



By the time we hit 65, 1 out of 6 of us will be suffering from some form of dementia (severe memory impairment). By the time we reach 85, the odds are almost 50%. The most prevalent form of dementia is Alzheimer's disease. For those families dealing with this, the holidays can be a particularly stressful time of the year.

Here's a brief sampling from one of the posts related to dementia:

- Don't feel compelled to hang onto established family traditions if they're are no longer practical. Be willing to substitute or start a new activity that may become a tradition.
- Familiarize friends and family with changes in behavior and appearance that they may notice in your loved one. Give them tips for communicating and how to watch for increased anxiety or situations that might cause frustration and methods for helping calm your loved one down.
 - Invite children to visit only briefly or hold events that are adults only.
 - Consider multiple small holiday meals with fewer people.
 - Make name tags for everyone attending.
- Celebrate early in the day to reduce the likelihood of "Sundowners Syndrome" (evening confusion).
- Keep the lights on to keep the room bright and the television off.

A Time Of Refreshing For American Missionaries



Time of Refreshing (TOR) is a unique, and amazing ministry that was founded by Dr. Bill and Emogene Kaiser in 1987. As they traveled through Europe, they saw the many needs of American missionaries who had left their family and friends to minister in many different nations. To go into a foreign country, learn a new language and culture, and live without family and friends close by can be challenging. Time of Refreshing was established to help serve the needs of these missionaries. A team of about 20 people from all over the United States come together to lavish gifts, prayer, time, love, and friendship to these missionaries. The goal is to give them a place to get alone with God, to relax and have fun without having to be concerned with ministry details.

The conference usually takes place somewhere in Europe. This year's conference was held in Leysin, Switzerland. The TOR conference starts with a beautiful banquet with a traditional American dinner. The following three days are filled times of praise and worship, teaching, and prayer, having meals together, and just relaxing in the beautiful Swiss Alps. These missionaries who give so much are lavished with gifts at every meeting and at end the conference a boutique is set up as a store where the missionaries can get whatever they want without any cost to them. Gifts brought by the team members supply the boutique with gifts of clothes, jewelry, cosmetics, tools, suitcases, American foods (peanut butter), and whatever the churches at home donate to bless these servants of God.

What amazing people these missionaries are with such humble hearts who have left comfort and convenience to fulfill the calling of God on their lives. At the end of the conference many testify that they were ready to quit because of the pressures of ministry but having been refreshed and encouraged are willing to continue their work. Some are pastors and church planters while

others are at work running safe houses for those escaping human trafficking. Others run schools and orphanages or work with people society has rejected and despised. They enter war zones taking food and medical supplies to those in crisis and help reestablish refugees fleeing unlivable circumstances.



Sugar-Free Cookie Recipes



One thing that comes with holidays is lots of tempting food around that's full of sugar. The challenge is, if you eat too much sugar it can suppress your immune system (so you get sick easier), makes you hungrier and crave it even more, so you eat more. And that all contributes to weight gain. Since I kicked my sugar habit over 9 years ago, I don't play around with those issues anymore, but I enjoy having some sweet tasting foods sometimes, especially during the holidays. Here is a

Delicious Chocolate Chip Cookies

Ingredients: 2/3 cup almond flour, 1 cup sugar-free sweetener (I like Pyure or Swerve, the best), 3 eggs (I prefer cage-free eggs), 8oz cream cheese (softened) & 2 tbs butter (softened), 1/4 t salt, 1/4 t vanilla, 1/2 t xantham gum, 1/2 t baking powder, 1 tablespoon coconut flour (if you can't get this, its optional to leave out – it will NOT make it taste like coconut), 1 tablespoon almond butter (optional, any nut butter will do but not required), 1 1/2 cups sugar-free chocolate chips of choice (Lily's Chocolate Chips are the best option and Publix sells this. If you can't find them get them on Amazon. Last choice would be Hershey's has a sugar free one sweetened with maltitol, however this sweetener is not my favorite option – found this at Wal-Mart and Publix.

Directions:

- Cream together butter, cream cheese, cashew butter and sweetener. Add in eggs one at a time, mixing well in between each.
 - Add remaining dry ingredients (except chocolate chips) and mix well
 - Add in chocolate chips
- Put the mix in the freezer to harden up a bit (10 minutes or so, roughly as long as it takes to heat the oven)
- Preheat oven to 350
- Spoon cookies onto lined baking sheet (about 1 tablespoon sized cookies) and bake for 20 minutes or until the top of the cookie is no longer moist and begins to brown on the raised parts.

When I made these, they still looked moist after 20 minutes, so I even cooked them 6 minutes longer and they still looked moist so I took them out anyway. They were done, they just don't "brown" on the top like other cookies. So do the test at 20 minutes of sticking a knife in it and if no dough sticks to it, it's done.




"I wrote this book so the hurts and mistakes in my life would not be wasted. God can use anything you have experienced... if you will let Him!" said Debbie.

Mt. Moriah Ranch is Helping Clients Heal Through Equine-Assisted Coaching

Even as a young child, Linsday Anderson dreamed of owning a ranch. She would tell her family and friends that one day she would have land with lots of horses. When she was 16, she was given the book "Hope Rising" by Kim Meeder. The story takes place on a ranch owned by a Christian family in Oregan, and it inspired her to start her own equine-assisted coaching ministry.

In 2013, Lindsay and her husband, KJ, were living in a small apartment above her in-laws' garage and God spoke to her and said, "You have to start something" even though they didn't have the land or horses. He placed in her heart the scripture in Genesis 22. She admits she struggled with this chapter in the Bible. Abraham takes his son, Isaac, to Mt. Moriah to sacrifice him because God told him to do so. His son had to be willing to do it as well because he was old enough that he could have run away from his father. But the two of them had so much trust in

God that they were willing to make whatever sacrifice was necessary to please the Lord. And then God provided the ram and spared Isaac.

"So, Abraham called that place the Lord will provide. And to this day it is said, 'On the mountain of the Lord it will be provided." Genesis $22:14\,\mathrm{NIV}$

So, their journey to establish Mt. Moriah Ranch began with the use of other people's horses. Later a horse named Dee-Dee was donated to them, and they embarked on the search to find a place to board her. God blessed them even more in that the owners would allow Lindsay and her team to continue their work as Mt. Moriah Ranch and even use their horses for the equine-assisted coaching.

Equine-assisted coaching has proven to be a valuable tool in the healing process. Horses have double or more mirror neurons. A mirror neuron is when someone yawns and you yawn too. Your friend's eyes tear up and so do yours. Horses will mimic you. A horse can hear a heartbeat 4 feet away and will synch their heartbeat to yours to connect the two of you.

One of the methods that has been very effective is when a child is scared about something, he/she may say the horse is scared. The coach can then work with the child through a series of questions. Why is the horse afraid? What can we do to help the horse not to be so afraid? The child can then use these tools when he/she is feeling afraid.

"It takes a very courageous person to walk the road of healing through trauma. You have to change your coping mechanisms. You have to train your brain, because trauma affects it so much," said Lindsay.

Two coaching programs offered at Mt. Moriah Ranch are Equine-Assisted Coaching and Relational Horsemanship.

Equine-Assisted Coaching:

The team of specialists at the ranch include an equine specialist, a coach, and a member of the horse team that teach a client through a series of techniques, including guiding a horse through an obstacle course. These interactive sessions build confidence in the client while focusing on build-

ing healthy relationships and communication.

People who can benefit from this program are dealing with depression, anxiety, grief, eating disorders, addictions, ADD/ADHD, PTSD, and may be recovering from emotional, physical, and sexual abuse. The client is required to meet with a counselor apart from the help he/she receives at Mt. Moriah Ranch to further promote healing.

Relational Horsemanship

This program is geared towards children. Some children in this program may be non-verbal and have physical challenges. Others may have experienced trauma and find it difficult to relate to and trust people.

The curriculum involves hands on interaction with a horse while learning about horse behavior. This helps clients in learning about themselves, building communication skills, and trust.

Having experienced childhood trauma in her younger years, she knew that she needed a place like Mt. Moriah Ranch. Now she uses the horses on the farm to share the love of Jesus Christ.

"True ultimate healing is really about our walk with Jesus and unhealed trauma can keep us from fulfilling the life God has planned for us," said Lindsay.

If you want to help Mt. Moriah Ranch to continue to serve our community, please consider becoming a monthly partner. Their immediate needs are for sustainability so that when they transition to their own property, they can hire more coaches and/or equine specialists. They are sustainable for their current size, but they have a waiting list now of clients needing help and need to grow before they can accept any more clients.





The Great Florida Outdoors: Bird Migration, Part 2 Dr. Robert Norman, Clinical Professor, Dermatology, Nova Southeastern University



One of the great long distance migrating birds is the red knot. It is a medium size shorebird that sports rusty, red breeding plumage, and a winter plumage of gray and white. After it breeds in a large area of the high Arctic, it migrates all the way down to the southern tip of South America for the winter.

The red knots make stops at Delaware Bay along the New Jersey coast to feed and rest. And many of these birds continue to the western side of Florida, where they spend the winter around the Gulf of

Mexico. I have seen these wonderful birds at Fort De Soto Park.

Others leave Delaware Bay to take a long flight over the Atlantic Ocean to reach the eastern coast of South America in Brazil. Here they feed and rest and continue on to South America's southern tip of Tierra del Fuego to spend the winter. They travel more than 9000 miles one way during migration.

On the return trip, red knots leave from their winter home all the way from Tierra del Fuego and thousands arrive in Delaware Bay during May. Many are starving and often half the weight they were when they departed. The arrival in Delaware Bay coincides with the annual horseshoe crabs spawning in the Bay. Red knots are dependent on horseshoe crab eggs.

The red knot — horseshoe crab interaction highlights the interdependence in nature. Red knot populations are decreasing, perhaps due to the decline of horseshoe crabs. Over the last 40 years red knots have gone from 82,000 birds to fewer than 30,000.

As the year reaches its end, bird migration reaches its peak. Some places see more birds than they did in spring. Florida may be the ideal place for birdwatching during the fall since it welcomes a large variety of migratory birds. (Bird Sphere)

Fall migration begins in late July and continues through winter as many birds either return to Florida or come to seek refuge from the harsh weather. Migratory birds in Florida include the Sandhill Crane, Cedar Waxwing, Anhinga, Semipalmated Sandpiper, Gull-Billed Tern, American Redstart, Swallow-Tailed Kite and Red-Eyed Vireo.

The Sandhill Crane is famous for its long neck and red beak. The species can be seen in Florida all year round. However, during the fall season, Florida hosts the Greater Sandhill Crane in huge numbers. The Greater Sandhill Crane is a larger subspecies of the Sandhill Crane. Up to 25,000 of them fly towards Florida to seek refuge in the winters. When you see them in flight, it is truly a mesmerizing sight. They fly in large flocks, and their distinct calling voices can be heard from over a mile.

Where can see these wonderful birds?

Stay Safe While Away From Home During The Holiday Season

Complete a home safety evaluation before leaving for a trip. Lock all exterior doors and windows and ensure each lock works properly. Check that fences and gate latches function well and are closed. If your home has a security system, confirm all devices work properly and are set while you're gone. Make sure security cameras are properly positioned and their lenses are clean. Ensure you also know how to access your security camera footage. Never leave a spare key near exterior doors, as criminals know common hiding places. Instead, ask a trusted neighbor or friend if you're able to store a spare key with them.

Making your home look "lived-in" while you're away can prevent you from becoming a victim of a crime of convenience. Use timers or smart devices to turn lights off and on at times you're typically at home. This can help deter criminals by creating the appearance you're home. Ask a trusted neighbor to retrieve mail and put out trash cans while you're away. Keep your yard tidy, ensuring plants near windows are well trimmed, which helps eliminate potential hiding places for criminals. Secure outdoor items in a shed or garage to reduce the opportunity for theft.

Don't forget packages or deliveries while you're gone. If possible, have deliveries scheduled for when someone is home to accept packages. Install a visible security camera to monitor where your deliveries are dropped off. If you cannot schedule a delivery, have shipments sent to a trusted neighbor, friend, office or a package room. Place a temporary hold through the post office to stop delivering mail until your return. If you have automatic deliveries, be sure to pause those while you're gone too.

Though you may be excited to share your travel plans with your friends and family on social media, keep in mind that potential criminals can use that information against you. Safeguard who sees what you share online by managing social media account privacy settings and restricting sharing abilities. Remove location tags and avoid "checking in" to locations on social media. Additionally, don't share travel activities, itineraries or locations on social media platforms before or during travel. Post your vacation photos after you return!

Taking extra precautions during the holiday season can go a long way in ensuring that your property stays safe while you're away. 

In 1659, the General Court of Massachusetts even went so far as making a law against decorating your home, which continued until the 19th century.

However, it was a different story in Europe. Queen Victoria and Prince Albert were illustrated in the London News standing around a Christmas tree with their children. It immediately became fashionable and people across Europe began to follow the tradition.

As Americans warmed to the idea, they began by decorating their trees with homemade ornaments. Brightly colored popcorn was strung with berries and nuts to adorn the trees. People of German descent would also use apples, nuts, and marzipan cookies.

With the invention of electricity, Christmas lights replaced the dangerous practice of lit candles on a Christmas tree, and it also allowed trees to be set up in town squares. The most well-known of these is in Rockefeller Center. The first tree adorning the New York City center was placed in 1931. It was not the spectacular tree of today, but just a small undecorated tree placed there by construction workers. A few years later another tree was placed there and this time with lights. Now the 100-foot tree in Rockefeller Center is decorated with over 25,000 Christmas lights!

There is nothing like the fragrance from a real evergreen tree in your home. But the mess and difficulty of disposal are the reason many prefer an artificial Christmas tree. Artificial trees are not really a new invention. As early as the 19th century, Germans had "trees" made of dyed goose feathers in an effort to preserve their forests.

In the 1930s, some Americans had trees made from brush bristles, but it wasn't until the 50s and 60s that the white and gold aluminum and plastic trees gained in popularity. Artificial trees made nowadays are more natural looking, with soft green bristles, and integrated lights to ease the assembly and set up. Simply decorate with your favorite ornaments and you have a beautiful tree to place your presents under.

So, as you decorate your tree this year, whether it is artificial or a fragrant evergreen, remember the real reason for celebrating the season - Jesus Christ, our Lord and Savior, the light of




