His mother was incarcerated and the state urged her to have an abortion. She declined and chose to place her baby in the care of Bundles of Hope instead.



Gideons Are On a Mission to Spread God's Word

All Gideons uphold these core beliefs: The Bible is the inspired, infallible, inerrant Word of God and Lord Jesus Christ is the eternal Son of God.

The Gideons International is a ministry of Christian businessmen and women. You may have heard of them as the missionaries that leave Bibles in hotels. This practice began in 1899 when the organization was formed. Since many of the members were traveling men, they began witnessing in hotels. The Bible distribution has expanded to hospitals, businesses, universities, high schools, middle schools, and more. Since its inception, Gideons have distributed over 2.5 billion Bibles

It is important for Christian men and women to be continually strengthened in their faith. By serving the Lord together and sharing their testimonies with others, they are building on that foundation.

The Gideons International is trying to establish in all its members, for each man to be ready to do God's will at any time, at any place, and in any way that the Holy Spirit leads.

The organization is active in over 200 countries with over 200,000 members. To become a member, you must meet the following criteria:

1. be a member of a church

2. be a professional businessman or the wife of a businessman

3. be recommended by a pastor in your church.

Ron White has been a member for over 25 years. He partners with local churches in northern Hillsborough County. He and other members of the Gideons visit churches to bring awareness to their ministry and to provide reports on the number of Bibles distributed in the local community. Another way to connect with local churches is to hold pastor appreciation breakfasts. This is a time to fellowship with the pastors and their church members, while enjoying a delicious breakfast together.

At Idlewild Baptist Church, the Gideons were visiting and had a display of 40-50 Bibles in various languages. An Asian woman approached the table, and they were able to give her a Bible in her native language. How amazing is that?

Church members are often generous with their support of the ministry. The "love offering" goes to fund the purchase of more Bibles to distribute throughout communities to those who may not step inside a church. But, if a person is visiting the area and staying at a hotel, he/she may open the nightstand drawer, and there it is, ready and waiting to be read by God's divine appointment, and then taken by the guest if they choose - God's word.

In March 2023, Gideons held a Blitz Tampa event, where over one hundred Gideons from across Florida distributed 38,000 Bibles in the Tampa Bay area. The Bibles were handed out to people at hotels, hospitals, universities, high schools, and middle schools.

"Kids are going by 50 miles an hour, so you quickly hand them a New Testament, which consists of Psalms and Proverbs, and hope that they read it. But some do stop, and you get to engage in conversation," said Ron. The Gideons take that opportunity to plant the seed and let God do the rest. Two are better than one because they have a good return for their labor: If either of them falls down, one can help the other up. But pity anyone who falls and has no one to help them up. - Ecclesiastes 4:9-10

This verse reminds me of a time in my prior life as a restaurateur. I worked in an up-scale scratch recipe restaurant with a wide variety of employees from different backgrounds. I had in my employ, two brothers who spoke broken English as their second language. One brother had been there prior to my arrival and had convinced me to hire his younger brother. I agreed and had him train his younger brother. It took only a few weeks for the younger brother to become proficient. So much so that the two of them could work a busy lunch service without any other assistance.

This would usually require 3-4 employees, but the brothers worked so fluidly together I increased their wage and had them work together every day that they worked. We agreed that as long as they could handle the extra responsibilities, I would schedule them to come in and leave together. While they both worked well with everyone else on my staff, they did not produce nearly as efficient results as they did when they were together. They spoke the same language, knew what the other was doing all the time and could work in harmony with one another throughout the shift. They genuinely cared about the success of each other and therefore wanted to ensure the success of the restaurant, thereby ensuring the continuation of our arrangement.

I made it a point to learn as much Spanish as I could so that when we all worked together, I could speak to them in their native language. In turn they started to learn more English so that they could communicate with the rest of the staff more effectively.

In essence, each brother not only achieved more for our team, because they cared for their brother, but they also earned more for themselves and their families. I in turn, showed them that I cared about their success and was invested in it as well. We were a team that cared about each other and proved it through our work each day.

These two Christian brothers understood that God does not want anyone to work alone or live alone. Man was meant to work in conjunction with one another to achieve more and do so for his glory and do so with a joyful heart. I hope that everyone has an opportunity to be part of a successful team in their life. Be it a team at work, a sports team, or a successful marriage. We should all do our part to pick up our brother and look for those who have no brother to pick them up.





Jewish Veterans Donate to Liberty Manor




The Jewish War Veterans of the United States of America Albert Aronovitz Post #373

What's The Connection Between Water and Oxygen in The Body?

So how can you get an extra glass of water in today? Maybe try adding natural flavor such as: Fruit (raspberries, blueberries, lemon, orange, etc.)

Fresh herbs (mint, basil, rosemary, thyme, etc.)

Veggies (cucumber, tomato, ginger, celery, etc.)

Or a combo that can be simple or a bit more creative such as orange-fennel, pineapple-mintginger, blackberry-sage, etc.

Elder Abuse

Pasco Sheriff's Office wishes to educate citizens on the signs of physical, emotional and financial abuse that older adults face. Not only is it important to spot the signs of abuse, but ensuring older adults are aware of potential dangers they may face is crucial to helping your loved ones and neighbors.

Abuse rates related to the care and handling of older adults have increased since the COVID-19 pandemic. With physical abuse being most common through family members and caretakers, it is important to look for the signs of abuse that may be happening behind closed doors. Some signs to look out for include unexpected falls, sores, medication errors, malnutrition, frequent crying and agitation.

If you have a loved one in managed care, ask them questions about their care, be aware of what medications they're prescribed and when they're eating. Not only can abuse lead to physical harm, but it could also lead to long term psychological concerns. If you suspect that a loved one may be experiencing physical abuse, it is imperative to contact law enforcement.

Older adults are also more vulnerable to Internet scams. With the rise in new technology, scams have grown to be more apparent through everyday devices and platforms. It's become easier than ever to be exposed to scammers as social media and email platforms allow for quick and easy ways to access your personal information.

It is important to know the signs of what a scam may look like. An important rule to remember is that if it sounds too good to be true, it's most likely a scam. Common scams will try

to draw people in by announcing they won a prize or that they can make a large profit within a seemingly no-risk investment. Asking for cash payments, credit card information, or social security are immediate signs of a potential scammer.

Over the phone, older adults are commonly targeted when it comes to solicitation and technology support scams. Fake companies will attempt to gain personal information by announcing that there is an issue with their homes, technology and accounts. These scams can be quite convincing, often using personal information, such as their address or names of family members, which is often found through open public records and social media accounts. If you encounter one of these calls, the best option is to simply hang up.

Another scam that's become more frequent recently and is impacting the older adult population is rigged gaming machines. There has been an increase of deceitful slots and other gambling machines within local bars.

These operations purposefully make the winning odds of the machines close to zero which preys on those who sink their money into them. In order to prevent this, it is important to only go to gambling locations that are approved by the state of Florida. Playing at non-approved locations will put you at risk for financial loss.

Many older adults isolate themselves in their homes in fear of crime, as they are highly susceptible to theft. There are ways to prevent crime from both inside your home, as well as around your neighborhood. When at home, make sure to lock your doors and windows, don't open the door for strangers and don't advertise that you live alone. The Pasco Sheriff's Office encourages neighborhoods to stay alert in order to minimize crime opportunities.

Spreading awareness by being a good neighbor and reporting suspicious activity makes communities a safer place. Knowing the signs of abuse ultimately minimizes it from happening; educating friends and family on the matter also keeps your loved ones safe. This Elder Abuse Day, take time to spread safety messages to the older adults in your life.

The kingdom of darkness can best be described by the many ways the word "darkness" is defined in scripture – night, blindness, ignorance, ungodliness, immorality, misery, destruction, death, sorrow, wickedness. All of these conditions or actions give evidence to the work of those who are still in the kingdom of darkness. How should we, as believers, respond to these divisive efforts that would destroy our nation?

First we need to realize that the problem is not the darkness, but the absence of light. Light will always overcome the darkness.

Second, we can't resolve anything with those in darkness by using the same tactics. Blaming, name-calling, criticizing, condemning only brings greater division.

You can't blame a blind man for not seeing. If you try to reason with a blind man he will still be blind. You can yell at a deaf man but he still will not hear you.

We can blame the blind or we can address the darkness. Our struggle is not with people but against "the rulers of the darkness of this world" (Eph. 6:12). Jesus gave us authority to bind and to loose in earth what he has done in heaven (Mt. 18:18). You have been given authority to bind the darkness and loose those who have been kept in its captivity.

Last of all, we can walk in the flesh (Gal. 5:19-21) or we can demonstrate the fruit of the Spirit (Gal. 5:22,23). If we walk according to the flesh (criticizing, condemning, and blaming) we only bring more divide. If we give demonstration to the fruit of the Spirit (love, joy, peace, patience, gentleness, goodness, faith, meekness, self-control), then those in the dark can see a better way and taste the sweetness that is only found in the Kingdom of light.

Taking a stand for what is righteous and good is a privilege we should all exercise. Protesting injustice, demanding policy changes, and refusing to bow to tyranny and abuse are all characteristics that gave birth to our exceptional nation but killing, stealing, and destroying are the activities of a dark kingdom.

Let us not tolerate the abuses of darkness but let us "do all things without murmurings and disputing: that we may be blameless and harmless, the sons of God, without rebuke, in the midst of a crooked and perverse nation, among whom we shine as lights in the world" (Philippians 2:14,15).

Fourth of July – Bureaucracy of 1776 Started a Free Nation



Most American colonists were still loyal to King George up until the 1770s. But when England subjected her subjects to increased control over colonial affairs, it started a revolution. John Adams from Massachusetts and Thomas Jefferson were appointed two of the five-man committee to draft the Declaration of Independence. At the age of 32, Jefferson was the second youngest delegate at the Continental Congress. Nevertheless, John Adams acknowledged Jefferson's skills and reputation as a lawyer and writer, therefore Jefferson was appointed for the job. Over the next 17 days, Jefferson stayed in his rented Philadelphia room continuously writing and revising this document. The two men liked each other immediately, as Jefferson was a valuable friend. The Declaration outlined the colonies' desire for life, liberty, and the pursuit of happiness. But the real important thing about the document is the stuff we pretend to ignore, which is this long list of things that King George has done to the colonists, and is the actual reason why the revolution happened. It was an assumption at the time that Americans needed to do something, and put something in writing, an explanation of what we're doing. The King obstructed the administration of justice, imposing taxes without the colonists' consent, suspending our own registry and ordering armed troops among us. On Sunday, July 4, the Congress approved the Declaration of Independence.

The first Fourth of July celebration happened on July 8 when the document was publicly read in Philadelphia. The crowd reacted with bonfires, gunfire, and fireworks. This custom was borrowed from England, of all places, which is how subjects rang in their King's birthday; only in the colonies, they were celebrating the King's symbolic funeral.



relived the revolution by participating in the July 4 revelries.

Men commemorated the day by gathering in taverns to drink and argue over the new nation's leaders; it was purely an American custom to freely criticize the government. On the 50th anniversary, by eerie coincidence, both the Declaration's author and its editor, Thomas Jefferson and John Adams, died on July 4, 1826. Eventually, Americans looked at Independence Day not so much as a day of rebellion, but as a day to appreciate the rights bestowed on them. In 1870, as America was healing from the Civil War and African-Americans were freed from slavery,

Independence Day became a recognized holiday, but if federal workers wanted to spend the day picnicking, they did it without pay. That changed in 1938 when Congress voted to make Independence Day a legal holiday. Since then, the holiday has been celebrated in good times and in bad, in war and in peace. American communities rally together, all because of that small act of bureaucracy in 1776 that started a free nation.

Adjusting to Vision Loss for Improved Mental Health and Self–Esteem



The loss of vision is often a traumatic experience, exacerbated by other losses that can include independence, livelihood, and self-esteem. Successful adjustment to vision loss is often a continual process that involves developing adapted skills and maintaining them through periodic training and counseling.

Lighthouse provides an Adjustment to Vision Loss Program (AVL) to help adults and seniors who have vision impairment or blindness with accepting and adjusting to vision loss and improving self-esteem. The program, facilitated by Lighthouse Social Worker Nancy Branciforte, is based on "Passages" which is one of the programs used by practitioners in the field of vision impairment to help people adjust to a life without vision or with a vision impairment.

Lighthouse's AVL Program is provided in groups over 5 to 7 sessions. Activities are customized based on client strengths and weaknesses. Activities may include physical relaxation training, anger management, depression causes and treatments, personal growth and self-esteem exploration, and guided discussions provided specifically to increase self-awareness and to create a network of support. Kara came into the program when the pandemic intensified all of these feelings. By the end of the program, she demonstrated improvement despite her loneliness and isolation. And she knows she can reach out when she feels low or anxious and that there is no shame in asking for help.

Adjustment to Vision Loss is provided at no cost to our clients thanks to the generosity of our donors. In Pasco County, the program is funded in part by a U.S. Department of Housing & Urban Development Community Development Block Grant from Pasco County Board of County Commissioners, administered by the Community Development Department.


