TO HONOR

THE MEN AND WOMEN OF THE US ARMED FORCES

You probably know that on November 11th, Americans celebrate Veterans Day to honor the millions of the men and women who have served or are serving in the nation's armed forces. But did you know the whole story behind the holiday?

For starters, you probably didn't know it wasn't called Veterans Day, but Armistice Day, to commemorate the truce signed by the allies in Germany in World War 1 on the 11th hour, the 11th day, of the 11th month 1918. The first Armistice Day was celebrated in the U.S. on November 11, 1919.

All businesses were suspended for 2 minutes starting at 11:00am, and parades and public gatherings were held to commemorate the occasion. Later, Americans began honoring our unknown soldiers on Armistice Day, the tradition that continues today. At 11:00am every Veterans Day, a color guard ceremony represents all branches of the military, and the tomb of the unknown soldiers in Arlington National Cemetery.

In 1954, President Eisenhower officially changed the name to Veterans Day following a national campaign to have the day honoring all veterans, not just those who served in World War 1, and did you know for seven years Veterans Day was actually celebrated in October?

In 1968 Congress moved Veterans Day to the fourth Monday in October so the government employees could enjoy a long weekend. But in 1975, President Gerald Ford returned Veterans Day to November 11 due to the historical significance, and that's where it sits on a calendar today.

Did you know the difference between Memorial Day and Veterans Day? Both of them honor those men and women that served in the military, but Memorial Day honors America's war dead, while Veterans Day honors all American veterans living and dead. The U.S. census bureau estimates 21 million veterans living in the United States. More than 16 million of these served in a time of war. 5.5 million served during peacetime only. So this Veterans Day, don't forget to say thanks to some of the men and women that served our country.



Self-Control with Food Choices

Did you know it's actually a characteristic of following God to be able to have self-control? Some people say that "willpower doesn't work" but that's not the kind of thing I'm talking about. Galatians 5:22-23 talks about how a "fruit" of the Spirit is self-control. The word fruit in this scripture actually means a result or an effect of something. Chapter 5 talks about following God and walking in the ways of the Spirit instead of just following your flesh that has the cravings and desires. But that word self-control actually means in the Bible "to master oneself, to restrain, to have control over".

I don't know about you, but I struggled immensely with food and I had no self-control whatsoever. Until I learned that the Bible actually talks about having self-control and that it's an effect or result of following after God. That really gave me hope because I was such a food addict and overeater, I didn't know how to say no to unhealthy food.

I just thought if I had a craving for it, I had to eat it. But then I found when I overate, I was frustrated with how I felt afterwards and in the end, I was frustrated with my decision. There's a difference between something tasting good and making you feel physically not well because you either ate too much of it or it's just an unhealthy processed food that's not good for the body.

So it was really empowering to learn that you actually can have godly self-control over yourself and your cravings. You learn to not just jump on impulse with any food that is before you, you actually stop and think about it and make a decision based on what you want as a result of eating that food. Again, there's a big difference of eating something just for flavor compared to eating things that are going to help you be healthy, feel amazing, easily maintain your weight AND taste great. From working on this, I really learned how to respond to a trigger or stimulus with certain foods and CHOOSING what to eat based on the whole experience instead of just reacting on impulse.

This had a huge impact on my food choices and more easily being able to choose foods that I was not going to regret later. Again, I'm not talking about making a choice just on the flavor. I'm talking about the whole experience that it brings to the table because after the flavor is over, now you have to deal with the aftermath of what the food is doing to your body. And you learn to ask yourself if the effect of that food is what you really want, after the flavor is gone.

After going through these principles, I realized that I had a dysfunctional, unhealthy relationship with food, almost a love-hate relationship of loving the flavor but hating the result of what I was eating. It was when I worked on having a healthy relationship with food and choosing the foods based on the outcome I wanted, instead of just being impulse driven, that my food choices really started to change.

- **Physical benefits** include reducing depression symptoms, reducing blood pressure, improving sleep, making it easier to exercise, and overall improving physical health. And here are a few ideas that can help you to add more gratitude in your life:
- **Prayer**, focus on listing things you're grateful for as part of your prayer time.
- **Think about 5 things** that you're grateful for every day, either as you're waking up or right before you fall asleep: or better yet, both!
- **Journaling** is a great practice where you list 3 things that you're especially grateful for. Do this every day and you will notice less stress in your life.
- **Create a gratitude jar** and fill it as you write something you're grateful for on a piece of paper each day, or each time you walk by the jar. It's a great visual for all the good things in your life.
- **Write thank you cards** not just when someone does something or gives you a gift, but also just to say you are thankful they are in your life.



The Great Florida Outdoors: Bird Migration, Part One

I recently heard a keynote talk on Bird Migration by Stan Takiela at the Florida Birding & Nature Festival. As usual, I took copious notes as I do when I attend most talks. Stan also gave a talk the next day on Bird Nest that I attended and devoured.

I have been fascinated by this topic of bird migration for years and recently have taken a particular interest in swallow tail kites and other birds that establish homes in Florida prior to migrating enormous distances, often thousands of miles.

The Florida Birding & Nature Festival is an annual event that takes place in Apollo Beach, Florida. It is a four-day festival that offers a range of activities such as field and boat trips, expert seminars, keynote speakers, and a free nature expo.

Before I take on any writing task, a short essay or a 500 page book, I formulate questions that I want answered. With migration, I had boundless curiosity.

Why and when did migration first begin millions of years ago? How do the birds know when to push off and migrate? If all the species of one bird are spread out all over Florida, such as swallow tail kites, do they all leave at the same time? Do they join up? Do certain birds fly alone and others in massive groups? How many kinds of migrations are there?

Not all migration are the same. Complete migration is the one that most people think about when it comes to migration. It's a population of complete migrators where generally all the birds, go perhaps thousands of miles between summer and winter locations at certain predictable times each year. Examples include warblers and tanagers who fly some of the longest distances of any migrator. They are called Neotropical migratory birds because they migrate in the fall from northern states and Canada to spend the winter in the tropics of Central and South America. They make a long journey back to the north in the spring, where they nest and reproduce.

Short distance migrators, such as the eastern bluebird and the American robin generally migrate shorter distances, sometimes only a couple hundred miles.

Why do some birds stay put? Over many years of evolution many species of birds adapt to seasonal changes. They can survive both good and bad times and these non-migrators have physical traits that help these birds to stay and live in extreme weather conditions, traits not found in species that migrate. For example, non-migrators grow 2/3 more feathers during the fall molt than migrators. An example is the black capped chickadee.

There are some birds that exhibit what is called nomadic spontaneity such as the American goldfinch, also called the wild canary. Banding records are used to show that some of these winter in northern states and others enjoy the warmth of southern states; these birds stay wherever food is abundant and move on without any regard to the season.

Certain birds have a complete migration that is vertical. The dusky grouse, a chicken-like bird in the Rocky Mountains region, migrates up and down the mountains. During spring, it moves down to the breeding grounds, which are at low elevations. In the fall, it moves up into the mountains, to the coniferous forest at high elevations. This regular movement, representing up to thousands of feet of elevation change, is also regarded as complete migration.

What are some cues as to why birds migrate? There are internal and external cues.

External cues include changes to the amount of daylight, the availability of food and changes in the weather. They tip the bird off to when it's time to feed for the trip and later to fly and migrate.

Internal factors have a specific genetic aspect that can best be noted when you look at a species that has individuals living in different region. For example, the peregrine falcon that nests in the southern regions don't migrate. If they live in the far north, for example, the Alpine tundra, they migrate to spend the winter farther south, so they respond to these external factors along with their genetic programming,

Other species of birds, such as Orchard Orioles and Blooming Warblers leave for migration in the late summer, long before the weather changes, or before food becomes scarce. When there's still plenty of food, the birds leave their nesting grounds to head south for the winter, relying on a genetic type of internal or endogenous cue for migrating.

How birds navigate is still a great mystery. Although there are many theories that persist over the years, new studies and ideas have helped explain the complexity of bird navigation. More stories on bird migration will be covered in Part Two. Join me for the adventure.

And where can you see bird migration?



The Lighthouse for the Visually Impaired and Blind held its 8th Annual Dining in the Dark on Friday, October 13, 2023, at the Heritage Pines Country Club in Hudson. Guests experienced an interactive reception where they wore blindfolds while doing different activities at various stations. They also enjoyed a performance provided by The Two Tenors of Tampa Bay and a speech by Rhonda Warren, Lighthouse's newest board member.

Rhonda, who is also a Lighthouse client, explained how life was as she became a visually impaired person—from learning how to live independently to being looked over by paid drivers because she travels with a guide dog. She spoke about isolation and disappointment, and then developing confidence and independence at the Lighthouse. Her lasting message was and is that being visually impaired is not the end, but a beginning.

The main feature of Dining in the Dark was the interactive stations. At the dining station, blindfolded guests tried to decipher their food using their sense of touch, smell, and taste. At the technology station, they were given simulator glasses so they could try to read printed material using a video magnifier and they watched a demonstration of a person who is blind navigating an iPhone using access technology.

At the production and the craft stations, guests tried to pack batteries into boxes and make pumpkin crafts. But the most compelling activity was wearing a blindfold while walking with a white cane with one of Lighthouse's Orientation and Mobility instructors. Guests felt a range of emotions, such as excitement and fear while using a white cane and some said it was not for the faint of heart. All were glad to have taken the leap to learn about vision impairment.

Proceeds from Dining in the Dark are used to help the Lighthouse meet the need for programs and services provided to our clients and their families. Our sponsors included Publix Super Markets Charities, Roe Insurance, and Windsong Charters and Boat Rentals. In addition to sponsorships, funds were raised through ticket sales, a 50/50 chance drawing, and a Silent Auction. This October, the Lighthouse celebrates its 40th Anniversary. Lighthouse began serving babies and seniors in Pasco County in 1983, and now serves clients of all ages residing in Pasco, Hernando, and Citrus. Holiday Shopping Safety

As we enter one of the busiest shopping times of the year, it's important to take steps to keep safe while shopping. Being aware of your surroundings while shopping in person and considering your safety online can prevent you from becoming a victim this holiday season. These shopping safety tips from Pasco Sheriff's Office can help keep you and your purchases safe this season.

When heading out to shop in person, staying vigilant of what's going on around you can keep you and your items safe. Consider where you park by choosing a well-lit and highly visible spot. Remove your personal belongings when exiting your car and store any large packages out of sight in the trunk. Always lock your car doors, close windows and set an alarm, if possible. Be attentive when walking or driving in parking lots for everyone's safety. Shop with a buddy; thieves are less likely to target people in groups. When shopping with children, designate a place for them to meet you, such as a customer service counter, in the event you get separated, and make sure children know to ask a security guard or store employee for help.

Although gift cards offer flexibility, they also create ideal opportunities for scammers. Buy gift cards directly from the retailer and save the receipt. Carefully inspect gift cards and their packaging prior to purchase for signs of tampering. If a gift card appears damaged, notify a store representative and ask for a new card. Never buy gift cards from an auction or community website. Resale sites are often an outlet for stolen, fraudulent or already used gift cards.

Although online shopping is convenient, always think before you click too quickly to protect your personal information. Only use secure Wi-Fi networks for online purchases, as public Wi-Fi is usually unencrypted and therefore, much less secure for your personal information. Verify you're shopping on a secure and legitimate website; secure websites start with https://. Beware of phishing attacks. Don't click on pop-ups or open suspicious advertising emails. Using secure accounts with creative passwords can protect your account from hackers. Using credit cards for online purchases can offer enhanced fraud protection compared to other forms of payment; avoid using debit cards for online purchases.

Crimes of opportunity, such as package theft, often increase during this busy shopping season. If you know you will be away for a delivery, have packages delivered to a safe location such as an office, a package room or to a trusted neighbor who is home during the day. If it's available from a retailer, elect for free in-store delivery, order pick-up lockers or curbside pick-up for extra security that works with your schedule. If a package is stolen, notify the retailer and delivery company, and file a report with law enforcement.

As sales start appearing, don't let your valuables vanish. Taking extra precautions this holiday season goes a long way in ensuring that you, your loved ones and your property stay safe. Check out PSO's social media pages for the latest updates and safety information.

- Services—including requesting a replacement Social Security card, a benefit verification letter, proof of income, and more.

For Mobile Check-In Express to work, you must be at the Social Security office and have location services on. You should also make sure you're using the latest version of your internet browser. The service is most compatible with Safari, Google Chrome, Microsoft Edge, and Firefox. You'll also want to:

- Ensure you are in the office when your ticket number is called.
- Enable your mobile notifications. This will:
- Allow you to receive your electronic ticket – so you know your place in line.
- Alert you when we're ready to help you.
- Provide you with your interview location information.
- Invite you to participate in our feedback survey.






