Tax Collector Receives 2023 National Animal Care and Control Association's Bill Lehman Memorial Award





Pasco Board of County Commissioners' resolution presentation & Mike Fasano and his dog Seaver

On January 23, 2024, the Pasco Board of County Commissioners adopted a resolution honoring Pasco Tax Collector Mike Fasano for receiving the "2023 National Animal Care and Control Association's Bill Lehman Memorial Award." In a presentation ceremony at the county commission chambers in New Port Richey, Tax Collector Mike Fasano was given the resolution by the county commission as well as the national award by Pasco's Director of Animal Services Mike Shumate.

The resolution lists many of his accomplishments in the field of animal welfare and protection including legislation he filed as a State Senator known as "Dexter's Law," which would have created a statewide animal abuse registry. While this bill did not pass, Pasco County and several other counties in Florida based their own registries on the language in Tax Collector Mike Fasano's legislation. Additionally, the resolution mentions fundraisers held at the Pasco Tax Collector's Office to support Pasco County's Animal Services department.

In addition to county run programs, Tax Collector Mike Fasano's charitable giving arm Pasco TC Gives has raised for and donated to over two-hundred thousand dollars to such diverse animal services organizations as the Pasco Sheriff's K-9 Foundation, the Humane Society of Pasco County, the SPCA of the Suncoast, Southeastern Guide Dogs, Cindy's Pets, CARES Pet Project and the Runaways Animal Shelter.

"I was honored to be given the 2023 National Animal Care and Control Association's Bill Lehman Memorial Award," commented Tax Collector Mike Fasano following receipt of the award and resolution. "I accepted this National Award on behalf of all our employees at the Pasco Tax Collectors Office. Through their help, we have raised over \$200,000 to help Pasco's animals and their owners along with encouraging adoption and spreading public awareness of shelter and animal welfare initiatives."

An Amazing View of Mt. Rushmore in Honor of President's Day By Karen McBride



Nestled in the Black Hills of South Dakota lie 60-foot replicas of George Washington, Thomas Jefferson, Theodore Roosevelt, and Abraham Lincoln. Mt. Rushmore National Memorial is a tribute to our founding fathers and past presidents. It is an incredible experience to see the majestic profiles of our former presidents engraved in stone.

The Bible teaches us the importance of praying for our leaders

1 Timothy 2:1-2 (NIV): Pray for those in authority

"I urge, then, first of all, that petitions, prayers, intercession and thanksgiving be made for all people — for kings and all those in authority, that we may live peaceful and quiet lives in all godliness and holiness."

As we celebrate President's Day this year on February 19, please pray for our leaders both present and future. Take a moment to remember the brave people who have served our country, establishing it with a foundation in God.

Here is a little about the four men who have made such a significant impact on our country that their likenesses have been engraved in remembrance.

George Washington, the first President of the United States, led the colonists in the American Revolutionary War to gain independence from Great Britain.

Thomas Jefferson, author of the Declaration of Independence and third President of the United States. He also purchased the Louisiana Territory from France in 1803, which doubled the size of our country at the time.

Theodore Roosevelt was the 26th President of the United States. A few of his great accomplishments included negotiating the construction of the Panama Canal which linked the east and the west. He also worked to end large corporate monopolies and ensure the rights of the common working man. As an outdoorsman and conservationist, he preserved parks, forests, and wildlife. Abraham Lincoln led the country through the Civil War. As the 16th President of the United States, his greatest accomplishment for the betterment of our society is the part he played to end slavery.

The Artist Behind the Design

Sculptor Gutzon Borglum's artistic career began early in life when he painted a portrait of General John C. Fremont which gained him recognition and acclaim. He later moved to France and travelled throughout Europe honing his craft at the Julien Academy and the Ecole des Beaux-Arts.

When his interests turned to sculpting in bronze and marble, he created a bust of Abraham Lincoln. The artwork was displayed in a store window in New York where it was later purchased and donated to the people of the United States. It is displayed in the Capitol Building to this day.

Helen Plane, President of the United Daughters of the Confederacy saw the sculpture and contacted Borglum about creating the head of Robert E. Lee on the side of Stone Mountain in Georgia. His artistic mind saw that a single-person profile was much too small for such a large canvas, so he drew a large group including Lee, Stonewall Jackson, and Jefferson Davis on horseback followed by a column of soldiers.

The work on Stone Mountain was delayed due to World War I. Unfortunately, Borglum and the businessmen directing the project did not see eye to eye and he was dismissed from the project.

But this setback led him to Doane Robinson, State Historian of South Dakota. She contacted him about providing his artistic vision to a mountain carving in the Black Hills. Work began on Mt. Rushmore in 1927. Borglum remained with the project until his death in 1941, and then his son, Lincoln, carried on his father's vision to completion in 1943.

Mt. Rushmore is located at 13000 Highway 244, Building 31, Suite 1, Keystone, SD 57751. Weather permitting, the grounds at Mount Rushmore are open every day of the year. The Information Center, Visitor Center, Gift Shop and Carvers' Cafe are open every day except December 25th. The hours may vary, so be sure to check the website before you go



The kiosk is available to the public during store hours.

Vehicle registration renewals are the only transaction the kiosk is currently designed to complete, saving customers a visit to their local tax collector's office. If you are interested in renewing your vehicle's registration at the kiosk you must bring the following information with you:

- · PIN from registration renewal notice or license plate number and first Registrant's date of birth.
- Registrations in a business name can only be renewed with the PIN since there is not a date of birth linked to the record.
- Accepted form of payment: American Express, Discover, Mastercard, & Visa. **Debit/Credit Card ONLY*

The new registration and decal will be printed at the kiosk once the customer has entered their information. If there is a driver license stop, toll stop, or insurance stop, the customer will receive a message from the kiosk. If the kiosk is unable to process the transaction and the registration is not able to be issued, the kiosk will notify the customer.

The kiosk charges a 2.3% fee for use of a credit card AND a \$3.95 flat fee for renewing at the kiosk. Customers can still make a voluntary donation to one of the many authorized charities just as they are listed on the back of the renewal notice. The kiosk does ask the customer to verify the vehicle and plate they are renewing as well as the fees before the transaction is completed. It also asks the customer if there are any address changes, if they answe yes, the transaction cannot be completed. If they answer no, it continues. If the registration qualifies, the kiosk does offer a 1-year or 2-year renewal to the customer.

If a customer has a question or problem, they may contact the Kiosk Customer Care Number which is: 1-833-939-1572.

"It is our hope that for those interested in using this service," comments Tax Collector Mike Fasano, "that the kiosk will prove to be an easy and efficient way to complete this necessary task in a quick and convenient manner

IMPORTANT: The following registrations are NOT eligible to be renewed at the kiosk:

· Registration renewals that require an address change

· Registration renewals that replace a license plate.

A Little About the History of Mt. Dora



Lake Dora was named after Dora Ann Drawdy, who lived in the area in the mid-1800's. Her warm and welcoming attitude was bestowed on the local surveyors, and they named the lake after her. The town was later named Mt. Dora (after the lake). The term "mount" refers to the fact that the town rests upon a plateau that is 184 feet above sea level, which is a mountain according to most Floridians!

As a popular destination for hunters, fishermen, and boaters, the town had a need for a hotel. The Alexander House, now called The Lakeside Inn, was opened in 1883. Famous visitors included Presidents Coolidge and Eisenhower, Thomas Edison, and Henry Ford.

Lunch at the Lakeside Inn

The Lakeside Inn, with its beautiful waterfront views and large canopy oak trees is the perfect getaway spot for couples and families. The porch is lined with rocking chairs overlooking the lake and is a favorite spot among the guests for meals throughout the day.

The restaurant within the Lakeside Inn has the most delicious chicken pot pie. The light and flaky crust and fresh chicken and vegetables make it an excellent choice on a chilly day.

Other options include Strawberry Spinach Salad, Lakeside Tomato Pie, Monte Cristo Sandwich, and more. The dinner menu offers a variety of delectable choices including blackened snapper, barbecued pork chops, slow roasted beef brisket, and Lakeside Chicken Florentine.

The Donnelly House

In addition to the Lakeside Inn, Mt. Dora embraces its old-world charm with other buildings from the past, including the Donnelly House, which was built in 1893. John P. Donnelly built the Queen Ann style house for his wife Annie. The elaborately carved woodwork is representative of Steamboat Gothic architecture. You do not see this type of work in newly constructed homes anymore, and tours are available.

Mt. Dora Has Something for Everyone to Enjoy





"Don't just listen to the Word of Truth and not respond to it, for that is the essence of self-deception. So always let his Word become like poetry written and fulfilled by your life! If you listen to the Word and don't live out the message you hear, you become like the person who looks in the mirror of the Word to discover the reflection of his face in the beginning. You perceive how God sees you in the mirror of the Word, but then you go out and forget your divine origin."

Here the Apostle James is showing us that when we look into the Word of God it is like look ing into a mirror and the reflection we see is how God sees us. Many people think that God looks on them with great disapproval and is always pointing out the things that are not yet right with them. General Enrollment Period For Medicare Part B By Javier Morales, Social Security Public Affairs in South Florida



If you did not apply for Medicare Part B (medical insurance) within three months before or after turning age 65, you have another chance each year during the General Enrollment Period. The period runs from January 1 to March 31 every year.

If you don't enroll in Part B when you're first eligible for it, you may have to pay a late enrollment penalty for as long as you have Part B coverage. Your monthly premium will increase 10% for each 12-month period that you were eligible for Part B but did not sign up for it. Your coverage starts the first day of the month after you sign up.

Religion or Reality? Are You A Fan or a Follower?

I was reading a book the other day and came across the following statement: "So the way of Jesus is not about religion; it's about reality." I know that is a simple statement. One I've seen before. But this time when I read it, it seemed to explode in my mind and heart.

Jesus said, in John 14:6, "I am the way, the truth, and the life." When he said this, he wasn't comparing various religions, but talking about life. He was saying, "Look at me! My life is the truth. This is the way you should be living. This is what life was meant to be." He wasn't comparing his "way" with another "way." He was comparing his life with our lives. He was saying your life and my life could be like this. This is life as the Father intended.

Somehow, we have turned Jesus' teachings into a religion and it has stopped being reality. It has become another part of our lives (something we add to what we do). It no longer redefines our lives (changing everything we perceive and how we react to life around us). A discussion about Jesus' life and teachings is not a philosophical discussion comparing the pros and cons of a belief system. Instead, it is a discussion about what is real, what is true, and about what is important in how to live our lives.

This is what it means to be "a follower of Christ." It is allowing His life to become the pattern for our lives. A follower looks at how Jesus lived life, then tries to live the same way. It changes everything about us: how we see ourselves, how we respond to others, how we determine the priorities of our lives. His way becomes our way. His truth becomes our truth. And his life becomes our life. Following Christ means everything to us or it means nothing.

Either Jesus' life demonstrated reality or it did not. If it did, then we must decide if we are willing to base our life on his. Do we see our following Christ as a religious choice or as a decision on what is the reality of life? There is a big difference between the two. Ask yourself today: "Has Jesus become a religion for me or does he define reality for me?" This is an important question. Even more important is your response.

The Great Florida Outdoors: Fox Squirrel Dr. Robert Norman, Clinical Professor, Dermatology, Nova Southeastern University



I was biking through J. B. Starkey Wilderness Park along a stretch of longleaf pines recently and saw a fast moving creature bounding up a tree. With an extra long tail, I was not sure what I had just witnessed. About a mile later I saw another similar species and stopped to take a video. I suspected it was a fox squirrel, although I had rarely seen one in the wild. After I studied the video and investigated, my suspicion was correct.

The fox squirrel, also known as the eastern fox squirrel or Bryant's fox squirrel, is the largest species of tree squirrel native to North America. In Florida they are often named the southern fox squirrel. Fox squirrels are larger and heavier than gray squirrels.

It can reach a length up to 27.6 inches and a weight between one to three pounds. This species has an overall color that varies from black to brown with a black head, white ears, and a white snout. Fox squirrels are known for their long bushy tails and their strong hind legs which enables them to leap far.

Behavior

Fox squirrels are strictly diurnal, non-territorial, and spend more of their time on the ground than most other tree squirrels. They are still, however, agile climbers.

They construct two types of homes called "dreys", depending on the season. Summer dreys are often little more than platforms of sticks high in the branches of trees, while winter dens are usually hollowed out of tree trunks by a succession of occupants over as many as 30 years. Cohabitation of these dens is not uncommon, particularly among breeding pairs. The southern fox squirrel typically has two breeding seasons each year. The winter breeding season is from October to February and the summer breeding season is from April to August. Most nests are made of Spanish moss, pine needles, twigs, and leaves, while a few nests are made within tree cavities. Females average one litter per year with an average of 2.3 offspring per litter. Young are weaned at 90 days and sexual maturity is reached at about nine months.

The diet of southern fox squirrel primarily consists of longleaf pine seeds and turkey oak acorns, but they will also eat fungi, fruit, and buds. Fox squirrels will form caches by burying food items for later consumption. They like to store foods that are shelled and high in fat, such as acorns and nuts. Shelled foods are favored because they are less likely to spoil than non-shelled foods, and fatty foods are valued for their high energy density.

Fox squirrels are most abundant in open forest stands with little understory vegetation and are not found in stands with dense undergrowth. Ideal habitat is small stands of large trees interspersed with agricultural land. The size and spacing of pines and oaks are among the important features of fox squirrel habitat. The actual species of pines and oaks themselves may not always be a major consideration in defining fox squirrel habitat. Fox squirrels are often observed foraging on the ground several hundred meters from the nearest woodlot. Fox squirrels also commonly occupy forest edge habitat.

Threats

The main threat to the southern fox squirrel population is the destruction of their habitats. Habitat loss has been significant as it is estimated that only 10-20% of original southern fox squirrel native habitat is still intact, most of it having been logged, converted to pasture, degraded by lack of fire, or used for agriculture, commercial and residential development. Improperly burned longleaf pine communities also affect the fox squirrel's population as it prevents longleaf pine seeds from properly reproducing in the bare ground. This species also has an increased chance of getting hit by a vehicle due to their typically slow gait (locomotion).





Our first Soursop tree came from Citrus Park nursery.


