

David desired her and sent a messenger to bring her to the palace. The result of this adulterous affair was revealed to David by a note Bathsheba sent to the king. She was pregnant and her husband had been with the armies of Israel for months.

King David then put into motion a plan to cover up the affair. He sent word to Joab, the commander of his army, for Uriah, Bathsheba's husband, to return home immediately. Upon his arrival, David honored Uriah and commended him for his service and sent him home to be with his wife. Instead, Uriah slept in the barracks near the palace. When David's servants told him that Uriah had not gone home, the king summoned him and asked why he had not gone to his home after such a long journey.

Uriah said to the king, that it would not be right for him to go home when his commander and fellow soldiers were camped in the open field and engaged in battle. When David was convinced that Uriah was not going to go home, he gave him a sealed message for Joab and sent him back to the battle. The Power of Truth

In the Book of Psalms, King had a pet lamb that was greatly loved by him and his children. The poor man's neighbor was very rich and had many flocks. One day a friend visited the rich man. When he prepared a meal for his visitor, he stole the pet lamb from the poor man instead of taking one from his own flock. When king David heard of this injustice, he pronounced a judgment against the rich man, saying, "the man who has done this deserves to die, and he shall restore the lamb four-David knew what he was talking about because he had just experienced the fold, because he did this thing, and because he had no pity." (2 Sam. 12:5). The prophet then said to David, "You are the man."

> David's lies to conceal his sin were discovered, resulting in the judgment he himself had determined. The prophet said, "The sword shall never depart from your house." (2 Sam. 12:10). Sadly, four of David's children died.

> In the Book of Proverbs it says, "He that covers his sins shall not prosper; but whoso confesses and forsakes them shall have mercy." (Pr. 28:13) I wonder what might have been if David had gone to God with his sin instead of lying about it. Could he have avoided judgment and found forgiveness and mercy instead?

> If we are walking in truth, then there is no place for things to hide in the dark. Give the devil "no place" (Eph. 4:27). Anything we attempt to hide will be the very thing that brings our ruin. Most people confess their wrongs if caught red-handed, but how sincere is their sorrow? Two Army Veterans Receive Companions from Corsos for Heroes

Recently two army veterans were blessed with receiving canine companions from Corsos for Heroes. Harry Toro began the service dog ministry over ten years ago and has been helping veterans and first responders heal from the trauma experienced in the line of duty.

Harry, a former professional fighter, suffers from a traumatic brain injury brought on by years of fighting. He experienced firsthand how the dogs helped him cope with some of the challeng-



es he goes through by keeping him calm and focused on the dogs. He knew he wanted to help others suffering from similar maladies and began Corsos for Heroes.

Galatians 6:2: "Carry each other's burdens, and in this way you will fulfill the law of Christ." Shortly thereafter, a family member began experiencing Post Traumatic Stress Disorder ("PTSD"). God placed it on his heart for Harry to give him one of the puppies from a recent litter. Only a few months later, he got a call from the family member's wife saying he was doing so much better. It was amazing how quickly he began to heal from the trauma thanks to the Corso.

"These dogs save lives. They need you. They follow you all around and that is why they make great service dogs," said Harry.

You may see Harry, together with teammates Doreen and RL, in a 30-foot refurbished school bus they use to transport the dogs to events. The eye-catching bus is wrapped on one side with the six branches of the military and the other side is first responders. The crew of Corsos for Heroes participates in events throughout the year. Once a puppy has been donated, Harry takes his ministry a step further by looking for non-profits in the owner's area to get the dog certified as a service dog. One such organization is in Brooksville, named K9 Partners for Patriots. Their services are free, and Harry has trained seven dogs for the new owners.

At this time, Harry is the sole supporter and needs funding for the ministry. 



New Year's goals can be very effective when you are clear on what you want, and you have a plan to accomplish it. I love using the new year for this motivation and believe it can be a great time to get focused. However, don't let it just be another good idea that you have no follow through on, do something different and stick to them! To set some goals here are some tips:

- 1) Write down on a piece of paper what you want to accomplish and by when. Carving out some time to sit down to think about this and write it out makes a difference. Put on some music, turn off all distractions like the phone, email, or social media notifications and get focused on thinking about your life.
- 2) Write down WHY you want it, not just the thing you want but what is the emotional reason you want it. What is it going to do for your life? What result do you want from that goal? How will it impact your family life or career? Knowing the why behind why we do things helps propel us forward when the initial "motivation" wears off.
- 3) Write down three small steps you can take to start implementing this goal. You need to get clear on an action plan. And it needs to be specific, not just "lose weight". You must write down the steps that you are going to take to help facilitate this goal.
- 4) Set a reward that you will give yourself when you accomplish that goal and just as important, set a consequence if you don't accomplish it. This step might not seem important, but it is. So, what are you going to get or give yourself for positive reinforcement when you hit that goal? And what consequence are you going to have if you don't? An extreme example is many years ago I had a business goal to hit by a certain deadline and if I did it, I got to go on a helicopter ride in the Grand Canyon while on a business trip there. If I didn't hit it, I wouldn't have gotten to do that and I had to stay in a really gross hotel. And guess what? I hit my goal and went on the helicopter ride! It was amazing!
- **5) Track your progress.** You must measure your progress in how you are you doing with what you said you were going to do. Check in with yourself daily or weekly and make yourself document if you are getting it done.
- **6) Adjust what you are doing if it's not working.** When you set your goals, action steps, you are tracking your progress and you realize you aren't doing it, then you need to adjust. Perhaps your steps are either too difficult or not detailed enough but you need to change something, so you GET results.

I know these may seem like simple steps, but they work, when you work them. I encourage you to think of something you want to be different in your life. Perhaps losing weight or getting in better shape (which happens to be the #1 New Year's goal) and really taking goal setting serious, it can totally change your life. For being such a small gland in the body, the thyroid is critical to good health. The name comes from the Greek word for shield. It has a butterfly shape and is located below the larynx/ Adam's apple and in front of the windpipe and is part of the endocrine system. - Weight gain
- Slower heart rate
- Fatigue
- More frequent and stronger menstrual periods
- Forgetfulness
- Dry skin and hair
- Hoarse voice
- Intolerance to cold


Women are 5 to 8 times more likely than men to have a thyroid disease. And over 200 million people worldwide have some type of thyroid disease. Hashimoto's Disease is an autoimmune disease that can cause hypothyroidism while Grave's Disease leads to hyperthyroidism. As always, it is strongly recommended to get a proper medical diagnosis if you suspect any type of imbalance concerning the thyroid gland. And then you can weigh your treatment options.



"By faith we understand that the universe was formed at God's command, so that what is seen was not made out of what was visible." — Hebrews 11:3



Compare the party's platform with the Word of God, and don't be overly concerned with the personality of the candidates, but instead on the platform upon which they stand. The Bible says in **Psalms 33:12 "Blessed is the nation whose God is the Lord!"**

6. Pray, asking for God's wisdom to be revealed to your heart. James 1:5: "If any of you is deficient in wisdom, let him ask of the giving God (who gives) to everyone liberally and ungrudgingly, without reproaching or faultfinding, and it will be given him."

7. Pray for God's will to be done that righteous men and women are placed in positions of authority. The Bible clearly states that we do have a responsibility to pray for all those in authority. I Timothy 2:1-3 says, "First of all, I admonish and urge that petitions, prayers, intercessions, and thanksgivings be offered on behalf of all men. For all who are in positions of authority or high responsibility that (outwardly) we may pass a quiet and undisturbed life (and inwardly) a peaceable one in all godliness and reverence and seriousness in every way. For such praying is good and right and (it is) pleasing and acceptable to God our Savior." You will notice that in so doing, God said our nation can be blessed. Although a battle has ensued for God's will to be done in this season, always stand for righteousness and God's results will eventually be seen, personally and nationally.



Our Journey through the Vatican City

My daughters and I recently went on an adventure to Italy. It was a long journey, but it was worth it to see the beautiful artwork and buildings created centuries ago.

We had the added benefit of knowledgeable tour guides explaining the culture and rich history of the area. One such tour was through the Vatican City. You can explore it on your own, but you may not learn the stories behind the city and its works of art. It was interesting to learn that the Vatican City is actually its own country. In 1929 it became independent from Italy under the Lateran Treaty and is ruled by the Pope. However, you don't need to bring your passport with you when travelling from Rome, so leave it safe at your hotel!

There is so much to see in Vatican City. Here is a little about the history and a few of the highlights we encountered:



St. Peter's Basilica

St. Peter's Basilica, the Italian Renaissance and Baroque church, is located within the walls of the Vatican City. Construction of St. Peter's Basilica, with its circular piazza in front and bordered by palaces and gardens, began in 1506 and was completed in 1626. The basilica is erected over the tomb of St. Peter the Apostle and is the largest religious building in the world.



As you approach the basilica, you will see 140 statues in St. Peters square of Saints and Martyrs 64 feet atop the building (each being over 10 feet tall) with 13 statues on the façade, representing Jesus and eleven of his apostles, including John the Baptist, with St. Peter on the stairs. As you enter the walls of the basilica, it is unfathomable as to the actual size of the beautiful pieces of art. Some of the statues are over 20 feet tall, including the Monument to Benedict XIV, built in 1769 by Bracci. Everything is so large, but it is deceptive to the seeing eye. Just to give you an idea of the sheer size of the church, the candles above St Peter's tomb are 6 feet tall. The inscriptions on the walls have letters that are 7 feet tall with the lettering closest to the ceiling standing 15 feet tall. This is, of course, so that you can read it from the ground!

History of St. Peter the Apostle

Peter (formerly Simon) was one of the twelve apostles that walked with Jesus and spread God's word throughout the land. He and his brother

drew casting a net into the lake for they were fishermen. "Come, follow me," Jesus said, "and I will send you out to fish for people." At once they left their nets and followed him.

In Luke 5 we are told of the story of how Jesus preached from Peter and Andrew's boat. The brothers were fishing on Lake Gennesaret when they saw Jesus. After fishing all night and not catching anything, the exhausted fishermen were discouraged. After his teaching, Jesus tells them to lower their net once more and they catch a large number of fish, showing us that the Lord will provide if we just have faith and take that first step.

Even after all he had experienced with Jesus, at the time of the crucifixion he denied having known Jesus three times. Yet, in spite of this, Peter was the first one that Jesus appeared to after his resurrection. Once again, showing Jesus' love for us and forgiveness of our sins.

Sadly, Peter died on the cross in 64 AD. Emperor Nero had him put to death after the Great Fire of Rome as he felt Christians were to blame for the fire. Peter did not feel worthy to die the same as Jesus, so he was crucified head down at Vatican Hill, which was reflected in various pieces of somber artwork. Another melancholy piece was the Pieta.

The Pieta

One of the most well-known pieces of art is the Pieta, which depicts Mary holding Jesus after he died on the cross. The heart wrenching statue was created by Michelangelo in 1499 when he was only 23 years old. Since 1972, it has been protected by bullet-proof glass. A vandal carrying a geologist's hammer attacked the statue and

damaged it breaking Mary's arm, hand, and nose in the process. Thankfully, visitors were able to tackle him and hold him so no further damage was done to the irreplaceable artwork. It was painstakingly repaired with the shards of marble that were gathered after the attack.



The Sistine Chapel is well known for the beautiful frescos of Michelangelo. Photographs are not allowed to be taken. The interesting story behind these pieces of artwork is that when first asked by the Pope to do the paintings, Michelangelo did not want to do it stating he was a sculptor not a painter. But you don't say no to a Pope, and we are all thankful that he took that step out of his comfort zone as God had a masterpiece planned.

The frescos represent creation, banishment from the Garden of Eden, the sacrifice of Noah, the flood, and the drunkenness of Noah. Michelangelo did not paint them in order so you will notice that in some of the panels the people are smaller. When he had finished two panels, he climbed down from the scaffolding and realized they were too small to see clearly from the ground, so the remaining panels have larger people in them.

Another story we learned was that a cardinal saw the paintings and didn't like the fact that there were nudes in the paintings. Michelangelo did not take well to criticism and painted the cardinal's likeness in hell. When the cardinal saw this and complained to the Pope, the Pope simply stated, "that's not my jurisdiction." So, keep that in mind, don't ever criticize an artist as you may end up in the artwork in an unflattering state.

Rapid Response Reporting

Florida has many industries that are at risk for potential trafficking activity such as hospitality, trucking, service or labor-based businesses. Understanding and identifying the signs of human trafficking can help victims break away and seek help. During National Human Trafficking Awareness Month this January, Pasco Sheriff's Office urges citizens to learn the signs of human trafficking and how to report potential trafficking quickly. These actions can get those in need to safety sooner and help law enforcement prevent future or potential trafficking from occurring.

Traffickers prey on vulnerable victims by stealing their individual freedoms for profit. Physical signs of trafficking may include evidence of violence (such as bruises), injuries or untreated wounds, exhaustion, malnourishment or even branding. Context is key to understanding what you observe. Social and interpersonal signs of trafficking can be a bit more subtle and can include an individual accompanied by another controlling individual, isolation from friends or family, little to no possessions, being severely underpaid or paid nothing at all for their work and not being in control of their money or personal documents, such as their driver's license or passport. Mental and emotional signs such as low self-esteem, anxiety, depression, fearful behavior and not identifying as a victim of trafficking can reveal much more. Behavioral signs commonly exhibited from victims include submissive or anxious demeanors, avoiding eye contact with others, being afraid of law enforcement personnel and not being permitted to speak for themselves.

When speaking with someone who may be in a dangerous or potential trafficking situation, non-judgmental communication is best to help them feel safe. In-person conversations are pre-

ferred, but if that's not possible, ask only yes or no questions when speaking over the phone, until they indicate they are safe to speak freely. Provide potential victims with information on resources and where they can seek help or shelter.

If you observe something that you suspect might be human trafficking, say something! Rapid reporting of potential trafficking activity can help end human trafficking. The National Human Trafficking Hotline is a toll-free hotline, available 24 hours a day, 7 days a week and in over 200 languages. It's accessible by calling 1-888-373-7888. The Hotline is a safe space to report tips, seek services and ask for help. Discrete text message or online chat communication with the National Human Traffic Hotline is also available by texting "BEFREE" (233733) or by visiting www. humantraffickinghotline.org online. Call the hotline to report tips, locate services, get help and learn about options available. All information provided is confidential and reporters can remain anonymous. To best protect victims and yourself, never get directly involved in suspected trafficking activity; instead report it immediately. If you or someone you know is in immediate danger, call 9-1-1. The Pasco Sheriff's Office partners with the Pasco County Commission on Human Trafficking to both prevent and respond to human trafficking cases.

Paying attention, reporting any suspicious behavior and offering resources can make a difference. Identifying warnings signs of human trafficking can help get services to survivors quicker as well as reduce their horrible crime. If you suspect human trafficking, report it to the National Human Trafficking Hotline or local law enforcement immediately.

It's amazing how your brain (a physical organ) can perform a million functions in your body we are not even aware of. Even brain surgeons will admit that they don't understand how a thought is stored. Could a thought be a medium which God can communicate to us spiritually through faith?

You can lose any part of your body and still communicate through your thoughts, which makes your brain the holiest part of your body. This may give us a clue as to why God wants us to focus on our health so we will have a clearer mind and be able to recognize his spiritual voice.

On the other hand, the Devil knows by destroying our health, he can confuse and cloud our minds. Just think, a whole generation becoming fuzzier with drugs, slanderous music, and videos. The more unhealthy he can make us, the more we won't be able to hear the Holy Spirit.

We can identify with that when we see someone who's had a few drinks. They may seem at ease, even being funny or dancing around. But after a few too many, suddenly they turn into a lunatic, becoming out of their head. You've heard the old expression, "The Devil got a hold of them."

One of the Old Testament teachings is called fasting, because it gives your mind a chance to rest and your blood to get purified from the harmful and different things we are eating. Plus, it teaches us self-control. Matthew 9:15: "And Jesus said to them, "Can the wedding guests mourn as long as the bridegroom is with them? The days will come when the bridegroom is taken away from them, and then they will fast."



The Bible does not say that you can't eat meat, but because the human body takes longer to digest it, meat will stay in your system and start to putrefy, causing colon cancer, diverticulitis, and a whole ream of other problems. So meat probably shouldn't be part of the human diet, but the Bible does say you're not supposed to eat what God calls abomination, and nowhere does God call something an abomination in one place and clean somewhere else. Once he declares abomination, it's forever.

He said among the animals in Leviticus 11:3: "You may eat any animal that has a divided hoof and that chews the cud." Not one of those two things, but both. A rabbit chews the cud but has paws. A pig or swine has a cloven hoof but it does not chew the cud. These animals are scavengers and are considered unclean. But neither does it say you have to be a vegetarian.



Among the seafood—Leviticus 11:9: "These you shall eat of all that are in the waters: whatsoever has fins and scales. Them you may eat." It was interesting that the Navy did a number of studies about what sailors eat or don't eat for survival, and what they came up with was the exact same Bible quote. If it doesn't have fins and scales, don't eat it! Lobster, shrimp, and oysters, when you think about it, these are scavengers.

Lobsters crawl around the bottom eating dead things. God created these creatures to clean up the environment. Catfish have fins but they do not have scales. They used to say that you catch the biggest catfish by the mouth of the sewer. They're not clean; they're on the abomination list.

Among the birds—Leviticus 11:15-16: "Every raven after his kind, and the owl, and

the night hawk, cuckow and the hawk after its kind. And the pelican I say that these things were unclean." Birds that are foraging birds like chicken, turkey, pheasant, and the quail, that peck around for the seeds are typically the clean ones. You probably didn't know that pigeons are considered to be clean.



Abomination is a reference to animals that God says not to eat, as well as animals that are kept and killed in the inhumane environment. When this is done, it induces high levels of toxins from stress and transfers it to the meat. Example: The difference between free roaming chickens vs. caged chickens. Veal we eat from a caged calf. In fact, even doctors will tell you that stress in our bodies make us sick! The same is true about how we keep our livestock.

Isaiah 66:15-17: "For, behold, the Lord will come with fire, and with his chariots like a whirlwind, to render his anger with fury. They that sanctify themselves and purify themselves, eating swine's flesh, and the abomination, and the mouse, shall be consumed together,' saith the Lord." God is putting pork and rats in the same category. "They will be consumed together,' says the Lord." God does not want his people eating pork.



The US Department of Agriculture printed pamphlets about pigs, telling us if you are going to eat it, you better cook it very well to kill the trichina larvae. Do not cook your pork in a microwave, because some of the trichina cysts could survive. When the cysts are eaten by humans, they can catch and release thousands of larvae trichina worms in your body.

Sometimes, we hear people quote Timothy about every creature is good. Hmm... let's see. 1 Timothy 4:4: "For every creature is good, and nothing to be refused, if it be received with thanksgiving. It's sanctified by a word of God in prayer." What Paul is saying is that if these animals are sanctified or endorsed by God then we can receive it with thanksgiving and prayer, similar to saying grace.

Among the grain—Genesis 1:29: "And God said, "Behold. I have given you every herb bearing seed, and every tree in which is the fruit of the tree yielding seed; to you it shall be for meat." The original diet was fruits, grains, nuts, and legumes when man was eating from the tree of life and was intended to flourish through eternity because his body was going to live forever. But after sin when man was evicted from the Garden of Eden, he could no longer eat from the tree of life.



Evidently, there was something that the tree of life offered, and God was now going to supplement it with a substitute. He told man he could now eat vegetables. Genesis 3:18: "Thou shall eat the herb of the field." The difference between a fruit and a vegetable is the fruit is going to be the product of the blossom of the plant. If you eat the leaf or stalk or the

root, it's a vegetable. So if it's not the product of the blossom and you've got the seeds which are the same as a nut, it is a vegetarian diet.

A solemn reminder is given to those who ignore God's rules. 1 Corinthians 3:16-17: "Ye are the temple of God. If any man defile the temple of God, him shall God destroy. Do you not know that your body is the temple of the Holy Spirit who is in you, whom you have from God? You are not your own, for you were bought at a price. Therefore, glorify God in your body and in your spirit, which are God's." Galatians 6:7: "Be not deceived, God is not mocked: for whatsoever a man soweth, that shall he also reap."

Deuteronomy 6:24: "And the Lord commanded us to do all these statutes for our good always, that he might preserve us alive. It's for our good that he gave us these things." Exodus 23:25: "And you shall serve the Lord your God, and he will bless your bread, and your water, and I will take sickness away from the midst of thee."

God told the children of Israel as they were going through the wilderness that if they would serve the Lord, he'd bless their food. And after following the health principles that God gave the children of Israel and going through the wilderness, by the time they enter the promised land, Psalms 105:37: "He brought them forth and not one feeble person among their tribes."

fter following the health principles that God had given the children of Israel for 40 years in a nation with approximately two and a half million people, not one feeble person was found among their tribes.

We are an overfed nation. The Centers for Disease Control finally confirmed we're fat, not just because we eat a lot more than we used to, but because a lot of the foods we eat now are genetically altered, such as GMO foods. They may look good, but they have very little nutrients that our body needs to satisfy our hunger.

Manna was the supernatural food God gave

to the Israelites during their 40-year wandering in the desert. Not long after the Jewish people had escaped Egypt and crossed the Red Sea, they ran out of the food. They began to grumble, recalling the tasty meals they had enjoyed when they were slaves. God told Moses he would rain down bread from heaven for the people. That evening, quail came and covered the camp. The people killed the birds and ate their meat.

The next morning, when the dew evaporated, a white substance covered the ground. Moses instructed the people to gather enough for each person each day. When some of the people tried to save extra, it became wormy and spoiled. Manna appeared for six days in a row, but on Fridays they were to gather a double portion, because it did not appear on the seventh day, the Sabbath. And yet, the portion they saved for the Sabbath did not spoil. I like to refer to it as monatomic gold or white powder gold.

Have we forgotten how we all got in so much trouble? It started way back in the Garden of Eden, where someone was eating something they weren't supposed to eat.

So now you have it. God's Health Care Plan. And you can get started on yours today! It's up you. The good news is that salvation is never too late for the living. Only after you pass is it a Dunndeal. Have you ever heard of anyone that came back to complain?

The Great Florida Outdoors: The Timucuan Indians

Timucuan Indians

During this time of giving thanks, we must look to our past and honor those who have come before us. Before I set off on any walk in Florida nature, I say a silent prayer of thanks to God and for our ancestors like the Timucuan Indians.

The Timucua were the Native American people living in the northeast and north central portions of Florida. The earliest evidence of their presence dates from around 3000 BC. and they probably numbered

between 200,000 and 300,000 people organized into various chiefdoms speaking a common

The name Timucua may derive from the Spanish pronunciation of the Timucuan word atimoqua, which means "lord" or "chief." The Timucua were semi-nomadic and lived in the inland forests during the mild fall and winter months. Employing "slash and burn" technology by cutting large growth followed by clearing the fields with fire, the soil would be turned and broken utilizing the nitrates in the ash as an effective fertilizer. Part of their diet included maize, beans, squash, melons, and various root vegetables. The Timucua would also collect wild fruits and berries and bake bread made from the root starch of the Coontie plant. The people cultivated tobacco and utilized a communal food storage system that suggested crop surpluses.

The Timucuan also hunted deer, alligator, bear, turkey, and other game, possibly including eastern bison. During the hot summers, they would migrate to the cooler seashores where they would fish and collect oysters and shellfish. The Timucuan culture is still evident in the many shell middens, essentially Indian trash piles, still found in Florida's coastal areas.


