Paganism. Though there's just one problem. Ireland never had any snakes to begin with. The Emerald Isle is surrounded by water that was too frigid for snakes to migrate there, either from Britain or anywhere else.

According to another famous story, Patrick used the three leaves of the huge shamrock to explain the Holy Trinity of the Father, Son, and Spirit, so the Irish started wearing shamrocks on their clothing to signify their Irish Christian pride. That tradition later grew. Wearing green clothing is a popular St. Patrick's Day custom today.

Although shamrocks don't really exist, we know them as several three leaf plants such as wood sorrel, white clover, and yellow clover. This tradition of wearing green has become a popular Irish custom. This legend is possible, but Patrick never wrote about it.

For the next 40 years, he would travel far and wide to spread the Christian faith among the Celtic Pagan population, working miracles until his retirement to his first church.

The story of his death is an ultimate tale. Patrick requested to be taken to his beloved Armagh. Along the route, an angel appeared as in a burning bush, and a second angel requested that he return to Saul to receive his last request. As Patrick lay dying at the age of 121, the angel that visited him as a slave told him to have two untamed oxen carry his body on a cart, and where they stopped, he would be buried. Two towns claim his place of burial, but no one knows for sure but the two oxen.

You probably didn't know that St. Patrick's blue is still found in symbols of the state and is the color of the ribbon worn on the robes of the Knights of St. Patrick. However, the formal use of blue was first seen when Ireland was turned into a kingdom in 1542 under the reign of King Henry VIII.

Before that, Ireland was widely seen as being under the control of the Pope, who was happy to hand power to a Catholic monarch who agreed to uphold Catholic rule.

This came to an end when Henry, who was the Lord of Ireland at the time, split from Ca-



tholicism and set up his own Church of England, bringing Ireland with him and declaring it a separate kingdom. The formal creation of a new

kingdom meant Ireland was granted its own coat of arms, a golden harp

placed on a blue background.

England already used a dark blue, so a

lighter blue was used for the Order of St Patrick. Thanks to a mixture of truth and myth passed down through the centuries, he became the superhero in the Christian church of Irish pride.

March 2023

After St. Patrick died on March 17th, he was largely forgotten until mythology and legends grew. A century later, he was honored the patron saint of Ireland and the mythology surrounding his life has become ingrained in the Irish culture.

People in Ireland, since around the ninth or tenth century, have been observing the Roman Catholic feast day of St. Patrick.

So why does the holiday fall on March 17th? Supposedly, it's the day St. Patrick died. Since then, Irish Christians have marked the day as holy. Irish Catholics would close shops to honor the feast of St. Patrick, a time for celebrations.

Since St. Patrick's Day falls within Lent, which comes before Easter, the Catholics give up their vices as penitence. The feast of St. Patrick was the one-day reprieve when Irish men could down a pint or two of ale. Generally it would involve public parades and festivals wearing green attire and shamrocks as well as attending church services. The Lenten restrictions on eating and drinking alcohol are lifted for the day, which has encouraged anvd propagated the holiday's tradition of alcohol consumption.



But you probably didn't know that the first St. Patrick Day parade actually started in America. The parade tradition really took off after the Potato Famine hit Ireland in the 1840's, sending hundreds and thousands of Irish immigrants pouring into New York, Boston, and other American cities.

The first recorded St. Patrick Day Parade was in New York, 1762, when a group of Irish soldiers marched a few blocks to a tavern in lower Manhattan. Today, it's the largest and longest, with 200,000 participants and 3,000,000 spectators each year. So this March 17th, you may find yourself wearing green and toasting to some St. Patrick history we bet you didn't know!



Maritime Operations unit members keep boaters safe by checking for necessary safety equipment such as permits, lifejackets and fire extinguishers, and providing those enjoying Pasco's waterways with important safety information. Maritime Operations also includes PSO's Swift Water & Dive Recovery teams, which often assist in emergency situations and investigations, extending PSO's response below the water.

PSO has one of the largest K-9 units in Florida, and these hard-working K-9s offer a diverse skillset to best serve the citizens of Pasco County. The K-9 unit is comprised of handler and K-9 teams that work to track missing people, find drugs, explosives or accelerants, locate human remains and provide comfort to those in crisis. PSO K-9s train weekly throughout their careers to ensure their skills stay sharp and they're ready to work in any environment they may face. K-9s are vital to PSO and the citizens they serve, as they can perform tasks that humans cannot or that would take significant manpower and time to achieve a similar result. Additionally, PSO also has the ability to assist with large or remote brush fires from the air.

When faced with natural disasters, PSO is prepared to respond with the Deployable Emergency Response Team (DERT). DERT consists of specialty vehicles like high water rescue vehicles, a mobile kitchen, all-terrain vehicles and more to be able to serve communities affected by disasters or in areas left inaccessible by normal means. The team is also self-sustaining to not increase the burden on those they're serving. In addition to assisting Pasco County in times of need, DERT has also responded to other areas of Florida, most recently to Lee County in the wake of Hurricane Ian in 2022.

Members of PSO's specialty units are prepared for a variety of calls at any time of the day. These diverse units allow PSO to provide prompt response to keep Pasco County safe. PSO's specialty units expand PSO's capabilities to serve and expedite PSO's response to keep Pasco safe.

Nearly 55% of the people receiving Social Security benefits are women. Today, more women work, pay Social Security taxes, and earn credit toward monthly retirement income than at any other time in our nation's history.

Women also have longer average life expectancies than men and tend to live more years in retirement. This means women have a greater chance of exhausting other sources of income. It's important for women to plan early and wisely for retirement.

Our online booklet, Social Security: What Every Woman Should Know, found at www.ssa.gov/pubs/EN-05-10127.pdf, provides detailed information



about how life events can affect a woman's Social Security retirement benefits. These events may include marriage, death of a spouse, divorce, self-employment, and other life or career changes.

Your earnings history will determine future benefits, so we encourage you to verify that the information in your record is correct. You can create a personal my Social Security account at www.ssa.gov/myaccount to review your full earnings history. You can also view your Social Security Statement using your personal my Social Security account, to get estimates of future benefits and other important planning information.

If you find an error in your earnings record, it is important to get it corrected so you receive the benefits you earned when you retire. Our publication, How to Correct Your Social Security Earnings Record at www.ssa.gov/pubs/EN-05-10081.pdf, provides you with details on how to make a correction.




