# **Our Fight For Freedom: The American Revolution** By Karen McBride

Ralph Waldo Emerson wrote the Concord Hymn: By the rude bridge that arched the flood Their flag to April's breeze unfurled. Here once the embattled farmer stood.

And fired the shot heard round the world.

The poem pays homage to the brave militia men who lost their lives during the American Revolution with the Battle of Concord being widely acknowledged as the event that started the American Revolution

Growing up in the area, I never appreciated the rich history that surrounded us. However, as a child, I vividly recall the class assignment to memorize its opening paragraph, and I can still recite it today. Since then, I have been back to Massachusetts many times and brought my children to teach them the history of our country.

The field where this pivotal moment took place appears as a serene yellow field of tall grass surrounded by an age-old stone wall. Passersby may never suspect the historical importance of this small plot of land.



The brave Minutemen, predominantly farmers, courageously fought for independence from England. Their spirit resonates even today as Americans continue to uphold and defend our cherished freedoms

If you have the opportunity to visit Massachusetts, spend some time learning about the embattled farmers at North Bridge. Park rangers provide guided tours. Visitors will see the Minute Man statue created by Daniel Chester French in 1875 to commemorate the 100th anniversary of the battle. Civil war cannons were melted down to create the cast bronze statue.

Historic buildings on the site include.

The Old Manse, built in 1769: home to revolutionaries and to writers such as Ralph Waldo Emerson and Nathaniel Hawthorne.

The North Bridge Visitor Center: a brick mansion built in 1911 by Major John Buttrick's descendants. After the British fired the first shot, Buttricks, a colonial officer, ordered his militia to fire back at the British soldiers. The ruins of two 17th century homes, owned by his brothers Ephraim and Willard Buttrick, remain at the site.

Historic trades demonstrations and re-enactments are held throughout the year. Upcoming events include:

A Declaration of Independence reading will be held on July 4, 2024.

Father & Son Love Free Food Pantry has been serving the community for the past 7 years, distributing and serving over 4.8 million meals to veterans, seniors, first responders, homeless and families in need.

The heat won't slow them down this summer as they have many events planned for families in need:

Free Summer Lunch Program for school age children. Meals are provided on Tuesdays from 3-6 pm and Fridays from 12-3pm. Children must be accompanied by a parent, and the parent is invited to shop as well.

Free Mobile Doctor's Clinic for those that do not have any health insurance. Referrals are provided to those that need additional healthcare. Appointments must be made in advance. Check the website for upcoming dates/times

# The Great Florida Outdoors: Civilian Conservation Corps (CCC) Dr. Robert Norman, Clinical Professor, Dermatology, Nova Southeastern University

In 1936, the Civilian Conservation Corps (CCC) began restoring the buildings at the fort in 1936 with impetus from the New Deal proclamation of President Franklin D. Roosevelt. The action put thousands of Americans back to work refurbishing the nation's parks and resources amidst the stagnation of the Great Depression. I have been to many of the CCC restored parks and marvel at the workmanship and united efforts of those who participated

I have written in these pages before about the CCC in articles about Fort Clinch State Park. Hillsborough River State Park, and O'Leno State Park. I stayed in a CCC-built cabin at Myakka River State Park and became fascinated with the history



"In Florida, 50,000 young men from povertystricken families earned \$30 a month while receiving food and housing as they worked (\$25 was to be sent home). Each had to sign up for at

The speed with which this program took shape is breath-taking. FDR was inaugurated as president on March 4, 1933. He proposed the CCC on March 9. Congress authorized it March 27. On April 7, the first men were enrolled and began serving. Eventually, more than 3 million

men ages 17 to 28 served in the CCC." (from the Floridarambler.com)

In Highlands County, at mostly what is Highlands Hammock State Park, they used 3.4 million man-hours and worked from June 1934-December 1941 building 30 structures including houses, bridges, workshops, a greenhouse, restrooms, pavilions, recreation hall, mess hall, water towers and water lines. They also constructed drainage ditches, roads, cattleguards, fences, a sawmill including a kiln, and trails and ponds. In addition, they fought fires and potted, grew and planted 2500 varieties of plants. Enrollees reforested wastelands, developed new recreational facilities, aided in the control of erosion of farms and improved conditions for wildlife. More than 49,000 men from the state were enrolled in 73 camps for an operation with a total financial obligation within the state of Florida of more than \$34 million.

As you travel Florida and explore its award-winning state parks, take special note of the buildings, trails, and other amenities we still enjoy because of the work of the CCC. There are CCC

projects in nine state parks, and one, Highland Hammocks in Sebring, has a fascinating museum devoted to the history of the CCC in Florida.

The CCC developed state parks in all 50 states and established 800 state parks. Many of the illiterate enrollees were taught to read and write.

The Civilian Conservation Corps was one of the most successful New Deal programs of the Great Depression. This social employment program existed for fewer than 10 years, but left a legacy of strong, handsome roads, bridges, and



buildings throughout the United States, and untold memories, stories and pictures among its participants. Between 1933 and 1941, more than 3,000,000 men served in the CCC

Could we consider a project like this today? Where can you see these marvels of Florida? the species in the world." Where can you find these wonderful patterns in nature?


## Get out into The Great Florida Outdoors!



# Are Your Supplements Working Against Each Other?

Do you have trouble focusing? Feel tired all the time? Have constipation or diarrhea? Have numbness in your extremities? All of these are common symptoms of mineral deficiencies. So, what do people do when they think they have a deficiency of a mineral? \Hopefully, it would be to change their diet, but it is so much easier to take a supplement. We pop \Vitamin D for our immune system, magnesium to relax our muscles, calcium for our bones, \Vitamin B12 for plantar fascitits, etc. Sometimes it is difficult to get enough nutrients from our food alone, and there is nothing wrong with taking supplements.

What we often fail to do is look at the interaction between various minerals and vitamins. In our effort to improve our health by increasing specific nutrients we may inadvertently interfere with the absorption of other nutrients. Especially when we add large doses of a specific vitamin or mineral.

Vitamin D works better with balanced amounts of calcium and magnesium. Balance being key as an excess of calcium or magnesium can be counterproductive to each other.

High levels of Vitamin A can decrease absorption of Vitamin D by up to 30%. High levels of Vitamin E can also affect the absorption of Vitamin D.

High levels of calcium can decrease zinc absorption. Some people have increased their intake of zinc as a preventive measure against colds, flus, etc. But if you are taking high levels of calcium to improve your bone health, you may be reducing the effectiveness of both minerals.

It is ideal to eat a balanced diet that covers all the colors of the rainbow so you can get as many nutrients as you can directly from food. When you need to take supplements, do your own research. More is not always better. Even supplements are better in moderation.

Work with a doctor to have blood tests done to check your level of vitamins and minerals.

Then, work with a nutritionist to learn about interactions. Are some better taken in the am or pm? With or without food? Most people are not getting all the nutrients they need through food. Dealing with stress and illness requires higher levels of nutrients. Educate yourself to get the most out of the supplements you take and to be sure you are not spending money unnecessarily.

And remember, regular reflexology sessions can also help you get your body functions back into balance. Ask about my money-saving package deal to get the most for your money. Stay safe, and I wish you blessings galore!





God gives us four specific things to do: humble, pray, seek, and turn. This is our part of the process. As we do these things, then God will do His part to hear, forgive, and heal.

But until we do our part, God will not do His part. The key word in this entire verse is "then." It makes it clear that our part must be fulfilled before God's part can be initiated.

Our part involves true humility and repentance. We can pray for restoration. However, restoration can't come until there is revival. Revival can't come until there is responsibility, responsibility can't come until there is repentance, and repentance can't come until we remember.

We must remember who we are, where we come from, and why it's important to be accountable for what God's given us through our Founding Fathers. We must discover things like:

- · How was our government formed?
- · What price was paid for our liberty, and who paid it?
- · What role did God play in the lives of our Founding Fathers?
- What responsibilities did our Founders give us?

The Bible says wisdom comes from two sources: the Word of God and life's experiences (his-

tory). If we choose to forget the past, then we lose the wisdom of the past—wisdom that came at a great price. # Passion for Prison Ministry is Helping to Break the Chains of Sin By Karen McBride



Life behind bars can be a scary, lonely time. Inmates often feel overlooked by family and friends. Scotty, Jessica, and Carla began Passion for Prison ("PfP") ministry as a way to reach out to people incarcerated so they would know they are not forgotten.

At a very young age, Jessica had a history of breaking the law and knew what life was like behind bars. It wasn't until she accepted Jesus as her Lord and Savior that He showed her how she could use her testimony to help others.

As she began her new Christian life, she felt a calling to go on a mission's trip. While collecting donations for the trip to the Dominican Republic, someone gave her a check along with an application for a prison ministry. He recommended that while Jessica was waiting on the upcoming mission's trip, she should consider volunteering at the prison ministry.

She completed her application to go to the Orange County Jail and waited for the first day of volunteering. As a self-proclaimed "tomboy" she always felt more comfortable around men, but this particular ministry only allowed women to go to the women's jail. To her amazement, she found the women in the jail were just like her, and she could easily relate to them.

She experienced another surprise when she heard the pastor playing the electric guitar in the courtyard. He started with Lynyrd Skynyrd and switched to praise and worship. She thought that was such a unique way to reach the people in prison. God had planted the seed in her heart for a unique prison ministry.

She served on the medical mission's trip but felt completely unequipped as she had no medical skills. Yet, God had plan for her. As she was arriving in the Dominican Republic, she met a group of young people from Cocoa Beach. In the short conversation, she was sharing her experience at the prison ministry and found out that their pastor was the man playing the electric guitar.

It was at this moment that she knew this was her sign from God saying, "Yes this is the path I have for you." She didn't need to travel to other countries to help people, she could minister right here in her own community.

To find her way in this new calling on her life, she began volunteering at the Hernando Correctional Institution on a regular basis. During this time, the chaplain was deployed to Iraq. Jessica

continued to volunteer and was now in charge of unlocking the chapel door. He was deployed for a year, and she was concerned about who would continue to unlock the chapel door each week. She was told the curriculum was only 8 weeks long, so she would need to produce her own ministry if she wished to continue serving. As she was discussing it with her friend, Carla said, "Since you have started in prison ministry, I found that I have a passion for prison." And so, the ministry found its name.





PfP travels across Florida and the U.S. to Puerto Rico, Texas, Georgia, South Carolina, Mississippi, and even Hawaii.

At least once a month they do a yard event in the prisons across Florida, having up to 80% of the population in attendance. Scotty and Jessica minister at both men and women's units.

They bring their motorcycles, and curiosity draws inmates into the main yard. Once they have engaged the prisoners, they can begin spreading the hope found in God's word.

Psalm 119:114 NLT: "You are my refuge and my shield; your word is my source of hope."

This past year over 24,000 people were released in sixty-seven counties. "Would you rather a released criminal who is going to commit more crimes be in your neighborhood or a released Christian who's living for Jesus?" asked Jessica. "This is why it is so important to reach them before they are released." A warden recently reminded her, "We are not making better inmates, we are making better neighbors."

Many released prisoners are now volunteers at PfP. "There's no higher moment than to stand next to people in free world clothes that say, I was serving a life sentence when I met Scotty and Jessica and accepted Jesus as my Savior.""

"The freedom they gained came from Jesus. Prison does not change a person for the better. If ou don't change a man's heart, you don't change anything, and only Jesus can," said Scotty.

A letter from Amanda, a former inmate, read, "I hadn't had a hug from anyone in two years, but I haven't had a hug with love behind it you gave in my whole life."

They have ministered to over 17,000 families (not just prisoners as they are reconciling families and making a difference in their lives as well as the inmates).

"There's nothing better than to go to a restaurant and have a waitress say, 'I saw you when I was n prison or you run into a mom in Walmart that has been reconciled with her kids."

How can you help? Funding is needed in order for the ministry to travel (for hotels, food, and gas), as well as monthly support to include postage for letters sent to inmates on a regular basis. They need help with public relations, social media, and spreading the word about their ministry. They are looking for younger volunteers to keep the ministry going. Younger people are in prison too and can more easily relate to

volunteers their own age.

One prisoner that stands out to them is Charles, a triple lifer.

He stood up in chapel one day and said, "If I had the opportunity to leave today with Scotty and Jess but I had to leave Jesus here, I would stay."



It doesn't have to last long, but just for thirty days nobody will worship any god or man except for you and this will solidify your kingdom." Often the devil uses common worship and common language to do that.

So if you read in Daniel 6:8, he signs the decree that no one is to pray to any god or man for thirty days or they would be cast into the lion's den. King Darius never thought that anyone would ever break his law because once the king signed the decree, it could not be changed.

When Daniel heard about the signing of the decree, knowing the penalty, he chose not to hide his faith, so he went into his house and opened up his windows facing toward Jerusalem on his knees and gave thanks to his God as written in Daniel 6:10.

Soon after, the cabinet members went to the King Darius and said to him. "You know someone in your kingdom just doesn't care about your new law. It's that Daniel. He's been praying three times a day." With a heavy heart and knowing that he could not change the law, he gave the command to cast Daniel into the lion's den. The king spoke to Daniel, saying, "May the God whom you serve deliver you." And he had the stone put over the lion's den with a government seal in Daniel 6:16.

The next morning, the king had the stone removed and said, "Has your God delivered you from the lions?" Daniel cried out, saying, "My God has sent angels to shut the lions' mouths."



Because Daniel knew one of the Ten Commandments says that "you shall put no other God before me." Not even King Darius, not even for thirty days. Daniel was showing with his life that by keeping this law no harm would come to him and that he was willing to die rather than to disobey the law.

So what kind of faith and determination will God's people need in the last days? Will there be a law that says that he that does not worship the Beast in his image will be killed? Because worshiping the Beast is going to require breaking one of the Ten Commandments. Like Daniel, will God's people love the Lord so much that they would rather die or go hungry than to break God's commandments?

The Ten Commandments are not multiple choice questions. Can God's moral law be amended or repealed? Jesus tells us in Luke 16:21: "And it is easier for heaven to pass away than one speck of the law to fail." In Psalm 89:34, it reads: "My covenant I will not break, nor alter the thing that is gone out of my lips."

God is not going to break his covenant, for it's forever and ever. Also in Psalm 111:7-8 it says that all of his commandments are sure and will stand fast forever and ever. The Ten Commandments just didn't suddenly appear in Exodus because the Ten Commandment have al-

ways reflected God's nature. We know this from when Potiphar's wife tried to tempt loseph to commit adultery in the book of Genesis. Joseph said, "I cannot do that." Joseph knew this even in the days of Genesis that adultery was a sin.

When Cain killed Abel, God said that sin lies at your door, and sin is the breaking of God's laws. Was murder a sin in the Garden of Eden? Or was murder not a sin until God wrote it down at Mount Sinai? Just as it is wrong to lie all the way back from the beginning. God simply arranged it, meaning that He wrote approximately 300 words into a stone of granite so it could not be changed nor would there be any misunderstanding that this was his perfect will for all of man and not to just one nation. So when you do away with law, you do away with the nature of God.

All through the Bible, you will find reflected references in His law. God is good, the law is good, God is Holy, the law is good, God is Holy, the law is Holy, God is righteous, God is truth, God is pure, God is spiritual, God is unchangeable, and God is eternal. These are all characteristics of the law. So we need to be very careful about doing away with God's law because it is the very nature of God. Jesus was the word that became flesh. Christ said that "he who hears these words of mine is like a wise man who built on a rock." And the Ten Commandments was written on rock.

If any words would be important, it would be the words that God wrote in stone. Christ was the embodiment of the world. His life was of obedience to the laws of God. He said, "Pick up your cross and follow me," lesus came to save us from sin. So what is he saving us from? In 1st John 3-6 it says, "Sin is the transgression of the law." In Romans 3-20, it reads: "By the law is the knowledge of sin." We really don't know what sin is except by the law. For God's laws reveals what sin is. The purpose of the law is not to save us but to show us that we are in need of salvation.

You can illustrate this by using a mirror to mulate the Ten Commandments and a wash cloth to simulate what lesus did for us. Let's say that I walk out among you with something on my face and people begin whispering about it. Then a staff member comes up and says to me, "You have pie on your face." And if I pulled out a mirror, I could confirm what they have said is true. I could say that the mirror must be broken or say, "You're right," and then try to use the mirror by rubbing it on my face to try to remove it or use the cloth of lesus with the mirror to wipe it away. So you can see that the mirror or the law can show you what's wrong or the problems in your life. But it could not be removed without the cloth of Jesus. The law is here to show us we need both the law and the blood of Jesus in order to take away sin.

So the law is like a mirror as it says in James 1:23-25. It's not to take away our sin but to show us our sin, and then you go to Jesus for cleansing.

Paul said where there is no law there's no transgression. In Romans 7:7 it reads, "I had not known sin, but by the law: for I had not known lust, except the law had said you shall not covet."

Did Jesus keep the Ten Commandments? In John 15:10 says, "I have kept my Father's commandments."


What is the punishment for living a life of sin? In Romans 6:23 it says, "The wages of sin is death." Some say the Ten Commandments are not binding for the New Testament Christians. Iesus said in Matthew 19:17. "If thou wilt enter into life, keep the commandments." Also in Iohn 14:15, it says, "If you love me, keep my commandments."

You may hear a lot of pastors say that you do not have to keep the commandments, saying that Jesus had come to fulfill the law. So what does that mean?

When Jesus came to John the Baptist to be baptized John said to Jesus that you need to baptize me because you are the Messiah. Jesus said to him, "no John, allow it to be this way to allow us to fulfill all righteousness."

So obviously he wants us to keep the commandments. How is it possible to keep the commandments? In Romans 8:3-4 it says, "God sent his own Son... condemned sin in the flesh that the righteousness of the law might be fulfilled in us."

And in Philippians 1:6 it tells us, "He who has begun a good work in you will perform it until the day of Jesus Christ."





What is the old covenant and why did it fail? Deuteronomy 4:13 says, "And he declared unto you His covenant, which He commanded you to perform, even the Ten Commandments and He wrote them upon two tablets of stone." But while Moses was retrieving the tablets from God, the Israelites made a golden calf. In Hebrews 8:8 it says, "In finding fault with them he said, "I will make a new covenant with the house of Israel and the house of Judah."

The old covenant was based on the promises of the people who made a promise. The new covenant is based on the Lord. Hebrews 8:10 says "This is the covenant that I will make, said the Lord. T will write them into their hearts." Who spoke the first law? God did.

The problem is with the people, not the law. God never commanded his people to do something without giving them the power to do so. So when you follow the law that is called obedience. But some churches today are acting as if obedience is legalism. Obedience is not legalism. It is just another way for the devil to intimidate Christians by using dirty words among Christians, like legalist and Pharisee. Doesn't living under grace, by faith, make keeping God's laws non-essential?

Romans 6:15 says, "What then, shall we sin because we are not under grace? God forbid!" And again in Romans 3:31 it says, "Do we then make void the law through faith? God forbid yea, we establish the law. Again He use that praise God forbid." Paul said in 2:13 that "it is not the hearers of the law that will be justified but the doers that will be justified" Ephesians 2:8-9 "for by grace are ye saved through faith; and that not of yourselves. It is a gift of God. not of works, lest any man should baset.


We're not saved by our obedience. But if we love the Lord, we want to obey Him. If you go to Billy Graham's website and ask the question: "Does God expect His people to keep the Ten Commandments?"

Answer: The Ten Commandments are just as valid today as when God gave them to Moses over 3.000 years ago. Jesus said, "I tell you the truth, until heaven and earth disappear, not the smallest letter, not the least stroke of a pen, will by any means disappear from the law" in Mathew 5:18.

Are some Old Testament laws no longer binding? The answer is yes. The laws contained in ordnances such as yearly Sabbath offerings, meat offerings, drink offerings, etc. such as those in Leviticus 23. The Passover ceremony and circumcision are all ceremonial laws. Just remember this: the Ten Commandments were written by the eternal nature of God. Ceremonial laws were written by Moses.

These are two distinct laws. And the law was nailed to the cross was ceremonial laws. Not the Ten Commandments. If you're struggling as we all do, just say, "Lord, I want to do your will." You know He gave us the Commandments because he wants to save us.

can go a long way in protecting your property and providing peace of mind while away.


